2 Working Group]

3 **Resolution urging the Office of Small Business to convene a Small Business Economic**  
4 **Mitigation Working Group to outline economic mitigation measures in support of San**  
5 **Francisco small business retailers affected by Ordinance No. 122-19 (File No. 190312);**  
6 **and requesting the Office of the Controller to provide an economic impact report for**  
7 **Ordinance No. 122-19 and an updated report for Ordinance No. 140-17 (File No. 170441).**  
8

9 WHEREAS, On July 7, 2017, the City and County of San Francisco approved File No.  
10 170411 prohibiting all San Francisco retail establishments from the sale or distribution of any  
11 flavored tobacco product and flavored cigarettes including menthol cigarettes; and

12 WHEREAS, San Francisco voters affirmed their support of the prohibition on the sale  
13 of flavored tobacco products by adopting Proposition E on June 5, 2018; and

14 WHEREAS, On June 28, 2019, the City and County of San Francisco approved File  
15 No. 190312 restricting the sale, manufacture, and distribution of electronic cigarettes; and

16 WHEREAS, The Office of Economic Analysis issued an economic impact report on  
17 June 13, 2017 relative to File No. 170411 and estimated that could be a \$50 million dollar loss  
18 in sales per year of flavored tobacco products; and

19 WHEREAS, Based on figures provided in the June 13, 2017, Office of Economic  
20 Analysis Economic Impact Report on Banning the Sale of Flavored Tobacco, the Office of  
21 Small Business estimates that there may be a \$70 million loss in sales per year from banning  
22 e-cigarette products; and

23 WHEREAS, On June 24, 2019, the San Francisco Small Business Commission  
24 enacted Resolution No. 002-2019-SBC Economic Mitigation Measures Responsive to City  
25 Bans on the Sales of Certain Tobacco Products; and

1           WHEREAS, Small businesses such as grocery stores, “mom and pop” shops, corner  
2 stores, and stores with 10 or less employees are the most impacted by Ordinance No. 140-17  
3 (File No. 170441), Ordinance No. 122-19 (File No. 190312) and operational fees enacted by  
4 the City and County of San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

5           RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors request that the Office of the City Controller  
6 conduct an Economic Impact Report on Ordinance No. 122-19 (File No. 190312), an updated  
7 report on the impact of Ordinance No. 140-17 (File No. 170441), and an assessment of  
8 operational fees enacted by the City and County of San Francisco; and be it

9           FURTHER RESOLVED, That economic mitigation measures should be developed in  
10 partnership and with representation from merchants, small business owners, community  
11 stakeholders, the Office of Small Business, the Office of Economic and Workforce  
12 Development, the Small Business Development Center, the Controller's Office, the City  
13 Attorney's Office, and the Board of Supervisors; and be it

14           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Office of Small Business convene a Small Business  
15 Economic Mitigation Working Group within 60 days to develop recommendations on  
16 immediate and long-term economic mitigation measures, including the details of a Tobacco  
17 Retail Buy Back Program and relevant tobacco-related fees; and, be it

18           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Small Business Economic Mitigation Working Group  
19 shall include, but not limited to: one representative from the Office of Small Business, one  
20 representative from the Office of Economic and Workforce Development, one representative  
21 from the Small Business Development Center, one representative from the Small Business  
22 Commission, or their designee, one representative from the City Attorney, four small business  
23 representatives including one smoke shop representative, one merchant organization  
24 representative, two small grocer representatives, representatives may also be sought from  
25

1 groups with expertise or experience in addressing or advocating small business concerns;  
2 and, be it

3         FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Economic Mitigation Work Group shall use the  
4 following guiding principles for economic mitigation recommendations: 1) identify alternative  
5 revenue sources for our small merchants and grocers including diversifying inventory such as  
6 having a combination of open food booths like deli's; 2) facilitate fast-tracked permitting  
7 processes to help our small merchants; 3) expand the Healthy Retail SF program to assist the  
8 most vulnerable corner stores; 4) expand the support for small merchants through the Office  
9 of Small Business and Office of Economic and Workforce Development among other ideas;  
10 and be it

11         FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors, request the Work Group to  
12 submit their recommendations 6 months after it is established, following the submission of  
13 recommendations to the Board of Supervisors the Economic Mitigation Work Group will  
14 terminate.

**Economic Mitigation Measures Responsive to City Mandated Tobacco Control Laws**

**Resolution**

WHEREAS, the Small Business Commission, whose mandate was established by the voters in 2003; and

WHEREAS, that mandate specifically authorizes the Small Business Commission to set policies for the City regarding small businesses, consistent with any overall objectives established by the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors through the adoption of legislation, in order to promote the economic health of the small business community in San Francisco, its employees, and its customers; and

WHEREAS, that mandate specifically requires the Small Business Commission to review all legislation affecting small businesses and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, that mandate specifically requires that the Small Business Commission review rules and regulations adopted by City departments that affect small businesses and recommend modifications that would promote the health of small businesses; and

WHEREAS, there are approximately 700 small businesses that are City licensed tobacco retailers; and

WHEREAS, since implementation of the San Francisco Permit Density Cap, the total number of tobacco retail permits has declined by 23%; and



WHEREAS, on September 5, 2017 the City and County of San Francisco enacted BOS File No. 170441 Health Code - Banning the Sale of Flavored Tobacco Products; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Economic Analysis issued an economic impact report on June 13, 2017 relative to File No. 170441 and estimated that there could be a \$50 million dollar loss in the sales of flavored tobacco products;

WHEREAS, the Small Business Commission passed a motion on September 24, 2018 recommending that the Office of Economic and Workforce Development and Department of Public Health develop economic mitigation measures for licensed tobacco retailers who would be affected by the flavored tobacco ban;

WHEREAS, the ban on the sales of flavored tobacco products by City licensed retailers has had a direct adverse effect on the economic health of the City licensed tobacco retailers

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors first passed on June 18, 2019 BOS File Nos. 190312 Health Code - Restricting the Sale, Manufacture, and Distribution of Tobacco Products; and

WHEREAS, based on figures provided in the June 13, 2017 Office of Economic Analysis Economic Impact Report on the Banning the Sale of Flavored Tobacco, the Office of Small Business estimates that there may be a \$70 million loss in sales from banning e-cigarette products; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Small Business Commission requests that, in the spirit of equitable policy administration, the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors administer economic mitigation measures in support of San Francisco small business retailers who are licensed to sell tobacco; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Controller's Office should be directed to conduct an Economic Impact Report on BOS File No. 190312 and an updated report on the impact of BOS File No. 170441; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that economic mitigation measures should be developed in partnership with merchants, the Office of Small Business, the Office of Economic and Workforce Development, the Small Business Development Center, the Controller's Office, the City Attorney's Office, and the Board of Supervisors; and be it

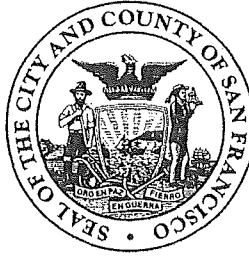


