[Accept and Expend Grants - Recurring State Grant Funds - Department of Public Health - FY2019-2020]

Resolution authorizing the acceptance and expenditure of State grant funds by the San Francisco Department of Public Health for FY2019-2020.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Administrative Code requires City departments to obtain Board of Supervisors' approval in order to accept or expend any grant funds (Section 10.170 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, Department of Public Health has prepared a document entitled "Recurring FY2019-2020 State Grants, Attachment A" that lists the estimated amount of each recurring grant provided by the State of California for FY2019-2020, the State agency that provides the grant, and the indirect costs of each grant, which is on file with Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 190636; and

WHEREAS, As a result of periodic redistribution of appropriations within the State budget, Department of Public Health may, in fact, receive more money or less money from some of the various grants itemized in the attached document that Department of Public Health estimates at this time; and
