Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City and County, at an election to be held on November 5, 2019, a proposal to amend the Charter of the City and County by adding Section 4.133 to Article IV, to read as follows:

## SEC. 4.133. HOMELESSNESS OVERSIGHT COMMISSION.

- (a) There shall be a Homelessness Oversight Commission ("Commission") to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("Department"), or any successor agency. The Department shall, to the extent prescribed by ordinance, manage and direct housing, programs, and services for persons experiencing homelessness in the City, including, but not limited to, street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing, and permanent supportive housing.
  - (b) The Commission shall consist of seven members, appointed as follows:
- (1) Seats 1, 2, and 3, shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors. Each nomination shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed confirmed. Seat 1 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced homelessness. Seat 2 shall be held by a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness. Seat 3 shall be held by a person with expertise in mental health service delivery or substance use treatment.
- (2) Seats 4, 5, and 6 shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Seat 4 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced homelessness. Seat 5 shall be held by a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness. Seat 6 shall be held by a person with significant experience working with homeless families with children and/or homeless youth.
- (3) Seat 7 shall be appointed by the Controller, subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors, and held by a person with experience in financial management and oversight, accounting, or auditing. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a nomination

within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed confirmed.

- (4) Section 4.101 shall apply to these appointments, with a particular emphasis on diversity in ethnicity, race, age, sexual orientation, and types of disabilities.
- (c) Commission members shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing authorities and may be removed by their appointing authorities at any time. Vacancies shall be filled by the respective appointing authorities as prescribed in subsections (b)(1), (2), and (3).
- (d) Commissioners shall serve four-year terms, beginning at noon on May 1, 2020; provided, however, the term of the initial appointees in Seats 1, 4, and 6 shall be a two-year term, expiring at noon on May 1, 2022.
- (e) The Commission shall elect a Chair, Vice-Chair, and officers for other such positions, if any, that it chooses to create. The Chair, or the Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable, shall be responsible for developing the Commission's meeting agendas and conducting Commission meetings.
  - (f) The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- (1) With respect to the Department, the Commission shall exercise all of the powers and duties of boards and commissions as set forth in Sections 4.102, 4.103, and 4.104, including but not limited to, approving applicable departmental budgets, formulating goals consistent with the overall objectives of the City and County, holding hearings and taking testimony, conducting public education and outreach concerning programs and services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning homelessness, and conducting performance audits of the Department to assess the Department's effective and timely delivery of services to persons experiencing homelessness and persons participating in programs overseen by the Department. The Commission's powers and duties prescribed in this subsection (f)(1)

shall not override or be in derogation of the powers of the Board of Supervisors and Mayor as set forth in other provisions of this Charter.

- (2) Notwithstanding the Commission's authority to review and set policies, the Commission shall not have the authority to approve, disapprove, or modify criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services operated or provided by the Department, where such criteria are required as a condition of the receipt of state or federal funding.
- (3) The Commission shall not have the authority to approve or disapprove any contract or grant agreement executed by the Department during a shelter crisis, as declared by the Board of Supervisors consistent with California Government Code Section 8698.2, as may be amended from time to time, where the Department has executed the contract or grant agreement in compliance with an ordinance that authorizes the waiver of otherwise applicable procurement processes.
- (g) The Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, and the Controller shall make their initial appointments to Seats 1-7, respectively, on the Commission by no later than noon, May 1, 2020, and the Commission shall come into existence upon the appointment, and confirmation where required, of four members. The Commission shall have its inaugural meeting within 30 days of its coming into existence.
  - (h) By no later than May 1, 2020, the City shall enact an ordinance that:
- (1) Amends Article XXXI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code, to provide that the Commission shall appoint all members of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board ("LHCB") and that the LHCB's sole duties shall be to serve as the Continuum of Care governing body and to advise the Commission on issues relating to the City's participation in the Continuum of Care program.

<u>Supervisors in compliance with subsection (h), the City Attorney shall cause subsections (h)-(k)</u> of this Section 4.133 to be removed from the Charter.

Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on November 5, 2019, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to create the Homelessness Oversight Commission ("Commission") to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("Department"); to provide that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to approve or disapprove criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and services, where such criteria are required as a condition of funding; to provide that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to approve or disapprove contracts executed by the Department during a declared shelter crisis under the authority of an ordinance that waives procurement requirements; and to require the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance amending the Municipal Code to provide that the Commission shall appoint the members of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board and the Shelter Monitoring Committee, and requiring those bodies to advise the Commission, and to require the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee to advise the Commission and the Health Commission, in lieu of advising the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, on administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund and on monies appropriated from the Fund.

#### **Existing Law**

The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("HSH") was established in 2016. Under the supervision and direction of the department's Director, HSH is charged with managing and directing all housing, programs, and services for homeless persons in the City including, but not limited to, street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing, and permanent supportive housing, as well as certain designated functions set forth in Chapter 20 of the municipal code. The Mayor appoints and may remove the head of HSH. HSH is not subject to direct oversight by a City Commission.

Chapter XXXI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code establishes the Local Homeless Coordinating Board ("LHCB"), which serves as the governing body of the Continuum of Care and advises HSH on homeless policy and budget allocations. With respect to HSH, the LHCB is a purely advisory body, and its advice is not binding on the department. Currently, members of the LHCB are appointed by the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, and the Controller.

Article XII of Chapter 20 of the Administrative Code establishes the Shelter Monitoring Committee. Currently, members of the Committee are appointed by the Board of Supervisors, the LHCB, and the Mayor.

Article XLI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code provides that the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee advises and makes recommendations to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors on administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund and on monies appropriated from the Fund.

## Amendments to Current Law

The proposed Charter amendment would create the Homelessness Oversight Commission. The Commission would have seven members, three appointed by the Mayor, three appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and one appointed by the Controller. The Mayor's nominees and the Controller's nominee would be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors within 60 days of appointment.

One of the Mayor's appointees and one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees would be required to be a person who has personally experienced homelessness. One of the Mayor's appointees and one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees would be required to be a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness. One of the Mayor's appointees would be required to be a person with expertise in mental health service delivery or substance abuse treatment. One of the Board of Supervisors' appointees would be required to be a person with significant experience working with homeless families with children and/or homeless youth. And the Controller's appointee would be required to be a person with experience in financial management and oversight, accounting, or auditing.

The appointing authorities would be required to make their initial appointments by May 1, 2020, and the Commission would come into effect once four members are appointed. Commissioners would serve four-year terms (except for three commissioners serving initial two-year terms).

The Commission would oversee HSH, and would have all of the powers and duties of commissions set forth in the Charter, including but not limited to formulating, evaluating, and approving goals, objectives, plans and programs, and setting policies consistent with the overall objectives of the City, approving applicable departmental budgets, nominating to the Mayor candidates for department head, removing a department head, and conducting investigations into any aspect of governmental operations within its jurisdiction.

The Commission would not have the authority to approve, disapprove, or modify criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services operated or provided by the Department, where such criteria are required as a condition of the receipt of state or federal funding. In addition, the Commission would not have the authority to approve or disapprove any contract executed by the Department during a shelter crisis under the authority of an ordinance that waives otherwise applicable procurement processes.

The Charter Amendment would also require the Board of Supervisors to enact an ordinance by no later than May 1, 2020, that would amend the Municipal Code to provide that:

- The Commission shall appoint all members of the LHCB and the sole duties of the LHCB shall be to serve as the Continuum of Care governing body, and to advise the Commission on the City's participation in that program;
- The Commission shall appoint all members of the Shelter Monitoring Committee, and that body shall advise the Commission in lieu of advising the LHCB; and
- The Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee shall advise and make recommendations to the Commission and the Health Commission, in lieu of advising and making recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor, on administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund.

### Background Information

This Legislative Digest reflects changes introduced in the Rules Committee on July 8, 2019 as the Second Draft of the Charter Amendment.

As compared to the First Draft, the Second Draft:

- Revised the appointment scheme by providing that Seat 7 shall be appointed by the Controller instead of the San Francisco Unified School District;
- Postponed the deadline for appointment of commissioners from March 1, 2020 to May 1, 2020;
- Revised the powers and duties of the Commission to: 1) eliminate the requirement that the Commission review all decisions by the Director of HSH to open or close homeless shelters, navigation centers and all other facilities that provide shelter; 2) eliminate the requirement that the Commission review all contracts entered into by the Department with an annual value exceeding \$200,000; and 3) clarify that the Commission does not have the authority to approve, disapprove, or modify criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs where such criteria are required as a condition of funding; and 4) provide that the Commission lacks authority to review contracts executed by HSH during a shelter crisis under the authority of a local ordinance that expedites procurement processes; and
- Added the requirement that the Board of Supervisors enact an ordinance by May 1, 2020, that would require that the LHCB, Shelter Monitoring Committee, and Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee to advise the Commission, and provide that the Commission shall appoint all members of the LHCB and Shelter Monitoring Committee.

Should the proposed Charter amendment be approved by the voters, in my opinion, it would have a minimal impact on the cost of government.

The proposed Charter amendment would create the Homelessness Oversight Commission to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH). The Commission would consist of seven appointed members, three appointed by the Mayor, three appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and one appointed by the San Francisco Unified School District's Board of Education.

The Commission's duties would include reviewing and approving HSH's budget, program eligibility criteria, shelter openings and closings, and contracts and grants exceeding \$200,000 annually. The Commission may conduct public education and outreach of homelessness programs and issues. Annual salary and operating costs for the Commission would be approximately \$250,000.

I intended this morning to testify against an ordinance on calendar in the Rules Committee to submit a charter amendment establishing a Commission on the Homeless to San Francisco voters this November, but the item had been passed by the time I returned to the hearing room.

I write to record publicly my opposition to such legislation and ask that copies of my letter be distributed to each Board of Supervisors member.

Establishment of a Department on the Homeless already costs taxpayers unproductive money in an amount budgeted for over \$350,000,000 per fiscal year. Adding to unnecessary taxpayer expense is creation of a proposed commission to control the department created by the Mayor with acquiescence of the Board of Supervisors in the annual budget ordinance a few years ago. San Francisco taxpayers are spending hundreds of millions of dollars annually without perceptible results. Supplementing such agony would be a commission partially appointed by Board of Supervisors members. The intent of Board of Supervisors members who support the proposed charter amendment is obvious: Enabling the Board of Supervisors to gain executive power in some degree while also possessing budgetary legislative power.

Elemental observants of San Francisco government understand the innate division of executive and legislative power. I inveigh you to honor it by rejecting the proposed creation of yet another San Francisco commission which will require additional staff, office space, meeting venue, and other corollary costs.
