Charter Amendment (Third Draft) to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to create the Homelessness Oversight Commission ("Commission") to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("Department"); to provide that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to approve or disapprove criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and services, where such criteria are required as a condition of funding; to provide that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to approve or disapprove contracts executed by the Department during a declared shelter crisis under the authority of an ordinance that waives procurement requirements; and to require the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance amending the Municipal Code to provide that the Commission shall appoint the members of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board and the Shelter Monitoring Committee, and requiring those bodies to advise the Commission, and to require the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee to advise the Commission and the Health Commission, in lieu of advising the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, on administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund and on monies appropriated from the Fund; at an election to be held on March 3, 2020.

## AMENDED IN BOARD 7/23/2019 (THIRD DRAFT)

[Charter Amendment - Homelessness Oversight Commission]

Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on March 3. 2020, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to create the Homelessness Oversight Commission ("Commission") to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("Department"); to provide that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to approve or disapprove criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and services, where such criteria are required as a condition of funding; to provide that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to approve or disapprove contracts executed by the Department during a declared shelter crisis under the authority of an ordinance that waives procurement requirements; and to require the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance amending the Municipal Code to provide that the Commission shall appoint the members of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board and the Shelter Monitoring Committee, and requiring those bodies to advise the Commission, and to require the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee to advise the Commission and the Health Commission, in lieu of advising the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, on administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund and on monies appropriated from the Fund.

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City and County, at an election to be held on March 3, 2020, a proposal to amend the Charter of the City and County by adding Section 4.133 to Article IV, to read as follows:

1	SEC. 4.133. HOMELESSNESS OVERSIGHT COMMISSION.
2	(a) There shall be a Homelessness Oversight Commission ("Commission") to
3	oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("Department"), or any
4	successor agency. The Department shall, to the extent prescribed by ordinance, manage and
5	direct housing, programs, and services for persons experiencing homelessness in the City,
6	including, but not limited to, street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing, and
7	permanent supportive housing.
8	(b) The Commission shall consist of seven members, appointed as follows:
9	(1) Seats 1, 2, and 3, shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation
10	by the Board of Supervisors. Each nomination shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote
11	within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a nomination within 60 days of the
12	date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be
13	deemed confirmed. Seat 1 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced
14	homelessness. Seat 2 shall be held by a person with significant experience providing services to
15	or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness. Seat 3 shall be held
16	by a person with expertise in mental health service delivery or substance use treatment.
17	(2) Seats 4, 5, and 6 shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Seat 4
18	shall be held by a person who has personally experienced homelessness. Seat 5 shall be held by
19	a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of
20	persons experiencing homelessness. Seat 6 shall be held by a person with significant experience
21	working with homeless families with children and/or homeless youth.
22	(3) Seat 7 shall be appointed by the Controller, subject to confirmation by the
23	Board of Supervisors, and held by a person with experience in financial management and
24	oversight, accounting, or auditing. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a nomination

within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed confirmed.

3 (4) Section 4.101 shall apply to these appointments, with a particular emphasis on diversity in ethnicity, race, age, sexual orientation, and types of disabilities. 4 5 (c)*Commission members shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing* authorities and may be removed by their appointing authorities at any time. Vacancies shall be 6 7 filled by the respective appointing authorities as prescribed in subsections (b)(1), (2), and (3). 8 (d)*Commissioners shall serve four-year terms, beginning at noon on May 1, 2020;* provided, however, the term of the initial appointees in Seats 1, 4, and 6 shall be a two-year 9 10 term, expiring at noon on May 1, 2022. (e) The Commission shall elect a Chair, Vice-Chair, and officers for other such 11 positions, if any, that it chooses to create. The Chair, or the Vice-Chair if the Chair is 12 unavailable, shall be responsible for developing the Commission's meeting agendas and 13 conducting Commission meetings. 14 15 *The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:* (f) (1)With respect to the Department, the Commission shall exercise all of the 16 17 powers and duties of boards and commissions as set forth in Sections 4.102, 4.103, and 4.104, including but not limited to, approving applicable departmental budgets, formulating goals 18 consistent with the overall objectives of the City and County, holding hearings and taking 19 20 testimony, conducting public education and outreach concerning programs and services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning homelessness, and conducting 21 22 performance audits of the Department to assess the Department's effective and timely delivery of services to persons experiencing homelessness and persons participating in programs overseen 23 by the Department. The Commission's powers and duties prescribed in this subsection (f)(1)24

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shall not override or be in derogation of the powers of the Board of Supervisors and Mayor as set forth in other provisions of this Charter.

(2) Notwithstanding the Commission's authority to review and set policies,
the Commission shall not have the authority to approve, disapprove, or modify criteria used to
ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services operated or provided by the
Department, where such criteria are required as a condition of the receipt of state or federal
funding.
(3) The Commission shall not have the authority to approve or disapprove
any contract or grant agreement executed by the Department during a shelter crisis, as declared
by the Board of Supervisors consistent with California Government Code Section 8698.2, as may
be amended from time to time, where the Department has executed the contract or grant
agreement in compliance with an ordinance that authorizes the waiver of otherwise applicable
procurement processes.
(g) The Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, and the Controller shall make their initial

appointments to Seats 1-7, respectively, on the Commission by no later than noon, May 1, 2020, and the Commission shall come into existence upon the appointment, and confirmation where required, of four members. The Commission shall have its inaugural meeting within 30 days of its coming into existence.

(h) By no later than May 1, 2020, the City shall enact an ordinance that:

(1) Amends Article XXXI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code, to provide that the Commission shall appoint all members of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board ("LHCB") and that the LHCB's sole duties shall be to serve as the Continuum of Care governing body and to advise the Commission on issues relating to the City's participation in the Continuum of Care program.

1	(2) Amends Article XII of Chapter 20 of the Administrative Code, to provide
2	that the Commission shall appoint all members of the Shelter Monitoring Committee, and that
3	the Shelter Monitoring Committee shall advise the Commission in lieu of advising the LHCB.
4	(3) Amends Article XLI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code, to provide
5	that the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee ("Oversight Committee") shall advise and
6	make recommendations to the Commission and the Health Commission, in lieu of advising and
7	making recommendations to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, on administration of the
8	Our City, Our Home Fund ("Fund") and on monies appropriated from the Fund, and to provide
9	that the needs assessment conducted by the Oversight Committee shall inform the Department's
10	strategic planning process.
11	(i) The Board of Supervisors may amend or repeal the provisions of the ordinance
12	enacted in compliance with subsection (h).
13	(j) The references in subsection (h) to the LHCB, Shelter Monitoring Committee, and
14	Oversight Committee do not change their character as bodies created by ordinance.
15	Accordingly, they are not subject to provisions in the Charter or Municipal Code that apply
16	exclusively to bodies enumerated in the Charter or created by the Charter, including but not
17	limited to Charter Sections 4.101.1 and 4.101.5.
18	(k) Within one year of the effective date of the ordinance adopted by the Board of
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Supervisors in compliance with subsection (h), the City Attorney shall cause subsections (h)-(k)

of this Section 4.133 to be removed from the Charter.
