Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Chapter 8 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 8.21-2, to read as follows:

SEC. 8.21-2. LIBRARY FINES AND FEES.

(a) **Fee Schedule**. The Library Commission is hereby authorized to charge *fines and* fees for the use of library materials and services in accordance with the following schedule:

Notwithstanding the overdue fines identified above, the following overdue fines shall apply to the patron groups identified below for all types of materials and equipment:

Seniors (over 65)	\$ 0.05	\$ 5.00

Section 2. Outstanding Patron Overdue Fines. The City shall forgive all outstanding debt accrued by patrons for the overdue fines repealed by this ordinance and any other overdue fines that have been previously repealed.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Eliminating Fines for Overdue Library Materials]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to eliminate fines for overdue library books and other materials and equipment, and forgiving outstanding patron debt for overdue fines.

Existing Law

Existing law authorizes the Public Library to collect fines for overdue books, materials, and equipment.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would amend the Administrative Code to eliminate all overdue fines the Public Library is currently authorized to collect. The proposed ordinance would also forgive all outstanding debt that patrons owe the Public Library for overdue fines.

Background Information

On January 17, 2019, the Library Commission adopted a resolution urging the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance eliminating overdue fines. The Library Commission resolution notes that such fines disproportionally impact low income San Franciscans and impose an unfair barrier of access to the Library for such individuals. On March 21, 2019, the Library Commission adopted a resolution urging the Board of Supervisors to pass an ordinance forgiving outstanding patron debt arising from overdue fines.

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SAN FRANCISCO PUBLIC LIBRARY COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2019-01

RESOLUTION URGING BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO ADOPT ORDINANCE AMENDING ADMINISTRATIVE CODE TO AMEND LIBRARY FINES AND FEES SCHEDULE TO ELIMINATE ALL OVERDUE FINES.

WHEREAS, Section 8.21-2 of the San Francisco Administrative Code sets the fines and fees schedule for the San Francisco Public Library ("Library") system; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors last amended the Library's fines and fees schedule set forth in Section 8.21-2 in 2017; and,

WHEREAS, In the time since the fines and fees schedule was last amended, the Library has recognized that the application of fines for overdue materials imposes an unfair barrier to access, which disproportionately impacts residents of lower socioeconomic status; and,

WHEREAS, To correct this disproportionate impact and ensure access to library services is equitable for all patrons, the proposed changes to the fines and fees schedule contained in Section 8.21-2 would eliminate overdue fines for all Library materials and equipment; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 2.109 of the City Charter, the fines and fees schedule cannot be amended without approval by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Library Commission urges the Board of Supervisors to adopt the ordinance attached hereto modifying Section 8.21-2 of the San Francisco Administrative Code as stated in this resolution.

RESOLUTION URGING BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO ADOPT ORDINANCE FORGIVING ALL LIBRARY FINES OWED TO COMMENCE WITH AMENDED FINES AND FEES SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS, Section 8.21-2 of the San Francisco Administrative Code sets the fines and fees schedule for the San Francisco Public Library ("Library") system; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors last amended the Library's fines and fees schedule set forth in Section 8.21-2 in 2017; and,

WHEREAS, In the time since the fines and fees schedule was last amended, the Library has recognized that the application of fines for overdue materials imposes an unfair barrier to access, which disproportionately impacts residents of lower socioeconomic status; and,

WHEREAS, To correct this disproportionate impact and ensure access to library services is equitable for all patrons, during the Library Commission meeting of January 17, 2019, the Library Commission approved changes to the fines and fees schedule contained in Section 8.21-2, eliminating overdue fines for all Library materials and equipment; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 2.109 of the City Charter, the fines and fees schedule cannot be amended without approval by the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, Contingent upon the Library's fines and fees schedule being amended by the Board of Supervisors to eliminate overdue fines for all Library materials and equipment, the levy of future fines for overdue Library materials and equipment on patrons' accounts will no longer occur; and,

WHEREAS, To date, Library patrons previously have incurred overdue fines for Library materials and equipment borrowed and not returned prior to the due date, and may have outstanding debt resulting from unpaid overdue fines remaining on their accounts, restricting their access to library collections and services; and,

WHEREAS, the Library Commission recognizes that the forgiveness of remaining existing overdue fines will eliminate barriers to the use and enjoyment of the Library, and benefit residents by increasing access to library services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Library Commission urges the Board of Supervisors to pass an ordinance forgiving all outstanding overdue fines owed to the Library and authorizing the San Francisco Public Library to write-off all overdue fines from patron accounts as stated in this resolution.





Dear Supervisors,

There is still time to insist that the Library's inequitable charges to patrons be fully reviewed -

- including all FEES, which have been completely omitted from the fines removal legislation before you today, Item 17, Fi le Number 190631.

When the Library first presented its fine-

free plan to the Library Commission in January of this year it ONLY was for elimination of fines going forward. Thanks in part to our advocacy of ALL fines being removed -- including those on the books -

- the Library administration changed its mind and in March proposed legislation to forgive fines on the books. Success -
- in part.

But we have argued for years -- before the Board of Supervisors, at the Library Commission and elsewhere -

- that the same inequities and racial issues that fines represent also concern the FEES that the Library imposes -
- for example, for lost books.

While we favor removal of all fines from the books, including fine forgiveness, we ask you to insist on at least a review of FEES with an eye toward elimination and/or providing NON-MONEY alternatives, especially for those who would find it a hardship to pay, for example something like Project 20.

We also ask you to REFUSE to FUND privacy-breaking RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) technology, for which the Library has again requested funding this year, and which has steadfastly been opposed by both ACLU-NC and EFF (Electronic Frontier Foundation).

Thank you for your attention to this.
