ORDINANCE NO.

[Mission Bay South - Delegation to Accept Public Infrastructure Improvements]

Ordinance delegating to the Director of Public Works the authority to accept certain required public infrastructure improvements for purposes of City maintenance and liability, including streets, parks, and pump stations, in the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan and waiving Administrative Code, Sections 1.51 et seq., to implement the delegation; authorizing the Director of the Real Estate Division to enter into extended term public use licenses for these improvements and waiving Administrative Code, Chapter 23, for that purpose; and adopting findings pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Definitions and Environmental Findings.

(a) All capitalized terms relating to Mission Bay in this ordinance have the definitions ascribed to them pursuant to the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan and Plan Documents described therein, that the City approved in 1988 in Ordinance No. 335-98, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 981441.

(b) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of

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Supervisors in File No. ______ and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this determination.

Section 2. Mission Bay South Public Works Determination of Completeness for Public Infrastructure Improvements.

(a) In Public Works ("PW") Order No. _____, dated _____, 2019, the PW Director, stated that Public Works (also "PW") issued multiple determinations of completion ("DOCs") for various Public Infrastructure Improvements in Mission Bay South (also referred to as "Improvements"). As specified in the Public Improvement Agreements for the subject Improvements, the PW DOCs found that the required Improvements have been constructed in accordance with the Project Plans and Specifications and all City codes, regulations, standards, and Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan and Plan Documents governing this development; and that such Improvements are ready for their intended use. The Board of Supervisors' acceptance of these Public Infrastructure Improvements for purposes of City maintenance and liability is pending submission of a variety of materials from FOCIL-MB, LLC ("FOCIL"), the Owner and master developer, and City department review of such materials, including as-built plans, maps, and other documents. To expedite such acceptance, the PW Order recommends that the Board of Supervisors delegate the authority to accept the Improvements to the PW Director along with other delegated authority as set forth in this ordinance. The subject Public Infrastructure Improvements for delegated acceptance authority are associated with the following:

- (1) Block 1;
- (2) Blocks 2-7;

(3) Blocks 8-9-9A, including Mission Rock Street and the adjacent portion of Terry Francois Boulevard;

(4) Blocks 11-12; 1 (5) Blocks 26-28 Phases 1, 2, and 3; 2 (6) Blocks 36-39; 3 4 (7) Block 40; (8) Terry Francois Boulevard between Mariposa and 16th Streets; and 5 (9) Stormwater Pump Station No. 1. 6 As to the Public Infrastructure Improvements listed above and in accordance with 7 (b) the Mission Bay South Acquisition Agreement, the PW Director in PW Order No. 8 , identified certain outstanding PW punchlist items and certain San Francisco 9 Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC") Phase II work as described in Exhibit C of the 10 Acquisition Agreement (collectively, "PW Punchlist Work and SFPUC Phase II Work"). This 11 PW Order recommends that despite the PW Punchlist Work and SFPUC Phase II Work, the 12 City should proceed toward acceptance of the Public Infrastructure Improvements for City 13 maintenance and liability purposes subject to the review and approval of all required 14 documents, future City work to address the PW Punchlist Work and SFPUC Phase II Work 15 16 that will occur post-acceptance, and reimbursement for all eligible costs from Acquisition Funds to the extent such Funds are available. The PW Order acknowledges that the 17 reimbursement from Acquisition Funds shall be consistent with the enforceable obligations of 18 the Successor Agency to the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency, commonly known as the 19 Office of Community Infrastructure and Investment ("OCII"), and subject to any necessary 20 authorization from the California Department of Finance. This PW Order is on file with the 21 Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. and is incorporated herein by 22 23 reference.

(c) This PW Order No. _____ also authorizes the termination of posted performance and labor and materials bonds (in general, the "Security") for the following Public

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Infrastructure Improvements: (1) Blocks 2-7; Blocks 8-9-9A; Blocks 11-12; Block 12 midblock; Blocks 26-28 Phases 1, 2, and 3; Blocks 33-34; Blocks 36-39; and Block 40; (2) Stormwater Pump Station Nos. 1 and 5; (3) Parks P2 all phases, P5, P8, P11-11A, P19, P23-24, and P27; (4) Fifth and King Street Intersection Improvements in Mission Bay North, and (5) those Public Infrastructure Improvements where construction has not yet started until such time as the City approves 100% improvement plans for such Public Infrastructure Improvements based on having alternate adequate Security. The PW Director finds that there is alternative Security available through the Mission Bay South Acquisition Funds should such Security be necessary to complete construction of the projects for the Public Infrastructure Improvements shown in this subsection (c) as items (1)-(4). For the Public Infrastructure Improvements referenced in item (5) of this subsection (c), which include future Parks P13 and P15 and the pedestrian bridge over the Mission Bay Channel, the PW Director, in the Director's discretion, will make a determination as to whether new Security shall be posted at the time the permits for such Public Infrastructure Improvements are submitted or whether alternate Security remains available to cover such costs.

(d) The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, on ______, 2019,
adopted Resolution No. ______. Said resolution approved the terms of the PW Order
No. ______ in regard to the SFPUC Phase II Work that involves future Public Utilities
Commission work subject to reimbursement under the conditions specified in the PW Order.
A copy of said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

and is incorporated herein by reference.

(e) In companion legislation, the Board of Supervisors accepted for purposes of City maintenance and liability the following projects for which the PW Director issued a DOC as stated above: (1) Stormwater Pump Station No. 5 and (2) Parks P2 Parking Lot, P11-11A, and P23-24. The companion legislation is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File

Nos. 190754 and 190755, respectively.

Section 3. Recommendation to Delegate to Public Works Acceptance of Existing and Future Public Infrastructure Improvements for City Maintenance and Liability Purposes in Mission Bay South.

(a) Findings.

(1) In PW Order No. _____ dated ____ , 2019, the PW Director recommended that the Board of Supervisors delegate to the Director, in consultation with other affected City departments, the authority to: (A) accept certain required Public Infrastructure Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes that have been or will be constructed in accordance with the Project Plans and Specifications and all City codes, regulations, standards, and Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan and Plan Documents governing this development (i) when the PW Director determines that such Public Infrastructure Improvements are ready for their intended use and (ii) when FOCIL has submitted all required documents for acceptance and the City has reviewed and approved such documents; (B) acknowledge the Conditional Assignment of Warranties and Guaranties on behalf of the Board of Supervisors in accordance with the Mission Bay South Acquisition Agreement subject to certain exceptions specified below; (C) dedicate to public use and as open public right-of-way the Public Infrastructure Improvements that have been constructed and designate such Improvements for street and roadway purposes or park and open space only, depending on the type of Improvement; and (D) take all other official acts necessary for or related to acceptance of the Public Infrastructure Improvements. Such official acts include, but are not limited to, changing or adopting sidewalk and public right-of-way widths, adopting any related official PW maps, and excluding from the acceptance action any permitted or unpermitted encroachments and the maintenance responsibility of fronting property owners

pursuant to the Public Works Code, including, but not limited to, Public Works Code Section
706. The delegation of Public Infrastructure Acceptance and other official City actions related
to it require a waiver to Administrative Code Section 1.51 in regard to following the general
laws of California for establishment or change of street grades and a waiver of Administrative
Code Section 1.52 in regard to the procedural step of the Board of Supervisors accepting
Public Infrastructure Improvements.

(2) The PW Director's recommendation for delegated authority to accept Public Infrastructure Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes and take the other actions specified in the PW Order No. ______ applies to the following:

(A) The Public Infrastructure Improvements identified as items (1)-(9) of Section 2(a) of this ordinance.

(B) The Public Infrastructure Improvements for which PW has issued permits to FOCIL, which has started construction of the Public Infrastructure Improvements for:

(i) Blocks 33-34;

(ii) Block 12 Mid-Block; and

(iii) Park P22.

(C) The Public Infrastructure Improvements for which Public Works has issued permits and FOCIL will commence work on such Public Infrastructure Improvements in fiscal year 2019-2020 for:

(i) Park P3;

(ii) Park P19;

(iii) Park P27; and

(iv) Stormwater Pump Station No. 3.

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(9) of Section 2(a) of this ordinance with the exception of FOCIL's exclusive work on Terry Francois Boulevard between Mariposa and 16th Streets as otherwise required under Section 4.3(c) of the Mission Bay South Acquisition Agreement. In addition, the PW Director recommends that the Board of Supervisors waive the requirement for FOCIL's Conditional Assignment of Warranties and Guaranties for Parks P2 Parking Lot, P11-11A, and P23-24, which is the subject of companion legislation on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 190755. (4) PW Order No. ______ also recognizes that acceptance of Public

(3) The PW Director recommends that the Board of Supervisors waive the

Infrastructure Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes is subject to the Acquisition Agreement dated June 1, 2001 by and between the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency and Catellus Development Corporation and the post-acceptance conditions of subsection (a)(5) of Section 3 of this ordinance. In addition, acceptance requires PW's receipt of: (A) an OCII determination that the acceptance of the Mission Bay South Public Infrastructure Improvements is consistent with the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan (the "Plan") and Plan Documents and (B) a Planning Department letter determining that the acceptance of the Public Infrastructure Improvements is, on balance, in conformance with the General Plan and the eight priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1 and does not trigger the need for subsequent environmental review pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et

(5) Further, the PW Order No. ______ recommends that despite the PW Punchlist Work and SFPUC Phase II Work associated with the Public Infrastructure Improvements, the City should proceed toward acceptance of the Public Infrastructure

Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes subject to the City's review and approval of all required documents, addressing any outstanding provisions of applicable public improvement agreements and street improvement permits, future City work to address the punchlist items and deferred improvements, reimbursement for all eligible costs from Acquisition Funds to the extent such Funds are available, and other conditions.

(6) Public Works Order No. _______ recommends a delegation to the Director of the Real Estate Division ("RED") authority to enter into an extended license for public use of the Public Infrastructure Improvements specified in this ordinance where PW has issued or will issue a DOC but prior to acceptance for City maintenance and liability purposes. This delegation requires a waiver of Administrative Code Chapter 23 to allow the initial terms of such licenses to be for period not to exceed five years, and thereafter followed by annual extensions after the initial term until the time of acceptance.

(b) The general basis for the recommendation in PW Order No. ________ is to allow for expedited processing for City acceptance of completed Public Infrastructure Improvements required under the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan. Copies of the PW issued permits and plans for the Public Infrastructure Improvements identified as items (1)-(9) of Section 2(a) of this ordinance and identified in subsection (a)(2)(B) and (C) of this Section 3 are on file with Public Works Bureau of Street Use and Mapping at 1155 Market Street, 3rd Floor. A copy of PW Order No. ______ is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. ______ and is incorporated by reference herein.

Section 4. Delegation to Public Works the Authority to Accept Public Infrastructure Improvements for City Maintenance and Liability Purposes in Mission Bay South.

(a) The Board of Supervisors adopts the recommendations of the Public WorksDirector in PW Order No. ______. Based on these recommendations, the Board of

Supervisors determines that it would be efficient and in the public interest to eliminate the need for future Board actions related to accepting certain Public Infrastructure Improvements in Mission Bay South by delegating to the PW Director the authority, upon completion of these future Public Infrastructure Improvements and the satisfaction of other conditions, to dedicate the Public Infrastructure Improvements to public use, designate the Public Infrastructure Improvements for street and roadway purposes or park and open space use only depending on the Improvement, change or adopt sidewalk widths, adopt any related official PW maps, and accept the Public Infrastructure Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes, subject to an exception for any permitted or unpermitted encroachments and the maintenance responsibility of fronting property owners pursuant to the Public Works Code, including, but not limited to, Public Works Code Section 706, along with other actions necessary for or related to acceptance of the Public Infrastructure Improvements.

(b) Delegation to the PW Director Certain Authority in Regard to Accepting and
 Designating Required Public Infrastructure Improvements; Delegation to the Director of RED
 to Enter into Licenses for Public Use of Such Improvements.

(1) Notwithstanding Administrative Code Sections 1.51 et seq. and in furtherance of California Streets and Highways Code Section 1806 and the Acquisition Agreement dated June 1, 2001 by and between the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency and Catellus Development Corporation, the Board of Supervisors hereby delegates to the PW Director, in consultation with other affected City departments and subject to the conditions set forth in this ordinance, the authority to: (A) dedicate for public use and as open public right-ofway the Public Infrastructure Improvements identified as items (1)-(9) of Section 2(a) of this ordinance and identified in subsection (a)(2)(B) and (C) of Section 3 of this ordinance; (B) designate such Public Infrastructure Improvements for street and roadway purposes or park and open space use only depending the type of Improvement; (C) change or adopt sidewalk widths; (D) accept such Public Infrastructure Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes, subject to an exception for any permitted or unpermitted encroachments and the maintenance responsibility of fronting property owners pursuant to the Public Works Code, including, but not limited to, Public Works Code Section 706; (E) address the PW Punchlist Work and SFPUC Phase II Work as identified in PW Order No. postacceptance, including the issuance of any permits or authorizations related to this work; (F) obtain FOCIL's Conditional Assignment of all Warranties and Guaranties for those Improvements identified in subsection (a)(2)(B) and (C) of Section 3 of this ordinance and for FOCIL's exclusive work on Terry Francois Boulevard between Mariposa and 16th Streets; (G) adopt any related official PW maps for such Improvements, and (H) accept FOCIL's irrevocable offers for such Public Infrastructure Improvements in substantially similar form to those on file with the Clerk of the Board in File Nos. 190754 and 19075. The Board of Supervisors also delegates the authority to the PW Director to take other actions as specified in PW Order No. that are necessary for or related to acceptance of such Public Infrastructure Improvements, including, but not limited to, the adoption of sidewalk width and public right-of-way width and official maps.

(2) The Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement under Section 4.3(c) of the Mission Bay South Acquisition Agreement for FOCIL's Conditional Assignment of Warranties and Guaranties for items (1)-(9) of Section 2(a) of this ordinance, with the exception of FOCIL's exclusive work on Terry Francois Boulevard between Mariposa and 16th Streets, and for Parks P2 Parking Lot, P11-11A, and P23-24, which is the subject of companion legislation on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File Nos. 190754.

(3) Notwithstanding Administrative Code Sections 1.51 et seq. and California
 Streets and Highways Code Sections 8000 et seq., the Board of Supervisors hereby
 delegates to the PW Director, in consultation with other affected City departments, the

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authority to change or establish new street grades for the streets that are the subject of this
 ordinance.
 (4) The Board authorizes the Director of RED to enter into an extended license
 for public use of the Public Infrastructure Improvements specified in this ordinance where PW
 has issued or will issue a DOC but prior to acceptance for City maintenance and liability

purposes. Notwithstanding Administrative Code Chapter 23, the initial terms of such licenses may be for period not to exceed five years, and thereafter followed by annual extensions after the initial term until the time of acceptance.

(5) The PW Director's action to accept Public Infrastructure Improvements for City maintenance and liability purposes shall be done by PW Order. Within 30 days of issuing a PW Order for this purpose, the PW Director shall forward the PW Order to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to be included in Board File No. ______ for purposes of this ordinance.

Section 5. Official Acts in Furtherance of the Ordinance. The Board of Supervisors authorizes the Directors of PW and RED, in consultation with the City Attorney's Office, to take all actions necessary to implement this ordinance, including, but not limited to finalizing licenses for public use and completing other actions including the filing of the City's Official Maps related to street right-of-way and sidewalk changes.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board ///

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of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Mission Bay South - Delegation to Accept Public Infrastructure Improvements]

Ordinance delegating to the Director of Public Works the authority to accept certain required public infrastructure improvements for purposes of City maintenance and liability, including streets, parks, and pump stations, in the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan and waiving Administrative Code, Sections 1.51 et seq., to implement the delegation; authorizing the Director of the Real Estate Division to enter into extended term public use licenses for these improvements and waiving Administrative Code, Chapter 23, for that purpose; and adopting findings pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

California Streets and Highways Code and Administrative Code Sections 1.51 et seq., establish the process for San Francisco to dedicate and accept public improvements, including public streets and other types of public right-of-ways, such as parks and open space. Requirements related to the scope, construction, approval, and public dedication and acceptance of public improvements in Mission Bay South also are governed by the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan and Plan documents such as the Mission Bay South Infrastructure Plan, Acquisition Agreement, and Interagency Cooperation Agreement.

Amendments to Current Law

This legislation would delegate to the Director of Public Works the authority to accept for City maintenance and liability purposes certain required public improvements in the Mission Bay South Redevelopment Plan that have been constructed or currently are under construction. The Ordinance would allow the Director to accept specified public improvements subject to the City performing subsequent work on those improvements and being reimbursed through Mission Bay South Acquisition Funds. The legislation also would authorize the Director of Property to accept extended licenses between FOCIL and the City to allow public access or use prior to acceptance of the public improvements. The legislation provides for the waiver of the assignment of specified warranties and guaranties. The Ordinance would adopt environmental findings.

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
