Resolution retroactively authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to enter into an agreement with the United States Environmental Protection Agency for the receipt of \$1,200,000 for the 900 Innes Remediation Project, for a term of January 1, 2018, through September 30, 2020, pursuant to Charter, Section 9.118(a).

[Grant Agreement - Retroactive - Environmental Protection Agency - 900 Innes Remediation

WHEREAS, In 2014 the Recreation and Park Department (RPD) acquired 900 Innes Avenue at India Basin in San Francisco's Bay View Hunters Point neighborhood, located adjacent to the India Basin Shoreline Park; and

WHEREAS, 900 Innes is believed to be environmentally contaminated and will require remediation so that it can be integrated into the India Basin Park Project; and

WHEREAS, The India Basin Park Project will combine 900 Innes with the India Basin Shoreline Park area to create a 10-acre waterfront park development that closes a critical gap in the San Francisco Bay Trail, and specifically with respect to 900 Innes, will transform that property from a post-industrial brownfield to promote public access, social equity, waterfront recreation, resiliency to sea level rise, and habitat and wetland restoration and enhancement; and

WHEREAS, On May 10, 2017, RPD submitted a grant application to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) for San Francisco Bay Water Quality Improvement Fund to support remediation activities at 900 Innes; and

WHEREAS, On June 28, 2017, the 900 Innes Remediation Project was one of four projects selected for funding and awarded \$1,200,000 for site remediation (the Grant); and

WHEREAS, On September 21, 2017, the Recreation and Park Commission adopted Resolution No. 1709-004, recommending that the Board of Supervisors authorize RPD to secure all necessary approvals and reviews as needed; and

WHEREAS, RPD agreed to the terms of the Grant Agreement which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors under File No. 190847 and which is hereby declared to be part of this Resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, The Grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; and WHEREAS, The Grant will not require an amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance; now, therefore, be it0

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the Grant Agreement; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the RPD General Manager to enter into any modifications and amendments to the Grant Agreement, including to any of its exhibits, and authorizes the RPD General Manager to execute further agreements related to the Project, that the RPD General Manager determines, in consultation with the City Attorney, are in the best interests of the City and do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities of the City, are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of the Project or this Resolution, and are in compliance with all applicable laws, including the City's Charter; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of. indirect costs as part of this Grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the RPD General Manager, and his or her designee, to conduct all negotiations, and execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests and so on, that may be necessary for the completion of the Project.

Following EPA Policy Directive Number FEM-2012-02, recipient agrees to demonstrate competency of any laboratory carrying out any activities involving the generation of environmental data on its behalf. Laboratory competency shall be maintained for the duration of the project period of this agreement and documented during the annual reporting process. e.1 Cybersecurity

- (a) The recipient agrees that when collecting and managing environmental data under this assistance agreement, it will protect the data by following all State or Tribal law cybersecurity requirements as applicable.
- (b)(1) EPA must ensure that any connections between the recipient's network or information system and EPA networks used by the recipient to transfer data under this agreement, are secure. For purposes of this Section, a connection is defined as a dedicated persistent interface between an Agency IT system and an external IT system for the purpose of transferring information. Transitory, user-controlled connections such as website browsing are excluded from this definition.

If the recipient's connections as defined above do not go through the Environmental Information Exchange Network or EPA's Central Data Exchange, the recipient agrees to contact the EPA Project Officer (PO) no later than 90 days after the date of this award and work with the designated Regional/Headquarters Information Security Officer to ensure that the connections meet EPA security requirements, including entering into Interconnection Service Agreements as appropriate. This condition does not apply to manual entry of data by the recipient into systems operated and used by EPA's regulatory programs for the submission of reporting and/or compliance data.

(b)(2) The recipient agrees that any subawards it makes under this agreement will require the subrecipient to comply with the requirements in (b)(1) if the subrecipient's network or information system is connected to EPA networks to transfer data to the Agency using systems other than the Environmental Information Exchange Network or EPA's Central Data Exchange. The recipient will be in compliance with this condition: by including this requirement in subaward agreements; and during subrecipient monitoring deemed necessary by the recipient under 2 CFR 200.331(d), by inquiring whether the subrecipient has contacted the EPA Project Officer. Nothing in this condition requires the recipient to contact the EPA Project Officer on behalf of a

subrecipient or to be involved in the negotiation of an Interconnection Service Agreement between the subrecipient and EPA.
