Resolution supporting the demands and actions of the Close the Camps - Free Our Children coalition, which aims to draw attention to the systemic mistreatment of immigrants at the United States border and is working towards closing the inhumane immigrant detention camps and freeing innocent children and families.

[Supporting the Demands and Actions of the Close the Camps - Free Our Children Coalition]

WHEREAS, Close the Camps - Free Our Children is a Bay Area-based grassroots coalition made up of people of color, LGBTQ people, faith-based groups, artists, citizens and non-citizens, attorneys, labor, activists, students, parents, allied organizations, and concerned community members who came together in 2019 due to their collective outrage at the horrific mistreatment of immigrants at the United States borders, particularly children; and

WHEREAS, The coalition is wholly committed to closing the inhumane and undignified immigrant detention centers sanctioned by the United States government and securing the freedom of innocent children and families being imprisoned in these facilities; and

WHEREAS, Over the last several months, the coalition has been building a strong advocacy platform to condemn the criminalization of migrants and refugees who are seeking a better life and take action at the local, state, and federal levels in order to enact real and necessary reforms to our country's immigration policies; and

WHEREAS, The recent mass killing of 22 people in El Paso, Texas, the majority of whom were of Latinx descent, points to the direct connection between anti-immigrant sentiments and white-supremacist domestic terrorism; and

WHEREAS, The President of the United States continues to use inflammatory rhetoric to incite domestic terrorism against what his administration has labeled the "invasion" of

immigrants, and this divisive hate speech has been widely attributed with instigating the killings of innocent U.S. citizens and Mexican nationals; and

WHEREAS, The Trump administration has separated more than 2,300 children from their parents at the U.S.-Mexico border; and,

WHEREAS, The Trump administration continues to place hundreds of migrants in concentration camps with deplorable conditions that have been condemned by the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights and other human rights organizations; and,

WHEREAS, 2019 marks the 30th anniversary of San Francisco's Sanctuary City Ordinance, and the City and County of San Francisco remains committed to upholding and defending the civil and human rights of all immigrant families and individuals; and

WHEREAS, On September 16, 2019, Mexican Independence Day, the coalition is organizing a large protest, rally, and march to San Francisco City Hall to oppose the inhumane conditions and immoral policies that harm individuals, target immigrants, and damage the fabric of our democracy in order to bring greater awareness to these issues and demand action from San Francisco's elected officials; and

WHEREAS, The coalition has developed a comprehensive set of demands which include the following: closing the camps and eliminating contracts with private prison operators such as CoreCivic and Geo Group, which receive millions in profit for detaining immigrants; immediately releasing innocent children from detention centers and reunifying them with their parents or relatives while they wait to receive asylum or immigration relief; eliminating Section 1325 from the U.S. Code, which makes it a criminal violation to enter the United States without inspection and is the legal basis for separating children; developing an immediate pathway to full citizenship for the millions of non-citizens living and contributing to this country and ending the multi-year ban that requires undocumented people who might qualify for legal status to leave the country in order to apply for naturalization; defending and

expanding Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, Temporary Protected Status, and Deferred Enforcement Departure, and opposing the current Muslim Ban; and boycotting companies that profit from providing goods and services such as vehicles, food, furniture, housekeeping, computers, and data collection software to Customs and Border Protection, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and other federal immigration enforcement agencies; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco expresses its unequivocal support of the aforementioned demands and actions by the Close the Camps - Free Our Children coalition and reaffirms its solidarity with Central Americans, Mexicans, Latinxs, and all refugees and immigrants; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall notify San Francisco's State and Federal legislative representatives and the Office of the Governor of the State of California of the Board's position of support accordingly.
