1	[Urging the Department of Public Health to Rescind Their Relocation Notice for Adult Residential Facility Residents]

3	Resolution urging the Department of Public Health to rescind their 60-day notice for
4	adult residential facility residents to relocate; and supporting adult residential facility
5	residents and workers.
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7	WHEREAS, Adult residential facilities ("ARFs") are group care facilities that provide 24
8	hour nonmedical care to individuals aged 18-59 who need personal services, supervision, or
9	assistance to support their activities of daily living; and
10	WHEREAS, ARFs are licensed by the Community Care Licensing Division of the State
11	Department of Social Services ("CCL"); and
12	WHEREAS, ARFs play an important role in a locality's continuum of care by providing
13	people with mental illness an opportunity to live in community-based housing, rather than in
14	institutional care; and
15	WHEREAS. Since 2005, the San Francisco Department of Public Health ("DPH") has
16	operated an ARF at 887 Potrero Avenue; and
17	WHEREAS, This ARF has been licensed by CCL to offer 55 beds; and
18	WHEREAS, This ARF is staffed by a dedicated team of registered nurses, mental
19	health specialists, certified nursing assistants, social workers, and others, who work under
20	difficult conditions to provide people with mental illnesses a healthy and stable environment;
21	and
22	WHEREAS, ARF staff work hard to care for residents with mental illness by providing,
23	meals, housekeeping, supervision, storage and distribution of medications, and personal care
24	assistance with basic activities like hygiene, dressing, eating, and bathing; and

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2	WHEREAS, In recent years, DPH management has failed to maintain staffing at levels
3	that were sufficient to provide all residents with safe, high quality care or operate the ARF at
4	full capacity; and
5	WHERAS, In 2018-2019, DPH asked CCL for permission to temporarily suspend from
6	licensure a total of 41 ARF beds so that they could be used instead as emergency shelter
7	beds for people experiencing homelessness; and
8	WHEREAS, CCL granted DPH's request, thereby temporarily reducing the total
9	number of beds at DPH's ARF from 55 to 14; and
10	WHEREAS, Department of Public Health stopped admitting new residents to the
11	facility since September 2018, even as people were waiting in locked psychiatric wards to
12	get into those beds; and
13	WHEREAS, Department of Public Health had quietly decided to place 41 long-term
14	beds on indefinite "suspension", essentially removing them until further notice without
15	consulting any resident, family members of residents, workers, unions, and other front line
16	workers prior to making this decision; and
17	WHEREAS, On August 19, 2019, residents of the ARF, some of whom had been
18	residing at the ARF for over a decade, received a Relocation Notice requiring them to
19	terminate residence at the ARF within 60 days; and
20	WHEREAS, Residents of the ARF who received the notice were terrified about where
21	they would be placed and surprised by the lack of process and transparency behind
22	management's decision; and

WHEREAS, Residents began showing signs of anxiety and decompensation upon

receiving the notice to relocate; and

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WHEREAS, Workers at the ARF and union representatives of SEIU Local 1021 and
IFPTE Local 21 were similarly in shock and outraged by the illogical and abrupt decision of
the Department of Public Health; and
WHEREAS, Workers and union representatives held a worker led rally on August 22,
2019, in front of San Francisco General Hospital with the support of over 100 workers and
health professionals denouncing the Department of Public Health's decision to close the ARF;
and
WHEREAS, Unions representing affected workers have repeatedly reached out to the
Department of Public Health management urging them to reconsider their decision and asking
them to fulfill the meet and confer obligations as mandated by state law and the MOUs for the
sake and stability of the residents; and
WHEREAS, Cease and desist letters and phone calls made by the workers at the ARF
to not close the beds and evict the residents have been left unanswered by the Department of
Public Health; and
WHEREAS, Given that the Board of Supervisors has introduced two pieces of
legislation overriding the DPH's decision to close the ARF that are currently pending; and
WHEREAS, Multiple requests by workers and union representatives to meet and
confer with management over the proposed changes have been ignored by the Department of
Public Health; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Health to
rescind the 60 Day Relocation Request notice dated August 19, 2019, and communicate with
the CCL; and, be it
FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public
Health and the Department of Human Resources meet and confer with all unions representing

affected employees and publicly consult with the impacted community, including residents of

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1	the ARF to ensure that residents at the Adult Residential Facility are not relocated and that
2	the facility remains open.
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
