## RESOLUTION NO.

[Urging the United States Census Bureau to Provide Non-English Paper Questionnaires for Language Groups of 100,000 or More]

Resolution urging the United States Census Bureau to provide non-English paper questionnaires for language groups of 100,000 or more in the United States during the 2020 Census, including Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese and Russian.

WHEREAS, The decennial Census is one of the cornerstones of America's democracy, and a full and complete count is crucial to ensuring accurate political representation and an equitable distribution of federal and other resources; and

WHEREAS, Inadequate language support services will lead to decreased response rates and incomplete and inaccurate responses in Hard-to-Count (HTC) and Limited English Proficient (LEP) populations; and

WHEREAS, Although the United States (U.S.) Census Bureau plans for the 2020 Census to include the online questionnaire and telephonic support in twelve non-English languages, the agency has also decided to eliminate printed questionnaires in a number of languages, including Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese and Russian, disproportionately impacting low-income, LEP communities with limited internet connectivity; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Census Bureau chose to eliminate printed non-English questionnaires despite the agency having already tested such questionnaires, and despite the agency having testified at the House Oversight Committee that there remains \$1.2 billion in unspent funds allocated towards Questionnaire Assistance Centers; and

WHEREAS, It is notable that this elimination of non-English paper questionnaires is a departure from past practice, as the U.S. Census Bureau in 2010 provided paper copies of the Census in English and by request in Spanish, Korean, Chinese, Vietnamese and Russian; and

WHEREAS, The elimination of non-English printed questionnaires will result in a disproportionate and adverse impact in California, where 27% of the population is born outside the United States; and

WHEREAS, The Bay Area, where residents speak over 160 different languages, will acutely experience this adverse impact, resulting in a likely undercount of LEP and HTC populations and the loss of Congressional representation, billions of dollars in federal funding, and access to services and civil rights protections, as well as the distortion of electoral districts and undermining of our democracy; and

WHEREAS, In San Francisco, 44% of our 850,000 residents speak a language other than English at home, 35% are immigrants, and 26% of residents speak an Asian language at home; and

WHEREAS, The Office of Civic Engagement and Immigrant Affairs is coordinating San Francisco's 2020 Census outreach activities, and coordinating with a multitude of stakeholders to ensure residents are well informed about and actively engaged in the Census, with a particular focus on the city's HTC and vulnerable populations; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the U.S. Census Bureau to reinstate the use of paper questionnaires for the 2020 Census in non-English languages for Language Groups of 100,000 or more in the United States; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges California's state and federal legislative leaders to take action and compel the U.S. Census Bureau to reverse its course; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges California's Congressional leaders to author and support a Congressional resolution urging the Census Bureau to make available non-English paper questionnaires for language groups that meet the threshold of 100,000 or more households in the United States.
