24 25 Apply for Grant - California Department of Health Care Services -Housing Funds for Whole Person Care Pilot Program - Not to Exceed \$8,130,059]

Resolution approving the Department of Public Health to apply for the onetime Housing Funds for Whole Person Care pilot program from the California Department of Health Care Services in an amount not to exceed \$8,130,059 from January 1, 2020, through June 30, 2025; and designating the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing as the single point of contact for the Housing Funds for Whole Person Care pilot allocation.

WHEREAS, California's Governor Gavin C. Newsom and the California Legislature have recognized the critical role Whole Person Care Pilot programs play in reducing homelessness for those with special needs; and

WHEREAS, The Governor, Legislature, and the City and County of San Francisco recognize the need for flexible state-only funding for new services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries who are living with mental illness who are also homeless or at risk of homelessness; as well as additional at-risk populations; and

WHEREAS, The Governor and Legislature have allocated \$100 million dollars in onetime State General Fund housing funds for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 to Whole Person Care (WPC) Pilot programs; and

WHEREAS. This funding is available for the costs of long-term and short-term housing, such as hotel vouchers and rental subsidies, as well as capital investment for housing projects for Medi-Cal beneficiaries who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness, or are at risk of homelessness; and

WHEREAS, On July 22, 2019, the State of California, Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) issued participation and funding guidance for the One Time Housing Funds

for WPC pilot programs on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 190930, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, and

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health (DPH) serves as the WPC Pilot Program Lead Entity for the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) provides coordination of housing and supportive services for individuals who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, DHCS requires that DPH, as the Lead Entity, apply for the one-time funds, and DPH shall designate the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to serve as the primary contact for the allocation; and

WHEREAS, These funds would provide housing subsidizes and lease payments including short-term stabilization placements or for newly leased or Permanent Supportive Housing in the pipeline for 55-65 individuals a month through the end of the grant period; and

WHEREAS, A portion of the funds received would be allocated to cover indirect costs associated with funding distribution and to fund a project-based position that would administer awarded funds; and

WHEREAS, This funding allocation does not require local matching funding; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The DPH is hereby authorized to submit a Letter of Interest to DHCS to apply for an amount not to exceed \$8,130,059 of the \$100 million State General Funds allocated towards One Time Housing Funds for Whole Person Care pilot programs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Department of Public Health designates the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing as the single point of contact to the Department of Health Care Services for the Housing Funds for Whole Person Care Pilot programs allocation; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health as the Lead Entity for the City and County's Whole Person Care pilot program, and the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing as the Designee, will return to the Board of Supervisors to seek approval to accept and expend funds awarded through the one-time Housing Funds for Whole Personal Care Pilots in an amount not to exceed \$8,130,059.

#### To Whom It May Concern:

The City and County of San Francisco through a partnership between the Departments of Public Health (DPH) and Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) wishes to express its intent to participate in the Governor's One Time Housing Funds for Whole Person Care (WPC) pilot programs.

San Francisco is well-positioned to implement the one-time housing funds. Infrastructure exists for understanding the community's needs and for monitoring and deploying limited housing resources.

The target population of the SF county WPC pilot project is all adults experiencing homelessness who are also SF Medi-Cal beneficiaries (~10,000 annually). Many (~1000) have been homeless for several years and present with multiple diagnoses of medical, psychiatric, and substance use conditions. Their health needs are complex, and they have the potential to become high utilizers of multiple service delivery systems (HUMS).

SF follows "Housing First" principles as defined by the California Welcome and Institutions Code Sections 8255-8256. This recognizes the importance of stabilizing in permanent housing with ancillary support services along with connection to healthcare. Coordinated Entry assessment interviews result in a priority pool which has been identified as a shared priority between HSH and DPH. SF has been able to place approximately 1,000 priority status individuals into housing each year using the coordinated entry process. However, SF does not have sufficient housing units available to meet the needs of priority clients, and is far from meeting the housing needs of all homeless persons.

At an estimated \$2000/month per person, these funds would provide housing subsidies or lease payments, stabilization housing placements, or new leased or permanent supportive housing in the pipeline for units that do not have a current subsidy attached, therefore, no existing funding will be supplanted. An estimated total served is 55-65 individuals a month through the end of the grant period.

Housing Subsidies and Lease Payments will total \$6,959,177 over five years. Staffing costs for 1.0 FTE Program Support Analyst will total \$739,246 over four years. Indirect costs will be 5% of the grant budget and will total \$431,636 over five years. HSH will follow the San Francisco Board of Supervisors approved Procurement process to identify qualified sub-recipient provider(s) on or before the receipt of funds.

As the lead entity for SF WPC, DPH designates partner agency HSH as the point of contact to the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) for the One Time Housing Funds allocation.

#### ONE-TIME HOUSING FUNDS FOR WHOLE PERSON CARE PILOTS

July 22, 2019

#### Overview

The 2019-20 Governor's Budget invests \$100 million State General Fund (one-time with multi-year spending authority through June 30, 2025) for active Whole Person Care (WPC) Pilot programs that provide housing services. The WPC Pilot program coordinates health, behavioral health and social services in a patient-centered manner with the goal of improved beneficiary health and well-being. Many of these pilot programs target individuals who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness or who are at risk of homelessness, and have a demonstrated medical need for housing and/or supportive services.

This funding is available for the costs of long-term and short-term housing, such as hotel vouchers and rental subsidies, as well as capital investment for housing projects for Medi-Cal beneficiaries who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness, or are at risk of homelessness. This funding may be used to match local county investments and shall not supplant existing funding for these services. This funding allocation does not require local matching funding.

Pilots have the flexibility in determining the scope of their projects as well as the number of mentally ill homeless or at risk of homelessness mentally ill individuals that will be served with this funding. Through an application process, Pilots must also demonstrate how this funding will complement existing housing services provided by the pilot and will not supplant existing funding, as well as the pilot's ability to serve the mentally ill homeless or those at risk of homelessness within their jurisdiction. Funding is not available for housing case management services, such as housing navigation services and tenancy sustaining services, or additional housing transition services, such as security deposit, first month coverage of utilities, etc. Further, services provided with this funding must comply with all applicable "Housing First" principles as defined in California Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 8255-8256.

The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) developed the below funding allocation methodology that considers prevalence of individuals who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness using the Point in Time Count (PIT); geographical cost of living using Fair Market Rent (FMR); and WPC pilot performance.

#### Letter of Interest

Each WPC Pilot must delegate the single organization that will serve as the primary contact. This entity must submit a *Letter of Interest* that will serve as your application, to DHCS indicating that the Pilot intends to use the funds for the purpose outlined in the Overview. An assurance that services provided with this funding will comply with all applicable "Housing First" principles as defined in California Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 8255-8256 must be included in the *Letter of Interest*. A signed Board of Supervisors resolution will serve as the final agreement as outlined in Step 4 below.

#### **Operational Guidelines**

The Request for Information review process and timing is as follows:

#### Methodology

Governor's Proposal: Provide \$100 million to WPC Pilot Counties to support housing and housing supportive services for Medi-Cal enrollees who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness, or who are at risk of homelessness. As specified in the Governor's Budget Proposal, the allocation methodology takes into account prevalence of homelessness, cost of living, and pilot performance.

1. Prevalence of homelessness: 50 percent of the funding is allocated in proportion to the total number of people experiencing homelessness in the county as compared to the total for all WPC counties. The county's number of homeless people is from the federal Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Point in Time (PIT) count numbers from 2017. The HUD web link is below. The query is by "Continuum of Care" (COC). Each pilot county generally has its own COC that is responsible for completion of the PIT count, though some exceptions are noted below.

According to local methods in the various Application for One-Time Funding Page 3

areas, certain pilot counties' PIT counts are combined with one or more surrounding counties. In these cases, DHCS estimated the Pilot county's PIT count by comparing its overall population to the other county(ies) in its COC.

All pilots have a county-specific PIT count except for the following:

- Sacramento County has a count but not the city.
- Kings County (pilot) is combined with Tulare County (not pilot).
- Long Beach and Pasadena have their own PIT counts, in addition to the Los Angeles County count.
- Monterey County (pilot) is combined with San Benito (pilot).
- Placer County (pilot) is combined with Nevada County (not pilot).
- Mariposa County (pilot) is combined with a few other non-pilot small counties.
- Shasta County (pilot) is combined with a few other non-pilot small counties.

In this category, DHCS set a minimum allocation at \$500,000 for each county. Some counties would have been below the \$500,000 minimum. For counties that were over the \$500,000 minimum, DHCS reduced their allocations, in a proporational manner, to raise the other counties up to the \$500,000 minimum.

- Cost of living: 25 percent of the funding is allocated in proportion to the cost of living in the pilot county. DHCS used the federal HUD Fair Market Rent (FMR) Efficiency (i.e. studio apartment) amounts for each pilot area to assess cost of living, or more specifically the average cost of basic housing in the pilot county. The amounts reflect the average monthly rental cost of a studio apartment in each county. DHCS used the 2019 FMR. - 3. Prevalence of individuals who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness: 25 percent of the funding is allocated in proportion to the total number of individuals who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness in the county as compared to the total for all WPC counties. The county's number of individuals who are mentally ill and are experiencing homeless is from the HUD PIT Severely Mentally Ill subpopulation count numbers from 2017.
- 4. <u>Performance</u>: DHCS will not accept applications from pilots that have unacceptable performance regarding their pilot housing supportive services for the homeless target population. DHCS is currently developing specific criteria.

Attached please find an original single-sided and two single-sided, black and white copies of the proposed resolution for the Board of Supervisors approval, which authorizes the Department of Public Health (DPH) to participate in the one-time Housing Funds for Whole Person Care Pilots funding opportunity through the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), in the amount of \$8,130,059, with multi-year spending authority through June 30, 2025.

The FY2019-20 Governor's Budget invests \$100 million State General Fund for active Whole Person Care (WPC) Pilot programs that provide housing services. In order to receive these funds, DPH must provide DHCS with a Board of Supervisors resolution supporting the use of the funds for the purposes outlined in the provisions of the funding guidance. The signed resolution will also serve as the final agreement to formally accept the funds.
