I am a second generation San Franciscan and my grandmother who first immigrated here from China with my grandfather opened a deli in mid Market that served the community for over 30 years and my father did so as well. I grew up in the city and now have a family of my own here, I invested in the future of keeping San Francisco because it is and always be my home. I currently own two businesses with my best friend whose roots also go back 3 generations in the city. I was fortunate enough to have a guidance counselor in high school that got me on the right track and into college through tennis and spend a lot of my free time helping my friend Mike Hall teaching kids tennis at the Ella Hill Hutch Community Center because I believe it gave me a focus and changed my life for the better and it can give the younger generation the same opportunities. Many of our employees are SF natives and I feel that I would be a valuable member of the Cannabis Oversight Committee because I truly believe in the health benefits of cannabis, but also in our city and I would love to be a part of something that contributes to its growth.

The last six years I have co-owed a small beer and wine bar in Hayes Valley that focused on small, local wine producers and we were fortunate enough to open a second location in my grandmothers former deli, M&L Market on 14th and Market. Our goal is beyond just having a successful business there is a strong focus on building community with the winemakers here in California and with our neighbors/patrons. We are proud to be able to walk through the streets of the neighborhoods we are involved in and know the faces and names of those that live there. Prior to opening the wine bar I was a partner in a cannabis cultivation project here in the city and have had my share working in the cannabis industry. Currently I am getting ready to open our cannabis manufacturing, distribution and delivery project in the Dogpatch.

I am an LGBT business owner in San Francsico. I own and operate a cannabis manufactruing company with my partner, and we have both been residents of San Francisco for more than 10 years. I've lived in Noe Valley, and the Tenderloin over my 10 year period, and have worked for local businesses in retail, tech, hardware, apparel, and manufacturing now cannabis edibes.

I have been woring to build San Francisco start-up businesses since I first moved here in 2006. I've worked at small mission based businesses like Wildlife Works, innovative tech companies like Jawbone, and local manufacturing businesses like Rickshaw Bagworks which also founded SF Made and set the stage for me to open my own cannabi manufacturing business here in SF. SF Made helped me meet the SF business community where I was able to see first hand some of the pros and cons of manufacturing in an expensive but well known city like San Francisco. Through this process I've become very involved in state and local policy, legislation and the intended and unintended impact those policies can have on small businesses and believe I bring a well rounded understanding of small business to the table.

Our company has hosted several working sessions on ordinaces and policy for our community and we've dived right in to understnading the San Francisco cannabis landscape. am an approved equity applicant with a well established track record in all aspect of the cannabis supply chain of San Francisco. I attended USF from 1997-2001 and though I moved ere from Germany for University, I never left

I am a long-time resident of the Sunset District. Raised in Germany to immigrant parents from Iran, our family moved to the Bay Area in 1996 where my grandparents had been living since 1981. We have strong roots in the Bay Area

My wife suffers from severe epilepsy and is the recipient of a Neuropace brain implant from the epilepsy team of UCSF. This is my primary motivation to ensure medicine for all patients not just my wife who has direct access to the source of cannabinoids. I frequently have exchanges with UCSF Neurology in regards to cannabis and its benefits for epilepsy. UCSF and myself are looking to start a city wide epilepsy awareness event amongst other things.

My personal interest further lies in rewarding those who helped build this industry in our City by supporting the Equity Program, equal pay amongst all genders, and creating a reatistic path to revenue for our local businesses

As a cutitivator and the founder of Sunset Connect (cannabis flowers) and Spirulinex (water based edibles and sublingual flakes) I have seen many mom & pop producers incapable of ransitioning due to the difficult navigation and cost-intensive process. I believe I am a good represantative of cottage industry growers and manufacturers in Sa A voice of the industry that is not necessarily well represented on the current task force.

I am the founder of Sunset Connect (cannabis flowers), Green Spirit Essentials (extractions) and Co-founder of Spirulinex (water-based patent pending edibles and sublinguals). These are all San Francisco-centric cannabis brands that were built by myself, a team of cottage-industry growers, and a brilliant scientist Dr. Sarah Rodriguez. We have 6 pending patents for the solubilization of cannabinoids.

Sunset Connect is currently building out a 25.000sqft cultivation site in Oakland and we are very familiar with both counties' cannabis ordinances and processes. We frequently consult with other members of the industry and attorneys to shed light upon an industry with many shadows. I am not a green rusher and I believe too many outsiders have skewed the reality of the actual struggles facing our industry.

I have a deep background in advertising and marketing including alcohol and pharmaceutical brands. The ventures I am a part of have gone through the pre-existing operator permit process as well as the equity incubation application with the city of SF. Ten years of experience enable me to bring a unique insight to the committee, one I think is much needed. I am an existing vendor to many of our City's dispensaries and am therefore able to create bridges between retail and supply with an understanding of regulated markets.

I believe I can be of aid in determining the costs associated with permitting cannabis businesses on the operator side that includes number of employees it requires to operate manufacturing and cultivation operations. I have extensive experience in dealing with testing labs through my partner Prof. Rodriguez we have recently escalated faulty weighing methods to the BCC.

648's priority is to participate in the oversight process to ensure that these jobs are sustainable with businesses that maintain high worker and community standards.

I am currently in negotiations with cannabis dispensaries in San Francisco and I have held several successful Card Check meetings with workers in San Francisco. It is important that our workforce includes and reflects San Francisco's diverse communities.

As a Union member I was very vocal and active in issues that affected workers in San Francisco since 2003. I am now paid to be a worker activist and I have worked as a Union Representative at UFCW Local 648 for 5 years. I have training in organizing, worker safety and arbitration. I have been the Labor Seat on the San Francisco State Legalization Task Force for 3 years, 2 of those years as a Co-chair of the Task Force. In 2016 I was appointed to the Vallejo Medical Marijuana Stake-holder & Expert Panel. That appointment and Panel lasted approximately 7 months.

As an employer of over 150 employees, half of which are employed in San Francisco, I am well-versed in what it means to provide opportunity to all. In addition to my understanding on California labor law, I am knowledgeable as to what it means to be a San Francisco employer, and specifically a San Francisco cannabis business employer. Add all those rules together, and you have one of the most difficult to assemble work force. San Francisco goes beyond what California requires to employ cannabis employees. Minimum wage is more in SF than in CA, SF requires Labor Peace Agreements, local hiring, and equity give-back plans. As well, our organization has developed and operated one of the largest free compassion programs in the United States, having works with Maitri AIDS hospice for over 10 years now, supplying free cannabis to the many diverse residents in need of cannabis in their final days. With a background in construction, I am also well-versed in the building code requirements aimed to make the workplace a more friendly place for those with disabilities. As well, I have submitted many permits in San Francisco and understand the diverse concerns of neighbors near cannabis establishments - having worked with many neighborhood groups to plan for being a successful neighbor.

ERICH PEARSON is a renowned leader in the cannabis industry – a long-time advocate, legislative consultant, dispensary operator, and cultivation expert. Erich has served on the board of the National Cannabis Industry Association (NCIA) since its inception in 2010. For the last fourteen years, Erich has been one of the country's strongest proponents of medical cannabis regulation, cultivation and industry best practices. Erich served on the San Francisco District Attorney's Medical Marijuana Advisory Group. He was instrumental in the passage of San Francisco's Medical Cannabis Dispensary Act and the relegation of marijuana offenses to law enforcement's lowest priority. As a result of Erich's leadership, he was appointed in 2007 by Supervisor David Campos to sit on San Francisco's Medical Cannabis Working Group. In 2015, with Prop 64 on the horizon, Erich was called back to public service as the dispensary representative to the San Francisco State-Cannabis-Legalization Task Force where he serves to this day. In 2010 Erich launched SPARC, a nonprofit medical cannabis dispensary dedicated to providing safe, consistent and affordable medical cannabis to patients in San Francisco. I am a qualified Equity Applicant, and I have deep roots in both San Francisco and the greater Bay Area. I graduated from Berkeley High in 1988, and spent five years teaching in Mexico and Japan after graduating from Claremont McKenna College on the McKenna Scholarship.

I have been living in the City since 1997, when I returned to the Bay to attend Hastings College of the Law after three years teaching for the Japanese Ministry of Education on the JET Program near Osaka, Japan. I lived in the Tenderloin from 1997 to 2006, and on Powell Street near Bush from 2006 to 2008. I've lived in the Inner Richmond continually since 2006.

As a medical cannabis patient since 1998, and the victim of an unlawful eviction by one of the largest landlords in the City in 2005, I understand the need for an inclusive approach to City cannabis policy to benefit the City as a whole and advance the needs of those less fortunate - particularly in regards to gentrification and housing.

I have been practicing law in the City since 2005 when I hung out my own shingle at 819 Eddy Street. I spent the first two years of my practice doing criminal defense, before transitioning to civil litigation. I spent the next several years focusing on discrimination and wage and hour litigation. Since 2014, I have specialized in cannabis land use, permitting, leasing, business formation, and legislation. In 2016 I co-founded the Coalition for Common Sense Regulation (CCSR), a non-profit advocacy group dedicated to retail cannabis advocacy and functional cannabis legislation. CCSR has also co-sponsored cannabis-equity hiring fairs with dispensaries such as Barbary Coast and the Green Door.

In 2017 CCSR co-authored and co-sponsored AB-1159 with Assemblyman David Chiu's office, which Governor Brown signed into law on October 6, 2017. AB-1159 ensured that cannabis contracts would be enforceable under California law despite federal prohibition, and guaranteed that cannabis consultations would be covered by attorney-client privilege.

I am the CEO of CCSR, which focuses on legislative advocacy for the cannabis industry. I am also the CEO of Community Rising, a charitable organization awaiting IRS approval which is focused on community improvement at the neighborhood level by the cannabis industry. I also serve on the Advisory Board of Legal Assistance for the Elderly, a San Francisco charity in its 40th year devoted to providing pro-bono legal services for elderly and disabled adults here in the City, including, but not limited to, eviction defense services, working to preserve entitled benefits, and helping to keep seniors in their homes by assisting with the procurement of additional and necessary government-funded housing accommodations for seniors like the installation of subsidized stair-lifts in older buildings.

A word about myself and those I serve, my name is Angela White and I am the Cannabis job developer working with the nonprofit Success Centers where our motto is, "Empowerment through Education, Employment, and Art." ## SEC. 5.38-1. CREATION OF COMMITTEE.

The Board of Supervisors ("Board") hereby establishes the Cannabis Oversight Committee ("Committee").

#### $\square$ SEC. 5.38-2. DEFINITIONS.

Terms not defined in this Article XXXVIII shall have the meaning attributed to them in Police Code Section 1602.

(Added by Ord. 260-18, File No. 180800, App. 11/2/2018, Eff. 12/3/2018)

#### SEC. 5.38-3. PURPOSE.

In 2018, the City enacted Police Code <u>Article 16</u> to comprehensively regulate Commercial Cannabis activities, including the implementation of an Equity Program to promote equitable ownership and employment opportunities in the Cannabis industry by lowering barriers for those hit hardest by the War on Drugs. The purpose of the Committee is to 1) convene representatives of Cannabis Business operators, workers, patients, and other key stakeholders in the Cannabis industry to oversee the Office of Cannabis' implementation of Police Code <u>Article 16</u> by evaluating data on the industry's growth; and 2) provide guidance and recommendations to the Board on amendments to local laws and regulations, including those governing the Equity Program, to facilitate socially responsible growth of this new industry by creating living wage jobs and economic opportunities consistent with the Board's intent in adopting Police Code <u>Article 16</u>.

# SEC. 5.38-4. MEMBERSHIP.

The Committee shall consist of nine voting members and seven non-voting members, as follows (seats 1 through 7 being non-voting members):

(a) Seat 1 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Public Health or the Director's designee.

(b) Seat 2 shall be held by the Chief of the Police Department or the Chief's designee.

(c) Seat 3 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Building Inspection or the Director's designee.

(d) Seat 4 shall be held by the Director of the Planning Department or the Director's designee.

(e) Seat 5 shall be held by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District or the Superintendent's designee, which may include a Member of the Board of Education. The Superintendent is not required to hold this seat or appoint a designee, but shall be invited to do so.

(f) Seat 6 shall be held by the Executive Director of the Entertainment Commission or the Executive Director's designee.

(g) Seat 7 shall be held by the Chief of the Fire Department or the Chief's designee.

(h) Seat 8 shall be held by an Owner of a Cannabis Business permitted through the Equity Program, appointed by the Board. If there are no Equity Applicant permit-holders who apply for the seat, then the Board may appoint a person who, at the time of the appointment, is an Equity Applicant, as that term is defined in Police Code Subsection <u>1604(b)</u>.

(i) Seat 9 shall be held by the operator of a Cannabis Cultivation, Manufacturing, or distribution business with fewer than 20 employees at the time of appointment, appointed by the Board.

(j) Seat 10 shall be held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis business labor force, appointed by the Board.

(k) Seat 11 shall held<sup>1</sup> by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis delivery service labor force, appointed by the Board.

(I) Seat 12 shall be held by an Owner of a Storefront Cannabis Retailer, appointed by the Board.

(m) Seat 13 shall be held by a person who, at the time of the appointment, is an Equity Applicant, as that term is defined in Police Code Subsection <u>1604(b)</u>, appointed by the Board.

(n) Seat 14 shall be held by a person with demonstrated subject matter expertise on the State of California's Cannabis laws and regulations, appointed by the Board.

(o) Seat 15 shall be held by a person with significant experience in workforce and economic development, appointed by the Board.

(p) Seat 16 shall be held by a person who has been a Medicinal Cannabis patient or Medicinal Cannabis consumer for at least five years, with an extensive history advocating for Medicinal Cannabis patients or involvement in implementing and running a Cannabis compassionate use program in compliance with the Compassionate Use Act of 1996, appointed by the Board. (Added by Ord. <u>260-18</u>, File No. 180800, App. 11/2/2018, Eff. 12/3/2018)

#### SEC. 5.38-5. ORGANIZATION AND TERMS OF OFFICE.

(a) Voting members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. Any vacancy in Seats 8 through 16 on the Committee shall be filled by the Board. Voting members may serve multiple terms.

(b) Service on the Committee is voluntary and members shall receive no compensation from the City, except that the members in Seats 1 through 4, 6, and 7 may, if City employees, receive their regular City salaries for time spent on the Committee.

(c) Any member in Seats 8 through 16 who misses three regular meetings of the Committee within a six-month period without the express approval of the Committee at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee 10 days after the third unapproved absence. The Committee shall inform the Clerk of the Board of any such resignation.

(d) All City departments, commissions, boards, and agencies shall cooperate with the Committee in the performance of its functions. City departments shall respond within 30 days to requests for information submitted by the Committee set forth in Administrative Code Subsections <u>2A.420(b)(7)(A)-(J)</u>, if available, and any other reasonable requests for information submitted by the Committee relevant to its ability to discharge its powers and duties, provided that the disclosure of such information shall not be required where it would violate Federal or State law.

(e) The Office of Cannabis shall prepare and submit to the Committee a report as set forth in Administrative Code Section <u>2A.420</u>.

(f) The City Administrator shall provide administrative and policy support for the Committee. (Added by Ord. <u>260-18</u>, File No. 180800, App. 11/2/2018, Eff. 12/3/2018)

## SEC. 5.38-6. POWERS AND DUTIES.

(a) The Committee shall have the power and duty to:

(1) Oversee the Office of Cannabis' implementation and enforcement of City laws and regulations relating to Cannabis, by convening stakeholders, gathering data, and advising the Board and the Mayor.

(2) Gather and evaluate data, and report to the Board and Mayor, regarding the effectiveness of City laws and regulations relating to the Police Code Section <u>1604</u> Equity Program in fostering equitable access to participation in the Cannabis industry and providing assistance to communities unfairly burdened by the War on Drugs.

(3) Gather and evaluate data, and report to the Board and Mayor, on the overall health and stability of the Cannabis industry in San Francisco and make recommendations on possible ways the City can help the industry grow and prosper.

(4) Recommend to the Board modifications to City laws and regulations relating to Cannabis, including recommendations to maximize the creation of living wage jobs and economic opportunities for communities hit hardest by the War on Drugs. Where appropriate, the Committee's recommendations shall include draft legislation or regulations.

(b) As an advisory committee, the Committee shall not have authority to hire, fire, or evaluate personnel in the Office of Cannabis, and shall not have authority over decisions by the Office of Cannabis to issue, deny or modify permits.

#### SEC. 5.38-7. MEETINGS AND PROCEDURES.

(a) The Committee shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than 30 days after the Board has appointed at least eight members to the Committee. There shall be at least ten days' notice of the inaugural meeting. Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not less than five times per year until the sunset date set forth in Section <u>5.38-8</u>.

(b) The Committee shall elect a Chair and officers for such other positions, if any, it chooses to create. The Committee may establish bylaws and rules for its organization and procedures. (Added by Ord. <u>260-18</u>, File No. 180800, App. 11/2/2018, Eff. 12/3/2018)

# SEC. 5.38-8. SUNSET DATE.

Unless the Board by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article XXXVIII shall expire by operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, three years after the effective date of the ordinance in Board File No. 180800 enacting this Article. In that event, after the sunset date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article XXXVIII to be removed from the Administrative Code.
