As a person with a disability myself, I run an organization of people with disabilities and seniors and have extensive experience working with the cross-disability community, including people with mental health conditions and other types of disabilities. I am a queer white woman in my early 40s. Note that I live in Oakland because it is nearly impossible to find affordable, accessible housing in San Francisco.	

I conduct trainings on disability and ableism for government agencies, nonprofit organizations, for-profit companies, and union, and have extensive familiarity with disability-related laws and available services and resources. Through my work at Senior and Disability Action, I have worked closely with people who have experienced mental health crises and substance use. As one of the coordinators of the Voluntary Services First Coalition, I learned a great deal about conservatorship law and potential benefits and pitfalls, as well as individuals' experiences.

Civic Activities:

As a member of the disability community, I take part in numerous disability-related groups, in person and on social media, and I do extensive reading about disability issues. I am a founding leader of Hand in Hand, an organization of people with disabilities and seniors who hire home attendants, as well as people who employ nannies and housecleaners. I am an alumna of the California Youth Leadership Forum for high school students with disabilities and have gone back multiple years as volunteer staff. I co-chair the Organizers Forum, a project of the National Disability Leadership Alliance.

I have faced poverty, been a recipient of public assistance, filed bankruptcy, been on the brink of homelessness and overcome. I live in a working class neighborhood and was educated in the public school system. I have been a Bay Area resident for 16 years and employed by the City and County

of San Francisco for nine years. I have overlapping representation in multiple groups and can relate to the experience of many people who are in need, in communities of interest and

in San Francisco.

I am a certified Psychiatric Mental Health Registered Nurse, and have been working in this capacity for a decade, nine of those years have been with the Department of Public health in San Francisco. I spent five years working in PES at SFGH and gained intimate working knowledge of the mental health system in San Francisco and the wider Bay Area. I currently work in the Transitions Division of DPH and work directly with conservators and conservered clients in multiple settings and various levels of care. I also have worked at Kaiser in the Psychiatric Call Center which afforded me first hand knowledge of the limitations within their HMO network of care. Additionally I have served as an adjunct and clinical professor with Samuel Merritt University teaching in the classroom and at clinical sites, as well as having served as a preceptor on numerous occasions to nursing students, medical residents, and other licensed professionals working on advance practice degrees while I worked in PES.

Civic Activities:

I am a member of the board of JYCA, the Jewish Youth for Community Action, a member of Stonewall Democratic Club and the SEIU Committee for Political Education in both Alameda County and San Francisco County. I am actively engaged in my children's school and am actively enagaged in advocating for patients rights. As a community member and advocate for change I use my current position as a black, LGBT, woman, union member, and city worker to garner attention, and in turn, greater resources for marginalized communities who often have no visibility and no representation.

2007-2019 I was the psychiatric social worker at the locked inpatient psychiatric unit at St. Francis, providing treatment and discharge planning to individuals in behavioral health crisis, many of whom required continued involuntary treatment. I interacted with thousands of patients, community providers and family members to provide collaborative care. I worked closely with the psychiatrist to write and file petitions for conservatorship (both traditional and community based) to help the patient access the appropriate level of care. I represented the hospital medical director and psychiatrists in all the probable cause hearings 2x/week in front of the Mentel Health Commissioner to argue a clinical case for 5250s and 5270s, 2017 to present I act as a private social worker for a client in the Misdemeanor Behavioral Health Collaborative court system. In 2011 I co-founded Community Payee Partnership, as discussed above, and continue to serve as director and provide daily direct service to our clients at HOT, in the Tenderloin, and at local mental health clinics.

Civic Activities:

I believe that doing the work to improve conditions for people in crisis is crucial (we in SF are impacted by staffing shortages in all levels of care in order to address the needs of those experiencing serious mental lliness, substance use disorders, and homelessness). However, I also belleve it is our duty to do more and take this action into our unpaid "off" time. I volunteer consistently at North Beach Citizens (an organization serving our homeless neighbors) by providing pro bono social work and case management services both on site and in the field. I am an active member of 2 neighborhood associations in my district and serve on the board to organize events for my community. I regularly volunteer my time to serve as a panelist at free programs throughout the city to present as a social worker with direct expertise in the SF behavioral health system and homelessness, dispelling myths, offering tools and promoting compassion and action. I was an active volunteer in the Prop C Our City Our Home campaign. I value and want to continue my civic involvement

- I am 20 year resident of San Francisco's Mission District. I am a queer, 49 year-old, Jewish woman. I work in homeless services and currently work and serve low income residents of the Tenderloin neighborhood. I am also the family member of an uncle who lives with chronic, severe mental illness, who has been in varying levels of mandated care over his lifetime.
- 2. Professional Experience: I have over 20 years of professional experience advocating on behalf of and providing services to low income individuals and communities. I have worked in non-profit, community-based organizations in the areas of affordable housing, tenant's rights, and homelessness. My direct work with clients has primarily been with residents of SROs, Public Housing and Section 8 renters and people experiencing homelessness. I spent three years coordinating a multi-disciplinary homeless outreach team on LA's Skid Row, where I became intimately familiar with the issues of chronic mental illness among those living on the streets. Along with our team's mental health clinicians and outreach staff from the Department of Mental Health, we addressed many cases of severe and persistent mental illness where we utilized the County's mental health system of care, including the 5150 process, the Assisted Outpatient Program and the office of Conservator. Currently, I work for Community Housing Partnership, which is a supportive housing provider that provides homes and services to people experiencing homelessness. CHP has 1700 units of affordable housing, many of which are SROs in the Tenderloin and the Central City and includes family housing on Treasure Island and a Navigation Center at the Civic Center Hotel. I have a Master's in Social Work (MSW) degree from San Francisco State University.
- 3. Civic Activities: I have served on numerous boards and committees, including serving as Board Member of the National Housing Law Project, sitting on the HOPESF Task Force, serving on the Policy Committee of the Mental Health Association of SF, member of the Mayor's Re-Envisioning Public Housing Task Force.

SEC. 5.37-1. ESTABLISHMENT OF WORKING GROUP.

There is hereby established the Housing Conservatorship Working Group (the "Working Group") of the City and County of San Francisco.

SEC. 5.37-2. MEMBERSHIP.

The Working Group shall be comprised of 12 members, appointed as follows:

(a) Seats 1 and 2 shall be held by representatives of disability rights advocacy groups, appointed by the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, respectively.

(b) Seats 3 and 4 shall be held by representatives of labor unions, appointed by the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, respectively.

(c) Seats 5 and 6 shall be held by representatives of organizations providing direct services to homeless individuals or families, appointed by the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, respectively.

(d) Seat 7 shall be held by an employee of a hospital located in San Francisco with experience in mental health and substance use disorders, appointed by the Director of Health.

(e) Seat 8 shall be held by an employee of the Behavioral Health Services program of the Department of Public Health, appointed by the Director of Health.

(f) Seat 9 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Public Health, appointed by the Director of Health.

(g) Seat 10 shall be held by an employee of the Human Services Agency, appointed by the Director of the Human Services Agency.

(h) Seat 11 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, appointed by the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.

(i) Seat 12 shall be held by an employee of the San Francisco Police Department, appointed by the Chief of Police.

 \square SEC. 5.37-3. ORGANIZATION AND TERMS OF OFFICE.

(a) Members of the Working Group shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing authorities, and may be removed by the appointing authority at any time.

(b) Appointing authorities shall make initial appointments to the Working Group by no later than 90 days after the effective date of this Article XXXVII.

(c) The Working Group shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than 30 days after a quorum of the Working Group, defined as a majority of seats, has been appointed. Thereafter, the Working Group shall meet at least once every four months until the sunset date in Section <u>5.37-</u>5.

(d) Members of the Working Group shall receive no compensation from the City, except that the members in Seats 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 who are City employees may receive their respective City salaries for time spent working on the Working Group.

(e) Any member who misses three regular meetings of the Working Group within any 12month period without the express approval of the Working Group at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Working Group 10 days after the third unapproved absence. The Working Group shall inform the appointing authority of any such resignation.

(f) The Department of Public Health shall provide administrative and clerical support for the Working Group, and the Controller's Office shall provide technical support and policy analysis for the Working Group upon request. All City officials and agencies shall cooperate with the Working Group in the performance of its functions.

(a) The Working Group shall conduct an evaluation of the effectiveness of the implementation of Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 5450) of the California Welfare and Institutions Code ("Chapter 5") in addressing the needs of persons with serious mental illness and substance use disorders in the City. The evaluation shall include: 1) an assessment of the number and status of persons who have been recommended for a Housing Conservatorship, evaluated for eligibility for a Housing Conservatorship, and/or conserved under Chapter 5; 2) the effectiveness of these conservatorships in addressing the short- and long-term needs of those persons, including a description of the services they received; 3) the impact of conservatorships established pursuant to Chapter 5 on existing conservatorships established pursuant to Division 4 (commencing with Section 1400) of the California Probate Code or Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 5350) of the California Welfare and Institutions Code, and on mental health programs provided by the City; 4) the number of detentions for evaluation and treatment under Section 5150 of the California Welfare and Institutions Code that occurred in San Francisco during the evaluation period, broken down by the type of authorized person who performed the detention (e.g., peace officer or designated member of a mobile crisis team); and 5) where a detention for evaluation and treatment under Section 5150 was performed by a peace officer, an explanation as to why the peace officer was the appropriate person to perform the detention.

(b) The Working Group shall prepare and submit reports to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, and the Legislature on its findings and recommendations regarding the implementation of Chapter 5.

(1) **Reports to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors.** The Working Group shall submit its first report to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors by no later than six months after the effective date of the ordinance in Board File No. 181042 establishing Division IV of <u>Article 41</u> of the Health Code, and annually thereafter.

(2) **Reports to the Legislature.** A preliminary report shall be submitted to the Legislature by no later than January 1, 2021, in compliance with Section 9795 of the California Government Code. A final report shall be submitted to the Legislature by no later than January 1, 2023, in compliance with Section 9795 of the California Government Code.

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Working Group, this Article XXXVII shall expire by operation of law, and the Working Group shall terminate, on December 31, 2023. In that event, after that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article XXXVII to be removed from the Administrative Code.
