When the owner of a building, occupancy, premises, system or vehicle fails to abate a violation by the compliance date and the fire code official refers the matter for hearing, the Fire Department shall charge an administrative hearing referral fee of \$130, under Fire Code, Section 110.4.3.1. When the fire code official issues a notice of violation and sets a date for compliance and re-inspection to certify compliance under Fire Code, Section 110.4.2, the fire code official shall charge a fee of \$260 for violation for each re-inspection. When the owner of a building, occupancy, premise, or vehicle fails to abate a violation by the compliance date and the fire code official refers the matter for hearing and sets a date for the violation to be heard before a hearing officer, the fire code official shall charge a \$390 administrative hearing fee for each hearing where the violation is heard, under Fire Code, Section 110.4.3.2. When the hearing officer sets a date for violations to be corrected and verify compliance with code requirements, the fire code official shall charge \$130 for each site re-inspection to abate the violation during the administrative hearing process, under Fire Code, Section 110.4.3.3.

In accordance with Administrative Code, Section 67.7-1, persons who are unable to attend the hearing on these matters may submit written comments to the City prior to the time the hearing begins. These comments will be made part of the official public record in these matters, and shall be brought to the attention of the members of the Committee. Port of San Francisco (the "Port"), a department of the City and County of San Francisco (the "City") invites proposals for a Construction Manager/General Contractor ("CM/GC") contract referred to as **MISSION BAY FERRY LANDING RFP/RFQ Contract #2819** (the "Project"). The Port intends to award the CM/GC

contract under Best Value criteria. The Project includes construction of a single-float, two-berth landing which consists of a pier, connecting ramp, gangway, and a covered translucent canopy located at the intersection of 16th Street and Terry Francois Blvd. Other components of the Project include dredging approximately 109,200 cubic yards of material, installation of a sediment cap as well as construction to the surrounding plaza and upgrades to Agua Vista Park. Qualified Proposers must possess a current Class "A" California Contractor's license.
