4	to reduce the official sidewalk width of certain locations along the westerly side of

6	Center at 1301 Pierce Street; adopting the Planning Department's determination under
7	the California Environmental Quality Act; and making findings of consistency with the
8	General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.

14	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
15	
16	Section 1. Findings.
17	(a) In a letter dated January 28, 2019, the Planning Department determined that the
18	proposed project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act,
19	(California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). A copy of said letter is on file
20	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 191062 and is incorporated herein by
21	reference. The Board of Supervisors adopts this determination as its own.
22	(b) The Planning Department, in a letter dated January 29, 2019, found the actions
23	contemplated in this ordinance are consistent with the General Plan and in conformance with
24	the eight priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1. A copy of said letter is on file with

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1	the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 191062 and is incorporated herein by
2	reference. The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own the findings in said letter.
3	
4	(c) The Public Works Director issued Public Works Order No. 202075, dated October
5	21, 2019 recommending the actions contemplated in this ordinance, including the sidewalk
6	width changes depicted in Public Works Drawing Q-20-1080. The proposed sidewalk width
7	changes along the westerly side of Pierce Street between O'Farrell and Ellis Streets, in front
8	of the Maxine Hall Health Center at 1301 Pierce Street (Assessor's Block 0728, Lot No. 005A
9	and Lot No. 006), are intended to promote pedestrian safety and comfort and to enhance the
10	anticipated pedestrian traffic circulation. A copy of said Order is on file with the Clerk of the
11	Board of Supervisors in File No. 191062, and is incorporated herein by reference.
12	
13	Section 2. In accordance with the Department of Public Works' Order No. 202075,
14	dated October 21, 2019, Board of Supervisors Ordinance No.1061, entitled "Regulating the
15	Width of Sidewalks," a copy of which is in the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors Book of
16	General Ordinances, in effect May 11, 1910, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
17	section to read as follows:
18	
19	Section 1624. Modifying the official sidewalk widths along the westerly side of Pierce Street
20	between O'Farrell Street and Ellis Street, fronting Assessor's Block 0728, Lot No. 005A and Lot No.
21	006, by decreasing the existing sidewalk width from 15 feet to varying widths no less than 10 feet as
22	shown on Public Works Drawing Q-20-1080, a copy of which is in the Clerk of the Board of

Supervisors File No. 191062.

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1	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
2	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
3	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
4	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
