





### Operating expenses cover regular costs of running the program and coordinating services at CASC

- Clients expenses, daily meals and snacks, running groups, outings, transportation, gift cards and other incentives, and celebrations.
- Facility maintenance, utilities, IT & Communications, materials & supplies, and some subcontracts for specific programs such as domestic violence prevention.
- Staff expenses, training, travel, recruitment and retention.

## Reentry Services

- •Reentry Services Division of SF Adult Probation, a civilian division was formed in 2011 during Realignment
- 10 members of Reentry Division team
  - √Two previously incarcerated team members
  - ✓ Racially diverse team (64% People of Color, 36% White)
- Reentry Division team administers 28 \*community-led\* reentry services contracts
  - ✓ SFAPD uses its AB109 allocation to uplift and expand non-profit efforts and partnerships
  - ✓ Majority of organizations are led and/or services are directed by people of color, from San Francisco, previously incarcerated and/or in long-term recovery
  - ✓ Wide range of service: In-Custody Reentry Pod (CJ2/A Pod), Supportive/Transitional Housing (177 beds), education, employment, case management and mentoring, behavioral health services, robust partnership with SF Department of Public Health, community services, enrichment activities, annual community events.
- The CASC/Community Assessment and Services Center is SF Probation's flagship program

## CASC/Community Assessment and Services Center - Overview

- •CASC vision launched in 2012 as a cornerstone of San Francisco's Criminal Justice Realignment Plan.
- •18K square feet 2 floors (Services center occupies 2/3 of the building and Probation (Sworn and Reentry teams) occupies the other 1/3)
- Doors are open to any justice involved/impacted person who is ages 18 years and older
- UCSF Citywide-Forensics manages CASC facility and CASC services.
- •CASC sees 120 unduplicated people per day. In FY 18/19, nearly 3,500 unduplicated people received some level of CASC services
- •There are 25 classes/groups per week CBT and DBT-based, substance dependency and mental health stigma, as well as TAY-focused and women's gender responsive groups.

## CASC – Partners and Services

In addition to **UCSF/Citywide**, 12 additional city and community reentry partners utilize the CASC weekly to operate their services, and engage with clients, free of charge:

**SF Department of Public Health:** Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) and a satellite site for the BHAC/Behavioral Health Access Center services. The CASC has two/FTE SF DPH clinicians and two/FTE care coordinators who streamline access into detox and residential treatment beds funded by SF Adult Probation.

**Human Services Agency:** An FTE HSA Employment Specialist is onsite for Medical and CalFresh enrollment and to get the General Assistance/GA process started.

**Goodwill Industries of San Francisco**, **San Mateo** and **Marin** provides robust employment services for people with criminal histories.

**Five Keys Schools and Programs** is also on-site and oversees the high school and community services programs.

# UCSF/Citywide-Forensics

- •UCSF/Citywide and SF Adult Probation have a long history of partnership through collaborative courts work, and more recently starting in 2013 through an initial behavioral health case management contract.
- •In 2017, UCSF/Citywide was selected to operate the CASC facility and services. The addition of UCSF/Citywide into the CASC design has been extremely successful.
- •UCSF/Citywide has unique expertise in working with the forensic population they recruit people who have deep commitment to using clinical expertise to mitigate co-occurring needs of high-risk, justice involved people.
- •The CASC is a host-site for research UCSF/Citywide and UC Berkeley are piloting a program called Changing Your Mind, a CBT program for people with a history of mental health challenges to understand the impact on recidivism reduction and self-sufficiency.


# UCSF Citywide – Snapshot of CASC Case Management Services – FY 18/19

### **Overview of Case Management**

In the Fall of 2017, UCSF/Citywide was selected to oversee CASC services. Using the Forensic Assertive Community Treatment (FACT) model of case management, UCSF/Citywide adeptly serves clients based on their criminogenic and behavioral health needs. CASC case management capacity is regularly at 100% utilization.

# UCSF/Citywide – CASC Services

#### **Clinical Case Management**

The CASC Case Management team works with APD's highest needs and hardest to serve forensic population.

Most Prevalent DSM Diagnosis of Participants:

- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Thought Disorder
- Substance Use Disorder

#### **CASC Medication Management:**

- Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner works with clients to evaluate/treat mental health symptoms to increase their psychiatric stability.
- Clients are evaluated for medication efficacy and side effects on an ongoing basis. Medications may be changed to address new psychiatric symptoms.
- Oral/Injectable medications are administered
- Most commonly distributed medications are antidepressants, sleep medications, and antipsychotics.

### **Reentry Case Management**

- Biopsychosocial Assessment
- Adult Needs and Strengths Assessment (ANSA)
- Individual treatment Plan based on client's criminogenic needs
- Aid client's transition from custody to the community
- Navigate Barriers to Reentry
- Outreach



### FACT Case Management - Brief Overview

Forensic Assertive Community Treatment (FACT) is a communitybased program for justice involved people that provides intensive case management and mental health treatment. FACT is a dynamic model in which practitioners respond to client's needs in the community, in-custody, and at the CASC- wherever needed!
