



Total Property Crime 2011-2015 By Crime Type




Out of all property crimes, Theft from Vehicle increased the most between 2014 and 2015 (34%).




• There was a 34% increase in Theft from Vehicle incidents from 2014 to 2015.




- The average number of Theft from Vehicle incidents per month in 2014 was 1,652; the average in 2015 was 2,208.
- Theft from Vehicle incidents per month peaked in July 2015 at 2,630. Since then, incidents per month have declined by 33%.

Theft from Vehicle 2014 – 2015 by Supervisorial District




• Vehicle Theft increased by 13% from 2014 to 2015.

2011 - 2015 by Quarter


2014 - 2015 Comparison



- The average number of Vehicle Thefts per month was 511 in 2014, and 576 in 2015.
- By quarter, the largest increase in 2015 occurred in Q1 (19%), the smallest increase occurred in Q3 (5%).

Vehicle Theft 2014 – 2015 by Supervisorial District








- Saturation of Hot Spots by plain clothes, Operations and Patrol








• Larceny-Theft (Personal/Other) increased by 2% from 2014 to 2015.

2014 - 2015 Comparison




- The average number of Larceny-Thefts per month was 1159 in 2014, and 1186 in 2015.
- The quarterly number of Larceny-Thefts in 2015 were slightly higher than 2014 quarterly numbers, with the exception of Q4.

In Q4, relative to 2014, incidents declined by 20%.



• There was a 1 % decrease in Burglary from 2014 to 2015.






Burglary Comparisons





- The average number of Burglaries per month was 1309 in 2014, and 1292 in 2015.
- By quarter, the largest increase occurred in Q2, where there was a 12% increase.
 - The largest decrease occurred in Q1, where there was a 12% decrease.





Hot Prowl Burglary - Citywide December 21, 2015 - January 11, 2016






The SFPD Crime Analysis Unit performs analysis on crime data and suspect information for the Command Staff and specialized Units.

- Analysis is shared across Districts















Commercial Robbery 2014-2015 Comparison













Carjacking 2014-2015 Comparison















