Funds from the U.S. Department of Energy's Clean Cities Coalition Program support the SF Environment Clean Air Transportation Program's ongoing efforts to implement the City's Environmental Codes related to air quality and global warming emissions reductions. These efforts include activities such as promoting alternative fuel vehicles, facilitating the use of alternative fuels to displace petroleum, and providing outreach and education to local fleet operators. Funds are specifically used to support the Clean Vehicles Manager's existing responsibilities

As a member of the Department of Energy's National Clean Cities Coalition Program, the San Francisco Clean Cities Coalition activities are coordinated by the SF Environment Clean Vehicles Manager. Clean Cities Coalition activities and goals are exactly the same as those of the City and County of San Francisco and these funds will support the Clean Vehicles Program Manager's salary and ongoing job responsibilities.

Dear Mr. David Assmann,

The US Department of Energy recently recruited Ms. Vandana Bali, Manager, Clean Vehicle Programs at SF Environment, to operate our Clean Cities Coalition in San Francisco (SFCCC). The goal of each coalition is to promote DOE's Policy, which supports the use of alternative fuels and vehicles to reduce our dependence on foreign oil - while promoting energy security and a cleaner environment.

To support Ms. Bali's efforts, DOE provides funding to cover, among other things travel. expenses to carry out her job. Each coordinator is expected to attend DOE sponsored events, such as Regional Peer Exchange meetings (
<a href="http://www.netl.doe.gov/events/09conferences/cleancities-pgh/">http://www.netl.doe.gov/events/09conferences/cleancities-pgh/</a>) and the National Leadership Retreat (<a href="http://www.netl.doe.gov/events/09conferences/cleancities-tn/">http://www.netl.doe.gov/events/09conferences/cleancities-tn/</a>), which is organized exclusively for Clean Cities Coordinators throughout the United States.

Failure to participate in required travel jeopardizes a coalition from receiving funding in the current and future periods. In SFCCC's case, their next payment will be \$32,500. More funds will be provided to SFCCC, based upon performance and attendance at DOE sponsored events.
