Motion directing the Budget and Legislative Analyst to conduct a performance audit in FY2019-2020 of the Ethics Commission as a priority.

WHEREAS, It is the policy of the Board of Supervisors that each program of the City and County of San Francisco be the subject of a performance audit at least once every eight years; and

WHEREAS, The function of regular performance audits is to ensure that City departments and agencies make prudent and efficient use of City resources and also effectively perform the functions assigned to them by the Charter and applicable laws; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors previously adopted a motion directing the Budget and Legislative Analyst to conduct performance audits in FY2019-2020 of (i) the effectiveness of the City departments' pre-apprenticeship and workforce development and community benefits programs; (ii) the administration by the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing of homeless services; (iii) the policies and procedures of the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development for the acquisition of sites for the development or preservation of affordable housing; and (iv) Public Works' street resurfacing program and street tree maintenance program; and

WHEREAS, The Budget and Legislative Analyst is currently conducting a performance audit of the effectiveness of the City departments' pre-apprenticeship and workforce development and community benefits programs; now, therefore, be it;

MOVED, That the Budget and Legislative Analyst is hereby directed to conduct a performance audit in FY2019-2020 of the Ethics Commission as a priority.

Audit committee chair Mar, committee members Peskin and Haney:

I regret that I will be unable to attend the committee meeting today and the agenda on President Yee's proposed audit of the ethics commission.

It was my hope to attend and express the support of Friends of Ethics and our supporters for President Yee's request that the board ask for a priority audit of the ethics commission agenda work and responsibilities.

We are strongly in support of President Yee's request and respectfully ask that our support be included in the committees record and shared with members of the board.

In 2011 I worked with then Friends of Ethics cofounder Eileen Hansen in outlining various aspects of a proposed review of the ethics commission requested by then Supervisor Campos. The board budget analyst did an outstanding job in issuing his findings in a 2012 report that became the basis for moving the ethics commission forward in meeting the challenges at that time.

In the years since that time the Civil Grand Jury did its own review in 2014 and additional studies have also been done.

Much of the work to date has been retrospective reviewing the ethics commission's mandates and the performance of other ethics bodies such as Los Angeles, and making recommendations.

However there is a major change in the landscape from when the ethics commission was founded in 1993 and the studies since then.

Even the premises that the public is best served by tracking money and contacts, monthly reporting, and so forth is called into question today when bots are campaign "workers," cheap fakes and deep fakes falsify information, geofencing allows for unregulated identification of voters for messaging, and more. Lobbyists have morphed into strategic advisors outside our disclosure rules, 501c4 nonprofits lead efforts like confirming Supreme Court nominees but are exempt from disclosing their funding sources, and instead our time is taken on the type size on door hangers. We are still building an ark for a flood when we face fires.

These are outside the capacity as it currently exists for our Ethics Commission, both in staffing and funding. Timeliness is hampered by a process that puts staffing upgrades on a 12-20 month track that leaves the public interest last.

It is our hope that an audit might examine how best to meet these challenges. Are we overdue for a public process that allows for remote participation as the FPPC does? Should we implement a system that provides for citizen review of campaign materials electronically? Do we have the right qualifications for Ethics Commission appointments and independence? How are we handling Whistleblowers in a changed workplace? Do we have too many cooks in the kitchen by splitting things between Ethics, the Controller, the City Attorney, District Attorney, HR, and the mayor? Should we contract out some work now that the FPPC has opened that possibility? How do we enlist the work of nonprofits engaged in ethics oversight?

President Yee's audit request helps us to begin to ask better questions, knowing that the answers will always be subject to a changed environment.

We urge that his request be endorsed by the Audit Committee.
