Thank you for your understanding and accommodation. Please find my statement below.

Dear Supervisors Ronen, Stefani, Mar,

As a current graduate student with a significant amount of debt and ever-growing ties to San Francisco, I am immensely grateful for your consideration of my application to join the Free City College Oversight Committee. I regard the Free City College program as an invaluable investment in the human capital of our city because an education is essential to ensuring every San Franciscan can reach their full potential. If fortunate enough to earn your recommendation, I will add a valuable perspective to the committee based on my experience with several of the issues confronting prospective and current CCSF students.

As with many 20- to 30-somethings, I simultaneously struggle with mental illness, debt, and the pressures of an increasingly competitive professional environment. Regarding mental illness, I first developed anorexia in the fourth grade. My diagnosis — as a person who identifies as male and as a child under the age of 11 years old — was extremely are. Though therapy has helped me eliminate most of the symptoms of my disease, I remain anxious, occasionally depressed, and forever compulsive. Young people today increasingly confront the same issues. I believe that I can help the Free City College program accommodate and recognize these mental struggles.

Moreover, I know that higher education is no longer just a boost to one's professional career but a near necessity. I am presently pursuing a Masters of Public Policy and Juris Doctorate, in part, because my professional aspirations were limited without earning additional degrees. It follows that every San Franciscan should be able to secure some form of higher education, which will set them up for far greater professional opportunities and personal fulfillment. If selected to the committee, I will vigorously explore ways to help San Franciscans of all ages pursue the continuing education that is essential to their mental, physical, and financial well-being.

For many, the pursuit of higher education is impossible due to the absurd costs of our academic system. That's why I would be such a passionate advocate for protecting this program and ensuring its financial security. This program opens doors for so many people; it should never be shut down. I believe my policy and economic knowledge will help preserve and expand the program, while ensuring it fulfills its mandate. My extensive policy experience comes from having lobbied for similar educational programs with Children First for Oregon, studied policy at the Harvard Kennedy School, and served as Governor Kate Brown's Executive Assistant. My familiarity with economic matters comes from having started my own non-profit and spent time as an economic consultant. If selected to the committee, I will use my background in these topics to rigorously evaluate proposed plans and policies.

I would be honored to receive your recommendation. It's true that I am relatively new to San Francisco, but so are many students. It's true that I may not have as much professional experience as other candidates, but I believe I possess the most relevant experiences. I hope to be a source of encouragement and support to individuals who, like me, are fighting many demons while attempting to reach their highest aspirations through education.

The Free City College Oversight Committee ("Committee") was established to provide advice to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families. all other relevant City departments, and City College regarding the implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between the City and City College, which was authorized by Resolution No. 335-19. The Committee's advice may include recommendations regarding the use of funds disbursed, proposed changes in uses of the funds, and potential expansions of the Free City College Program. When providing advice and recommendations, the Committee shall consider the audit reports provided by the Controller, pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 10.100-288, as well as reports that the Chancellor of City College has provided to the Committee under the MOU.

The Department of Children, Youth and Their Families shall provide clerical and administrative support and staffing to the Committee.

The Committee shall consist of 15 voting members, as follows, that serve for indefinite terms:

- Seat 1 shall be held by the Mayor or their designee;
- Seat 2 shall be held by the President of the City College Board of Trustees or their designee;
- Seat 3 shall be held by a student at City College, appointed by the Mayor;
- Seat 4 shall be held by a student at City College, appointed by the Board of Supervisors;
- Seat 5 shall be held by a student at City College, appointed by the City College Associated Students;

- > Seat 6 shall be held by a Member of the Board of Supervisors, appointed by the Board of Supervisors, or that Member's designee;
- > Seat 7 shall be held by an employee or officer of the San Francisco Unified School District, appointed by the Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District;
- > Seat 8 shall be held by the Controller or their designee;
- > Seat 9 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, appointed by the Director of the Department;
- > Seat 10 shall be held by a City College employee who is involved in the administration of the Free City College Program, appointed by the City College Board of Trustees;
- > Seat 11 shall be held by a City College faculty member, appointed by the City College Academic Senate;
- > Seat 12 shall be held by a classified staff member of City College, appointed by the labor organization that represents the largest number of classified City College employees;
- > Seat 13 shall be held by a member of the public, appointed by the Mayor;
- > Seat 14 shall be held by a member of the public, appointed by the Board of Supervisors; and
- > Seat 15 shall be held by the student trustee member of the City College Board of Trustees.

The members in seats 1 and 2 shall be the co-chairs of the Committee. If the City College Board of Trustees, City College Associated Students, City College Academic Senate, the labor organization that represents the largest number of classified City College employees, or the Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District declines to appoint a member to a seat for which it has appointing authority and leaves that seat vacant for more than 90 days, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a member of the public to fill the seat until the appointing authority appoints a person to the seat.
