13	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors recognizes that diversity is one of the greatest
14	of community strengths, and appreciates the contributions made by residents of all
15	backgrounds, acknowledging the tremendous impact they have upon the social, cultural, and
16	economic development of our City; and,
17	WHEREAS, The City of San Francisco is proud to honor the history of various
18	communities that have not only strengthened our City, but added to the greatness of our
19	country; and,
20	WHEREAS, We celebrate with the immigrant community the enduring faith, history and
21	culture of all our people, and are further inspired by the immigrant's quest for life, freedom,
22	liberty and pursuit of happiness and justice for all; now, therefore, be it
