13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
14	Section 1. The San Francisco Park Code is hereby amended by amending Section		
15	4.01, to read as follows:		
16	SEC. 4.01. DISORDERLY CONDUCT.		
17	No person shall, in any park- without permission of the Recreation and Park		
18	Department:		
19	(a) Throw or prope	el objects of a potentially dangerous nature, including, but not limited	
20	to, stones, bottles, glass, cans or crockery;		
21	(b) Fire or carry firearms of any size or description, or possess any instrument,		
22	appliance or substance designed, made or adopted for use primarily as a weapon, including,		
23	but not limited to, slingshots, clubs, swords, razors, billies, explosives, dirk knives, bowie		
24	knives or similar knives, except that this subsection shall not apply to a police or other peace		
25	officer;

1	(1) Enter into, or attempt to enter into, any animal enclosure or habitat at the San Francisco	
2	Zoological Gardens, or at the bison paddock in Golden Gate Park, without specific authorization by	
3	Zoo staff;	
4	(m) Fail to follow all rules of the San Francisco Zoological Gardens, or any directions or	
5	instructions given by Zoo staff.	
6		
7	Section 2. The San Francisco Park Code is hereby amended by amending Section	
8	5.07, to read as follows:	
9	SEC. 5.07. FEEDING ANIMALS PROHIBITED.	
10	$\underline{(a)}$ It shall be unlawful for any person to feed or offer to any animal in any park any	
11	substance which would be likely to be harmful to it.	
12	(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to feed, or offer food or any substance to any animal in	
13	any park which is wild by nature and not customarily domesticated in the City and County of San	
14	<u>Francisco</u> .	
15	(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to feed, or offer food or any substance to any animal in	
16	the San Francisco Zoological Gardens without specific authorization from Zoo staff.	
17		
18	Section 3. The San Francisco Park Code is hereby amended by amending Section	
19	5.08, to read as follows:	
20	SEC. 5.08. DISTURBING ANIMALS, BIRDS, FISH PROHIBITED, EXCEPTIONS.	
21	Except as provided in Article 7, Chapter VIII (Police Code) of the San Francisco	
22	Municipal Code, it shall be unlawful for any person-, including City and County of San	
23	Francisco, its officers, employees or agents, to hunt, chase, shoot, trap, discharge or throw	
24	missiles at, molest, disturb, taunt, endanger, capture, injure, or destroy any animal in any parl	
25	including the bison paddock, and the San Francisco Zoological Gardens, or to permit any animal in	

such person's custody or control to do so; provided, however, that any mole or any gopher, mouse, rat or other rodent which is determined by the Superintendent of Parks to be a nuisance may be destroyed by said Superintendent or a designated representative; and provided, further, that any animal other than a mole or a gopher, mouse, rat or other rodent which is determined by said Superintendent to be a nuisance or a hazard to persons using said areas or to be a hazard to plants or other horticulture, may, in a humane manner, be live trapped by said Superintendent and delivered to the Animal Control Officer for disposition pursuant to the provisions of Sections 41.7 through 41.9, inclusive, of Article 1, Chapter V (Health Code) of the San Francisco Municipal Code. The provisions of this Section are intended to prohibit fishing in any park other than fishing in Lake Merced pursuant to a license obtained pursuant to Article 8 of this Code or in any other area designated by Commission resolution as a fishing area.

The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to the destruction of any animal in any park where such animal poses an immediate and serious threat to persons or property or is suffering excessively.

Section 4. The San Francisco Park Code is hereby amended by amending Section 10.01, to read as follows:

SEC. 10.01. PENALTIES.

Unless otherwise specified in this Code, any person violating any section of this Code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor or an infraction. The complaint charging such violation shall specify whether the violation is a misdemeanor or infraction, which decision shall be that of the District Attorney; provided, however, that whenever a person has been arrested and incarcerated based solely on the violation or violations of this Code, he or she shall retain the right at the time of arraignment or plea to object to the offense being made an

1	infraction, in which event the complaint shall be amended to charge the misdemeanor and the	
2	case shall proceed on the misdemeanor complaint.	
3	Upon conviction of a violation charged as an infraction, the person so convicted shall	
4	be punished for the first offense by a fine of not $\frac{1}{2}$ than $\frac{10}{2}$ nor more than $\frac{50}{2}$ and for a	
5	second and each additional offense within one year by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than	
6	\$100\\$200, and for each additional offense within one year by a fine of not more than \$500.	
7	Upon conviction of a violation charged as a misdemeanor., the person so convicted	
8	shall be punished by a fine of not more than $\$500$ $\$1000$ or by imprisonment in the County Jail	
9	for a period of not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
