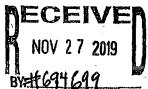

III. Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 – (Subrecipient Handbook, Section 2152)

- c. the Subrecipient understands they must comply with the specific assurances set out in 29 C.F.R. §§ 42.105 and 42.204.
