# San Francisco Pretrial Diversion Project – History/Overview

#### 1964 Own Recognizance (OR) Project

- Established by San Francisco Bar Association for alternative to cash bail
- Independent agency services included minimal level of pre-trial client supervision

#### 1976 San Francisco Pretrial Diversion Project (SFPDP)

- Established to address individuals held pre-trial on minor offenses
- Independent non-profit contracting with Sheriff's Office
- Diverted misdemeanor clients from criminal prosecution

#### 1994 Sheriff's Office and SFPDP established Supervised Pretrial Release program

- Expanded population eligible for pre-trial release by providing court with postarraignment case management and supervision alternatives
- Supervised Pretrial Release now referred to as Assertive Case Management (ACM)

#### 2003 SFPDP assumed work of OR Project

- Merger into one independent agency
- Services for clients with varying levels of acuity to divert them from pre-trial custody

# San Francisco Pretrial Diversion Project – History/Overview

#### 2016 Public Safety Assessment (PSA) implementation

- Developed by Arnold Foundation and used by SFPDP
- Non-interview risk assessment tool to assess likelihood of failure to appear and new criminal activity during pre-trial release

#### 2018 Court of Appeal Ruling: *In Re Humphrey*

- Release conditions must consider ability to pay and non-monetary alternatives
- Additional SFPDP clients who before would be held in custody unable to make bail
- SFPDP workload increased ~50% from FY17-18 to FY18-19

#### 2019 Federal Court Ruling: Buffin vs. San Francisco


- Prohibits application of Superior Court bail schedule
- Set strict timelines for pre-arraignment detention
- Accelerates SFPDP timeline for completion of PSAs, requires 24/7 coverage
- Additional SFPDP clients who before would access bail

## Growth of Pretrial Workload since FY2017-18










#### **Quarterly Safety & Appearance Rates**

January 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019







<sup>\*</sup> These are the safety and appearance rates as reported by SFPDP. The quarterly **safety rate** is the percentage of everyone who was active on SFPDP's caseload in a quarter who did not have a new filed charge in that quarter. Similarly, the **appearance rate** is everyone who was active on SFPDP's caseload in a quarter who appeared at all court hearings in that quarter, as defined by NAPSA.
