I am an African-American man, and the founding executive director of the newly formed SoMa West Community Benefit District (CBD). As a not for profit place management entity, our mission is to improve the quality of life for all the residents, businesses and visitors to the western part of SoMa through a variety of programs.

The boundaries of the CBD range from Minna in the north to Townsend in the south, and from 5th in the east to 13th in the west. With all or part of 107 blocks, this CBD will touch the lives of many diverse constituencies, and people from many walks of life. Our 23 member board of directors has broad representation of the western SoMa community's ethnic, racial, age, sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity diversity, and we are continuing to develop and expand our diversity of representation currently.

When we launch services in March we will provide daily cleaning and maintenance to this large and diverse neighborhood. We will sweep and wash trash and hazardous materials from sidewalks. We will remove graffiti from public and private property and work to improve the conditions in the public realm. We will employ low income residents to do this work and we will engage other low income constituents through a variety of community building programs that will bring clean, green and active public spaces to our neighborhood. We will prioritize routes to school and transit stops, which disproportionately affect low income residents. We will prioritize pedestrian and bike safety policies and work to bring more green and open spaces to the public realm for the benefit of all living, working, and visiting the neighborhood.

In our first year we will activate Victoria Manalo Draves Park with free books, games and activities to benefit the community. We will sponsor and support arts and cultural groups highlighting our historic and vibrant Filipino culture. We will also activate newly created Eagle Plaza to help ensure this new public plaza remains clean and a neighborhood asset that celebrates our Leather community and all of its beauty and diversity. All of these programs will be free of charge and designed to make these programs accessible and welcoming to low income residents.

In addition, we have hired personnel to conduct outreach to our unhoused persons and link them to services, de escalate conflicts on the street, and ensure the health and public safety for this vulnerable population. In addition, our outreach personnel will be responsible for responding to the unique and immediate needs of very low income people who are at risk of becoming homeless, are currently homeless, or are transitioning into housing.

This is a role that I am familiar with since I have served in similar roles in the past, most recently at the Lower Polk Community Benefit District. Throughout my career I have aimed to give employment opportunities to; individuals experiencing homelessness, formerly incarcerated, folks with mental and physical disabilities, and I've aimed to empower them to participate in the community building process. I take pride in developing people and helping them advance in life and overcome obstacles and setbacks along the way. SWCBD cleaning and outreach jobs offer an opportunity to provide reliable jobs for very low income residents and their families. Almost all are San Francisco residents, and representative of the awesome diversity of the City of San Francisco.

I thank you for the opportunity to apply to continue to serve this population on the SoMa Stabilization CAC.

The SOMA Community Stabilization Fund Community Advisory Committee ("Committee") shall advise the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development ("MOHCD"), other City agencies, and the Board of Supervisors regarding the following:

- (1) Administration of the SOMA Community Stabilization Fund described in Section 418.7 of the Planning Code;
- (2) Prioritization of funding for social services related to cultural preservation that are funded by proceeds of the Central SoMa Community Facilities District special tax, as defined in Planning Code Section 434 and the Central SoMa Implementation Program;
- (3) Prioritization of community improvement projects and other public investments funded by the Central SoMa Community Services Facilities Fund, established in Planning Code Section 432.4;
- (4) Expenditure of affordable housing fees collected pursuant to Planning Code Section 415, and Jobs-Housing Linkage Fees collected pursuant to Planning Code Section 413, generated from development projects within the boundaries of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, or Western SoMa Area Plans, or within 0.25 miles of the boundaries of said area plans but outside the boundaries of the Showplace Square/Potrero Hill, Mission, Central Waterfront, and Market and Octavia Area Plans.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Committee shall be composed of seven (7) members and seven (7) alternate members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors that must satisfy at least one of the following requirements:

- > Represents low-income residents of SOMA.
- > Has expertise in employment development and/or represents labor.
- > Is a senior or disabled resident of SOMA.
- > Has affordable housing expertise and familiarity with the SOMA neighborhood.
- > Represents an arts or cultural organization or a cultural district in SOMA.
- > Provides direct services to SOMA residents.
- > Has small business expertise and a familiarity with the SOMA neighborhood; and/or
- > Is a youth or who represents a youth-development organization.

Taken as a whole, the Committee shall meet all of the membership requirements set forth above.

Additional Requirements: Two (2) voting and two (2) alternate members shall live within the boundaries of the East SoMa, Central SoMa or Western SoMa Area Plans.

Term: Four (4) years with a two consecutive term limit.

MOHCD shall provide administrative and clerical support to the Committee.

The Committee shall coordinate with the South of Market Community Planning Advisory Committee established in Administrative Code, Chapter 5, Article XXVI, when providing advice on matters within the programmatic jurisdiction of both committees.

Reports: The Committee shall develop annual recommendations to MOHCD on the Expenditure Plan referenced in Section 418.5(d) of the Planning Code.

Sunset: Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article XXVII shall expire by operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, on January 1, 2035.
