8	WHEREAS, On March 6, 2020, the San Francisco Health Officer issued a Declaration
9	of Local Health Emergency Regarding Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19), which was
10	preceded by a March 4, 2020 Proclamation of a State of Emergency issued by Governor
11	Gavin Newsom and a February 25, 2020, Proclamation by the Mayor Declaring the Existence
12	of a Local Emergency; and
13	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is currently experiencing an
14	outbreak of the coronavirus (COVID-19) which has been deemed a global pandemic by the
15	World Health Organization; and
16	WHEREAS, Frontline healthcare workers such as doctors, nurses, paramedics, and In-
17	Home Support Service (IHSS) providers have been the first line of defense in stopping the
18	spread of COVID-19 often putting themselves in great risk of contracting the virus from
19	various patients that they come into contact with every day; and
20	WHEREAS, Other healthcare professionals such as physical therapists, occupational
21	therapists, and speech language pathology workers are also fearful for their health because
22	they also come into close contact with a vulnerable set of people, like seniors or those with
23	pre-existing health conditions; and
24	WHEREAS, According to the World Health Organization, as of March 24, 2020, there
25	are 398,100 confirmed cases of COVID-19 worldwide claiming the lives of 17,400 people; and

1	WHEREAS, In the United States as of March 24, 2020, there are already 46,805			
2	cases, with 593 deaths; in California there are 2,297 confirmed cases, including 926			
3	confirmed cases in the Bay Area, and 43 confirmed deaths in California, and 152 confirmed			
4	cases in San Francisco; with these numbers continuing to rise at a rapid rate; and			
5	WHEREAS, If healthcare professionals continue to follow the regular "business as			
6	usual" practices implemented by management at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital			
7	(ZSFGH), they will undoubtedly become vectors for spreading the disease, further burdening			
8	our healthcare system; and			
9	WHEREAS, SEIU Local 2015 represents approximately 400,000 In-Home Supportive			
10	Services (IHSS) providers who assist low-income seniors and people with disabilities, and are			
11	advocating to request that the state take immediate direct action to support and protect the			
12	IHSS community during the COVID-19 pandemic; and			
13	WHEREAS, Direct care workers such as Registered Nurses (RNs), Licensed			
14	Vocational Nurses (LVNs), and Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs) work in over 1,200 skilled			
15	nursing facilities (SNFs) throughout the state to provide medical care, rehabilitation, and			
16	personal care to upwards of 120,000 residents a year; and			
17	WHEREAS, Long-term care workers including homecare providers, RNS, LVNs, and			
18	CNAs, are on the frontline of the COVID-19 crisis, providing care to the most vulnerable			
19	populations including the elderly, disabled, and those living with conditions such as Chronic			
20	Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), heart disease, and diabetes; and			
21	WHEREAS, Homecare providers deliver personal and paramedical services in intimate			
22	settings without the benefits or resources of a healthcare facility; and			
23	WHEREAS, SEIU Local 1021 represents approximately 3,250 workers at ZSFGH and			
24	approximately 1,300 workers at Laguna Honda Hospital; both hospitals serve the most			
25	vulnerable of our city's residents, and these workers are RNs, porters, patience care			

1	assistants, Civas, Lvivs, 1000 service workers, clerks and many other childer healthcare	
2	professionals who are on our Department of Public Health's frontline against this COVID-10	
3	pandemic; and	
4	WHEREAS, IFPTE Local 21 represents hundreds of rehabilitation professionals and	
5	physician assistants in the Rehabilitation Department and various units all over San	
6	Francisco who are tasked with caring for the most vulnerable and at-risk members of our	
7	population at the two main public hospitals, clinics, and at patients' homes; this includes man	
8	patients that are over 80 years old, immune-compromised, and otherwise fragile and will not	
9	be able to fight off an infection that attacks their pulmonary systems; and	
10	WHEREAS, Even in the midst of this crisis, these healthcare professionals have been	
11	asked to continue their daily work tasks with no additional Personal Protective Equipment,	
12	despite nationwide directives from the Center of Disease Control (CDC) to adhere to socia	
13	distancing guidelines; and	
14	WHEREAS, As a result, these healthcare professionals are putting patients,	
15	themselves, and their families at risk since they come into close daily contact with their	
16	patients for prolonged periods of time with little to no additional Personal Protective	
17	Equipment such as masks, gloves, and protective coveralls; and	
18	WHEREAS, The essential job functions of these frontline healthcare providers are to	
19	break "social distancing" precautions by physically touching and facilitating the patients in	
20	movement; and	
21	WHEREAS, Healthcare professionals reporting on safety violations at their workplaces	
22	should be protected, and not subjected to retaliation, even as they seek to mitigate the	
23	hazards of being exposed to COVID-19; now, therefore, be it	
24	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors reaffirms its commitment to	

frontline healthcare providers and in-home support service providers in order to combat the

spread of COVID-19 and maintain the health and safety of the healthcare professionals who risk their lives for well-being of others; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors supports a comprehensive set of long-term care specific guidelines be implemented statewide in response to the COVID-19 pandemic that includes both avoiding transmission and caring for individuals and family members who may have been exposed to or infected with the virus; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, To ensure that healthcare professionals in both the hospital and in-home support services settings should be provided with sufficient protective supplies such as masks, gloves; protective coveralls, and disinfectants; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, All frontline healthcare professionals including workers that provide in-home support should have access to training on Centers for Disease Control guidance on COVID-19, including plans for preparing for infection control procedures, and proper use of Personal Protective Equipment and adequate training on California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) standards; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That free testing and treatment should be provided for all frontline healthcare providers including long-term care providers, individuals receiving homecare, and residents of skilled nursing facilities as quickly as possible, and targeted outreach will be employed to ensure all long-term care providers and recipients of care know where to get tested and that all COVID-19 instructions and information be made accessible and in the provider's preferred language; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a minimum two weeks of pay before the workers are required to use paid leave like sick leave for these healthcare professionals to allow them to quarantine when sick, following California Department of Public Health guidelines for caregivers; and, be it

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, All long-term care providers should be compensated for any			
2	needed work hours in addition to their regular schedule and overtime will be paid at the			
3	appropriate rate in response to COVID-19, and IHSS providers will not receive any overtime			
4	violations for exceeding their workweek limits; and, be it			
5	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, no later than 30			
6	days after the passage of this Resolution, shall transmit copies of this Resolution to			
7	Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital, San Francisco Department of Public Health,			
8	California Department of Public Health and to the representatives of San Francisco on the			
9	California State Legislature urging that they pass similar resolutions.
