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9	WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) first appeared in December 2019 and has
10	spread throughout the world, and on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared
11	the outbreak a global pandemic; and
12	WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, San Francisco Mayor London Breed declared a
13	state of emergency to ramp up the city's efforts to prepare for and respond to local cases of
14	coronavirus; and
15	WHEREAS, On March 4, 2020, California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of
16	emergency to help the state prepare for broader spread of COVID-19; and
17	WHEREAS, San Francisco and California are responding in strong and definitive ways
18	to slow the spread and save lives, with the San Francisco Health Officer issuing order C19-07,
19	ordering residents to shelter-in-place and cease non-essential activities as of March 17, 2020,
20	and California Governor Gavin Newsom following on March 19, 2020, to issue Executive
21	Order N-33-20 ordering residents to remain in their homes except for essential activities; and
22	WHEREAS, Because of these orders and the impact on service and other industries,
23	there are estimates that 80 percent or more of hospitality workers will lose their jobs
24	[https://abcnews.go.com/Business/hospitality-labor-union-projects-90-lose-jobs-
25	coronavirus/story?id=69677732]; along with thousands of entertainment, travel, retail, and

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1 service workers; and filings for unemployment insurance in California have jumped in the week preceding March 21 from 40,000 to 135,000 [https://abc7.com/california-2 3 unemployment-claims-surge-since-coronavirus-outbreak/6032727/]; and WHEREAS, Those workers who are eligible for unemployment insurance are drawing 4 only a fraction of what they would otherwise earn with a maximum of \$450 per week, and 5 6 many workers are not eligible for any unemployment benefits at all; and 7 WHEREAS, Forty percent of Americans do not have cash on hand to cover an 8 unexpected expense of \$400 [https://www.federalreserve.gov/publications/2019-economicwell-being-of-us-households-in-2018-dealing-with-unexpected-expenses.htm], and 78 percent 9 of American workers said they were living paycheck to paycheck 10 [http://press.careerbuilder.com/2017-08-24-Living-Paycheck-to-Paycheck-is-a-Way-of-Life-for-11 12 Majority-of-U-S-Workers-According-to-New-CareerBuilder-Survey; and WHEREAS, San Francisco Mayor London Breed has ordered a 30-day moratorium on 13 14 residential and commercial evictions for nonpayment of rent due to COVID-19 loss of income, but renters are still obligated to pay landlords, and mortgage-holders are still obligated to pay 15 lenders; and 16 WHEREAS, The average monthly rent on an apartment in San Francisco is now 17 18 \$3,700, the highest in the country [https://www.cnet.com/news/san-franciscos-outrageousrent-hits-a-new-peak-highest-in-the-us/]; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Extremely low income San Franciscans (earning less than 30% of AMI) and very low income households (earning less than 50% of AMI) continue to be the 21 overwhelming majority of households facing severe housing cost burdens of 50% or more of 22 income [https://default.sfplanning.org/publications reports/Housing-Needs-and-Trends-23 24 Report-2018.pdf]; and

1 WHEREAS, Retaining the obligation to pay would mean that those who defer 2 payments will accumulate significant personal debt; and 3 WHEREAS, When the public health crisis subsides, San Franciscans must be able to resume everyday activities, including going back to service sector and other jobs; and 4 5 WHEREAS. It is critically important that San Franciscans who currently have housing are not made homeless or destitute because of this public health crisis; and 6 7 WHEREAS, California's economy is the largest among individual US states, and, if it were an independent country, would place fifth in the ranking of national economies, and its 8 9 ability to rebuild successfully will be integral to United States and worldwide economic 10 recovery after the health crisis has ended; and WHEREAS, California Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency on 11 12 March 4, 2020, opening the opportunity to use certain emergency powers under the California 13 Emergency Services Act (California Government Code, Sections 8550-8668); and 14 WHEREAS, One of the first responses to the economic impact of the COVID-19 crisis 15 by the US federal government was to inject \$1.5 trillion on March 12, 2020, in loans to banks to stabilize the economy; and 16 17 WHEREAS, To date no rent relief program is in place and mortgage forbearance guidance for single-family homeowner mortgages has been issued by Freddie Mac, but 18 remains subject to individual banks to decide how and if to implement; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Banks are therefore able to withstand nonpayment of debt during this 21 emergency and work out extensions and other ways for debt to be refinanced when the health 22 emergency is over; and WHEREAS, By halting mortgage payments during this time, the urgent need for 23 landlords to collect rent will be paused; now, therefore, be it 24 25

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San 6 Francisco call on Governor Newsom to call on federal legislators and President Trump's 7 administration to impose an immediate moratorium on mortgage payments, such that no 8 owner of San Francisco property should be required to pay mortgage during this health 9 emergency, nor should they accumulate additional debt for unpaid mortgage payments; and, 10 be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San 12 Francisco call on members of the US Congress -- specifically Speaker Nancy Pelosi and 13 Financial Services Committee Chair Maxine Waters -- to impose an immediate moratorium on 14 mortgage payments and rents, such that no owner of property in the nation should be required 15 to pay mortgage during this health emergency, nor should they accumulate additional debt for 16 unpaid mortgage payments, and no renter in the nation should be required to pay rent during 17 this health emergency, nor should they accumulate debt for unpaid rent; and, be it 18 FURTHER RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San 19 Francisco call on President Trump to issue an executive order to impose an immediate 20 moratorium on mortgage payments and rents, such that no owner of property in the nation 21 should be required to pay mortgage during this health emergency, nor should they

accumulate additional debt for unpaid mortgage payments, and no renter in the nation should
be required to pay rent during this health emergency, nor should they accumulate debt for
unpaid rent; and, be it
