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7	WHEREAS, The County of San Francisco is currently experiencing an outbreak of the
8	novel coronavirus (COVID-19), which has been deemed a global pandemic by the World
9	Health Organization; and
10	WHEREAS, The State of California is a demonstrated leader in the fight against
11	climate change; and
12	WHEREAS, Frontline healthcare workers such as doctors, nurses, paramedics, and In-
13	Home Support Service (IHSS) providers have been the first line of defense in stopping the
14	spread of COVID-19 often putting themselves in great risk of contracting the virus from
15	various patients that they come into contact with every day; and
16	WHEREAS, Other healthcare professionals such as physical therapists, occupational
17	therapists, and speech language pathology workers are also fearful for their health because
18	they also come into close contact with a vulnerable set of people, like seniors or those with
19	pre-existing health conditions; and
20	WHEREAS, According to the World Health Organization, as of April 4, 2020 there are
21	1,136,851 confirmed cases of COVID-19 worldwide and 67,507 people have died because of
22	it; and
23	WHEREAS, On April 3, 2020, Johns Hopkins University reported that the novel
24	coronavirus had infected more than 1.1 million people globally, killed more than 60,000
25	worldwide, and had been detected in at least 175 countries; and

WHEREAS, In the United States, as of April 4, 2020, there are already 277,205 cases
with 6,593 deaths; in California, there are 12,026 confirmed cases, including 3,299 confirmed
cases in the Bay Area, and 276 confirmed deaths in California as we all as 529 confirmed
cases in San Francisco County; and

5 WHEREAS, The World Health Organization's Director-General Dr. Tedros Adhanom 6 Ghebreyesus this past month announced that production of personal protective equipment 7 (PPE) must be increased by forty percent globally and that countries would not be able "to 8 stop COVID-19 without protecting health workers first"; and

9 WHEREAS, President Donald Trump has enacted the Defense Protection Act and 10 ordered the production of ventilators at General Motors, to help with the treatment of 11 COVID-19 patients, similar actions need to be taken in California to produce PPE using 12 Article 3 of the California Emergency Services Act (CA Government Code, Section 8572); and 13 WHEREAS, All frontline workers who come in contact with others and their goods need 14 PPE to keep them and all of us safe and protected from the spread of COVID-19; and 15 WHEREAS, If healthcare professionals continue to follow the "business as usual" 16 practices, they will undoubtedly become vectors for spreading the disease, further burdening 17 our healthcare system; now, therefore, be it 18 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors implores California

Governor Gavin Newsom to utilize the powers of his Executive Authority to expeditiously procure and distribute all PPE available in the state to healthcare workers through local distribution hubs to be coordinated by County public health departments; and, furthermore, that he impress upon local manufacturers, statewide, to begin producing PPE to remedy the current deficit of said protective gear in order to assure and provide improvements to safe working conditions for all frontline workers; and, be it
