### LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Charter Amendment - 16- and 17-Year-Olds Voting in Municipal Elections]

### Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on November 3, 2020, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to authorize youths aged 16 and 17 to vote in municipal elections.

### Existing Law

Article XVII of the Charter defines "voter" as "an elector who is registered in accordance with the provisions of state law." State law provides that voters must be at least 18 years old to vote. See Cal. Const., art. II, § 2 ("A United States citizen 18 years of age and resident in this State may vote."); Cal. Elec. Code § 2000(b) ("Any person who will be at least 18 years of age at the time of the next election is eligible to register and vote at that election.").

#### Amendments to Current Law

The proposal would amend the Charter's definition of "voter," for the purpose of municipal elections, to be "any person who is at least 16 years old, meets all the qualifications for voter registration in accordance with state law other than those provisions that address age, and is registered to vote with the Department of Elections."

#### **Background Information**

In 2016, the Board of Supervisors submitted a Charter amendment to the voters that would have authorized 16 and 17 year olds to vote in municipal elections. See File No. 150267. The measure appeared as Proposition F on the November 8, 2016 ballot, but failed to obtain the voters' approval.

- Media: Examiner, Chronicle, SF Public Press, Teen Vogue

## Why This Matters Now?

- Young people mobilizing right now for Black Lives Matter (ex. Mission High youth led protest, Golden Gate Bridge youth led march)
- Young people creating a movement, not a moment
- Young people are actively calling for defunding of police and accountable policy action. 16 & 17 year olds need a democratic way to participate - voting is one solution
- Young people will be most impacted by the current COVID-19 global pandemic: impacts on school, employment, finances, housing, health, etc.



# Why expand the voting age?

## 16 and 17 year olds deserve to vote locally

- Many civic responsibilities accrue at age 16. Work without limitations on hours, pay taxes, drive cars, and play key roles in their communities.
- As people who use public services and are affected by policy decisions,16-17 year olds are ready to have a say in government decisions.
- Young people are uniquely impacted by the fallout of COVID-19. Setbacks in education will widen the achievement gap, and they have the longest to live with the impacts of a recession. 16- and 17-year-olds deserve a voice on the decisions that will shape the recovery.
- Nationally, 13% of grocery workers (essential during COVID-19) are 16-19.

## 16 is a better age to begin voting than 18

- Voting is a **habit.** 16 is a better time than 18 to establish that habit.
- Age 18 is a year of big transitions for most young people, making it a challenging time to establish new voting habits.
- Those who vote in one election are 25% more likely to vote in the next one. Voting at 16 would make lifelong voters.
- At age 16, young people are embedded in their communities where they know and care about local issues.
- 16 and 17 year olds have the opportunity to have classroom, peer, and family conversations that support informed voting choices.

Dear Ms. Calvillo,

Should the proposed charter amendment be approved by the voters, in my opinion, it would have a minimal impact on the cost of government.

The amendment could be expected to increase the number of registered voters for municipal elections by up to approximately 1.5 percent if 16 and 17 year olds register to vote at the same rate as the general population. The Department of Elections would have some additional costs to produce voter materials. In addition it would have some costs to conduct voter education and outreach efforts for this group of voters. Spread over the four-year election cycle the added expense would represent only a marginal increase in Department of Elections' costs an annual basis.
