7	WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, Mayor London N. Breed declared a local
8	emergency to exist in connection with the spread of the novel coronavirus COVID-19; and
9	WHEREAS, The Mayor transmitted a copy of that Proclamation Declaring the
10	Existence of a Local Emergency to the Board of Supervisors (the "Proclamation"), and on
11	March 3, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the Proclamation and in the actions
12	taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; the Proclamation and the Board's concurring
13	motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200228; and
14	WHEREAS, On March 11, 2020, and March 13, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps
15	to meet the local emergency by issuing the First and Second Supplements to the
16	Proclamation, and on March 24, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions
17	taken by the Mayor in those Supplements; the First and Second Supplements and the Board's
18	concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200294;
19	and
20	WHEREAS, On March 17, 2020, March 18, 2020, and March 23, 2020, the Mayor took
21	additional steps to meet the local emergency by issuing the Third, Fourth, and Fifth
22	Supplements to the Proclamation, and on March 31, 2020, the Board of Supervisors
23	concurred in the actions taken by the Mayor in those Supplements; the Third, Fourth, and
24	Fifth Supplements and the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of
25	Supervisors in File No. 200326; and

1 WHEREAS, On March 27, 2020, and March 31 2020, the Mayor took additional steps 2 to meet the local emergency by issuing the Sixth and Seventh Supplements to the 3 Proclamation and on April 7, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in those Supplements; the Sixth and Seventh Supplements to the Proclamation and the Board's 4 5 concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200352; 6 and 7 WHEREAS, On April 1, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the local 8 emergency by issuing the Eighth Supplement to the Proclamation, and on April 14, 2020, the 9 Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in that Supplement; the Eighth Supplement to the Proclamation and the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk 10 of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200369; and 11 12 WHEREAS, On April 10, 2020, and April 14, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to 13 meet the emergency by issuing the Ninth and Tenth Supplements to the Proclamation, and on 14 April 21, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in those Supplements; 15 the Ninth and Tenth Supplements and the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200384; and 16 17 WHEREAS, On April 23, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the emergency 18 by issuing the Eleventh Supplement to the Proclamation, and on May 5, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in that Supplement; the Eleventh Supplement and 19 20 the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 21 200437; and 22 WHEREAS, On April 30, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the emergency 23 by issuing the Twelfth Supplement to the Proclamation, and on May 12, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in that Supplement; the Twelfth Supplement and 24 25

8 WHEREAS, On May 13, 2020, and May 18, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to 9 meet the emergency by issuing the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Supplements to the 10 Proclamation, and on May 26, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in those Supplements; the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Supplements and the Board's concurring 11 12 motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200553; and 13 WHEREAS, On May 29, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the emergency 14 by issuing the Sixteenth Supplement to the Proclamation, and on June 9, 2020, the Board of 15 Supervisors concurred in the actions taken in that Supplement; the Sixteenth Supplement and the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 16 200600; and 17

WHEREAS, On June 2, 2020, and June 9, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to
meet the emergency by issuing the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Supplements to the
Proclamation, and on June 17, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the actions taken
in those Supplements; the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Supplements and the Board's
concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.200632;
and
WHEREAS, On June 13, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the emergency

3 WHEREAS ON June 19, 2020, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the emergency by issuing the Twentieth Supplement to the Proclamation, ordering two actions to meet the 4 5 emergency; the Twentieth Supplement is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in 6 Board File No. 200690; and

7 WHEREAS, Government Code, Sections 8550 et seq. and Charter, Section 3.100, 8 provide for the concurrence by members of the Board of Supervisors in such emergency 9 declaration and in action taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; now, therefore, be it MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors concurs with the following actions taken by the 10 Mayor to meet the local emergency included in the Mayor's Twentieth Supplement to the 11

12 Proclamation, dated June 19, 2020, as those actions are described in full in the Twentieth 13 Supplement and summarized as follows:

14 Action #1: Modifying Section 2 of the 16th Supplement to the Emergency 15 regarding commission meetings to allow the Mayor to grant a waiver from the remote meeting 16 requirement so that a commission may meet in person to consider a personnel-related item. 17 The commission would still be prohibited from providing a physical meeting place for 18 members of the public to attend.

19 Action #2: Delaying the due date for various annual public right-of-way 20 occupancy assessment fees imposed by Public Works to September 30, 2020.

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#### TWENTIETH SUPPLEMENT TO MAYORAL PROCLAMATION DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY DATED FEBRUARY 25, 2020

**WHEREAS**, California Government Code Sections 8550 et seq., San Francisco Charter Section 3.100(14) and Chapter 7 of the San Francisco Administrative Code empower the Mayor to proclaim the existence of a local emergency, subject to concurrence by the Board of Supervisors as provided in the Charter, in the case of an emergency threatening the lives, property or welfare of the City and County or its citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, On February 25, 2020, the Mayor issued a Proclamation (the "Proclamation") declaring a local emergency to exist in connection with the imminent spread within the City of a novel (new) coronavirus ("COVID-19"); and

**WHEREAS**, On March 3, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the Proclamation and in the actions taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; and

WHEREAS, On March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency to exist within the State due to the threat posed by COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, On March 6, 2020, the Health Officer declared a local health emergency under Section 101080 of the California Health and Safety Code, and the Board of Supervisors concurred in that declaration on March 10, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, On March 16, 2020, the City's Health Officer issued a stay safe at home order, Health Officer Order No. C19-07 (the "Stay Safe At Home Order"), requiring most people to remain in their homes subject to certain exceptions including obtaining essential goods such as food and necessary supplies, and requiring the closure of non-essential businesses; the Health Officer has amended the Stay Safe At Home Order to modify the ongoing restrictions; and

**WHEREAS**, There have been 3,057 confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the City and 47 COVID-19-related deaths in the City; there have been more than 177,000 confirmed cases in California and more than 5,300 COVID-19-related deaths in California; and

**WHEREAS**, This order and the previous orders issued during this emergency have all been issued because of the propensity of the virus to spread person to person and also



because the virus physically is causing property loss or damage due to its proclivity to attach to surfaces for prolonged periods of time; and

**WHEREAS**, In the Sixteenth Supplement to the Emergency Proclamation dated May 29, 2020, the Mayor issued an order placing restrictions on meetings of City policy bodies, including a requirement that all meetings be conducted by telephonic or electronic means. It is necessary to modify that order to allow policy bodies a means to request permission to meet in person to consider personnel matters when necessary; and

**WHEREAS**, Given the economic impacts of the COVID-19 emergency and the required business closures, it is in the public interest to delay the due date for annual assessment fees for various permits issued by the Department of Public Works to provide more time for permit holders to pay such fees; and

### NOW, THEREFORE,

I, London N. Breed, Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco, proclaim that there continues to exist an emergency within the City and County threatening the lives, property or welfare of the City and County and its citizens;

In addition to the measures outlined in the Proclamation and in the Supplements to the Proclamation dated March 11, March 13, March 17, March 18, March 23, March 27, March 31, April 1, April 10, April 14, April 23, April 30, May 11, May 13, May 18, May 29, June 2, June 9, and June 13, 2020, it is further ordered that:

(1) Section 2 of the 16th Supplement to the Emergency Proclamation is revised and replaced as follows:

Public meetings of City commissions, boards, and advisory bodies other than the Board of Supervisors and its committees must comply with the following conditions for all public meetings:

a. The meetings must occur by teleconference or other electronic means without providing a physical meeting place, and the commission, board, or advisory body must comply with all applicable law governing public meetings during the emergency, including allowing public observation and participation;



b. The commission, board, or advisory body must prioritize any urgent action items necessary for public health, safety, and essential government function; and

c. Before scheduling a meeting, a policy body that is not established in the Charter must confer with the department that provides administrative and clerical support to the body, to ensure that the meeting will not unreasonably require the time of staff who are otherwise deployed or participating in the City's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Upon request from the policy body chairperson, the Mayor may waive the requirement in subsection (a) and allow members of a policy body to convene at a physical location for the sole purpose of discussing and/or taking action on an item concerning a personnel matter. However, the policy body shall not provide a physical location for members of the public to attend and shall comply with all applicable requirements concerning public observation and participation. The policy body members and other participants shall follow all applicable health directives.

This Order shall remain in place until July 31, 2020, unless terminated earlier by the Mayor or unless the Governor rescinds his executive order authorizing public meetings to occur by electronic means without providing a physical meeting place under state law.

(2) Notwithstanding any City law, the deadline to pay annual public right-of-way occupancy assessment fees in Sec 2.1.1 of the Public Works Code for Major Encroachment, Minor Encroachment, Overwide Driveway, Street Improvement and Vault Permits is extended from July 1, 2020 to September 30, 2020.
