12	rights, civil liberties, and human rights, and recognizes that human trafficking violates those

14	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Collaborative Against Human Trafficking (SFCAHT),
15 16	with over 20 partners including government and law enforcement agencies, service providers,
17	educators, and community members, endeavors to end human trafficking through
18	collaboration, education, outreach, advocacy; and,

20	Day, SFCAHT will hold a press conference at City Hall to launch a month-long awareness
21	campaign with expert panel discussions, film screenings, and other events, concluding on
