1	[Pier 45 Fire - Declaration of Emergency and Authorization for Emergency Contracts]
2	
3	Resolution declaring an emergency under Administrative Code, Section 6.60, and
4	Administrative Code, Chapter 21, relating to the May 23, 2020, fire at Pier 45; approving
5	emergency contracts entered into by the Port of San Francisco in accordance with
6	Administrative Code, Section 6.60, and Administrative Code, Chapter 21; and directing
7	the Port of San Francisco to take all necessary and appropriate measures to perform
8	repair work to Pier 45 in the most expeditious manner.
9	
10	WHEREAS, Pier 45 is within the San Francisco Embarcadero Historic District, which is
11	listed in the National Register of Historic Places; and
12	WHEREAS, On May 23, 2020, a 4-alarm fire severely damaged Pier 45, including
13	Shed C which was completely destroyed; and
14	WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Chapter 6, Article IV, Section 6.60, authorizes
15	department heads responsible for public work to award an emergency contract, exempt from
16	the competitive bidding process, in the event of an actual emergency in accordance with the
17	procedures set forth in Section 6.60; and
18	WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Chapter 21, Section 21.15(c), authorizes department
19	heads responsible for the operations for which commodities or services are needed to enter
20	into a contract in order to respond to the emergency in accordance with the procedures set
21	forth in Section 21.15; and
22	WHEREAS, On June 3, 2020, the Acting Executive Director of the Port ("Executive
23	Director") declared an emergency at the Port as a result of the Pier 45 fire, which declaration
24	was concurred and approved by the President of the Port Commission ("Declaration of
25	Emergency"); and

1	WHEREAS, The Declaration of Emergency enables the Port to engage consultants
2	and contractors to inspect Pier 45, perform cleanup and restoration, demolish damaged and
3	unsafe structures on the site, dispose of demolition debris, develop design recommendations
4	and plans for repairs, complete such repairs, and perform associated environmental
5	monitoring and protection, the cost of which will exceed \$250,000 and was authorized by the
6	President of the Port Commission (collectively, the "Initial Emergency Work"); and
7	WHEREAS, The Port learned after the June 3rd Declaration of Emergency that the
8	emergency also requires the procurement of commodities and services pursuant to Chapter
9	21 of the Administrative Code, specifically, the services of a forensic accountant to assist with
10	its insurance claim, the cost of which will exceed \$100,000 (together with the Initial
11	Emergency Work, the "Emergency Work"); and
12	WHEREAS, On June 10, 2020, the Declaration of Emergency was updated by the
13	Executive Director so that the Declaration of Emergency is authorized under both Section
14	21.15 and Section 6.60 of the Administrative Code, which updated Declaration of Emergency
15	was concurred and approved by the President of the Port Commission on June 24, 2020; and
16	WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Section 6.60(D), requires that the San Francisco
17	Board of Supervisors approve emergency work with an estimated cost in excess of \$250,000;
18	and
19	WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Section 21.15, requires that the San Francisco Board
20	of Supervisors approve emergency contracts in excess of \$100,000; and
21	WHEREAS, The Port has requested that the Board of Supervisors declare an
22	emergency under Administrative Code, Sections 6.60(A), and 21.15(c), with respect to the
23	Pier 45 fire to allow the Pier 45 Emergency Work to be accomplished in an expeditious
24	manner to protect the public safety, health, welfare and property of the citizens of San

Francisco; now, therefore, be it

1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby declares an actual emergency
2	under Administrative Code, Section 6.60(A), and Section 21.15, with respect to the Pier 45
3	fire; and, be it
4	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby finds that performing
5	the Emergency Work as expeditiously as possible are in the best interests of the City to
6	protect the public safety, health, welfare and property of the citizens of San Francisco; and, be
7	it
8	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the contracts
9	entered into by the Port to perform the Emergency Work and directs the Port Executive
10	Director to take all actions necessary to perform the Emergency Work as expeditiously as
11	possible, including, but not limited to, entering into further contracts relating to the design,
12	historical preservation, hazardous materials abatement, engineering and construction of the
13	Pier 45 stabilization, repair and restoration work; and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That any action to date taken by the Port to secure such
15	emergency contracts and resolve the emergency is hereby ratified.

**SUBJECT:** Revised Declaration of Emergency; Repair of Pier 45

Dear Mayor Breed, Members of the Board, Commission President Brandon, Port Commissioners, and Mr. Rosenfield:

In my letter to you dated June 3, 2020, I declared an emergency due to the May 23, 2020 fire that burned portions of Pier 45 at Fisherman's Warf. Commissioner Brandon subsequently provided her written concurrence and approval.

The June 3 letter declared an emergency pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 6.60 of the Administrative Code of the City and County of San Francisco, which pertains to emergency contracting for public works. Port staff has now learned that the emergency also requires the procurement of commodities and services pursuant to Chapter 21 of the Administrative Code. Specifically, the City is seeking to engage the services of a forensic accountant to assist with its insurance claim. Staff estimates that the cost of this work will exceed \$100,000.

I am therefore updating the June 3, 2020 declaration of emergency so that it is authorized under both Section 21.15 and Section 6.60 of the Administrative Code.

I respectfully request that Commission President Brandon approve this revised declaration.

Dear Mayor Breed, Members of the Board, Commission President Brandon, Port Commissioners, and Mr. Rosenfield:

In accordance with Chapter 6, Section 6.60 of the Administrative Code of the City and County of San Francisco, I am declaring an emergency on behalf of the Port of San Francisco ("Port").

Early on Saturday, May 23, a four-alarm fire burned portions of Pier 45 at Fisherman's Warf, destroying Shed C, one of the buildings on the site. Immediate action is necessary to safeguard the property of the citizens and the Port, and to maintain public health and welfare.

This emergency declaration is to enable the Port to continue engaging consultants and contractors to inspect the Pier, perform cleanup and restoration, demolish damaged and unsafe structures on the site, dispose of demolition debris, develop design recommendations and plans for repairs, complete such repairs, and perform associated environmental monitoring and protection. This work is beyond the capabilities of City forces. The estimated cost for the work is unknown at the time, but will exceed \$250,000.

I am therefore declaring the existence of an emergency. Because the estimated cost of the emergency work will exceed \$250,000, I request that Commission President Brandon approve this declaration, pursuant to Section 6.60(d) of the Administrative Code.
