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Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Pursuant to Charter Section 6.102(5), the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the City Attorney to settle in part, and only as to plaintiffs Joy Caquimbaga and Zenida C. Restauro, the action entitled David Alfaro, et al. v. City and County of San Francisco, San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-15-547492 by the payment of \$240,000 to plaintiffs Joy Caquimbaga and Zenida C. Restauro. The lawsuit involves inverse condemnation arising out of flooding damage during major rainstorms in December of 2014.

Section 2. The above-named action was filed in San Francisco Superior Court on August 20, 2015. This is an action brought by owners or occupants of several dozen properties located in San Francisco against defendant City and County of San Francisco.

Section 3. This is a partial settlement of the action. It resolves the diminution of real property value claims of plaintiffs Joy Caguimbaga and Zenida C. Restauro. The parties have previously, separately settled the personal and real property damage claims of plaintiffs Joy
