Despite plans for distance learning in the Fall, parents, children, and educators in San Francisco have been given little direction on what the school day will look like and what will be required of them to ensure a successful Fall semester for their children.

Many families who have the financial means are independently arranging individual learning pods for their children. These pods are taking various shapes and formats but have no formal guidance from the School District, City, or Health Department on their structure, health precautions, or other considerations to make these pods successful.

Many families without space or means to hire a caretaker for their children are dealing with the constant stress and anticipation of being forced to leave their children at home if they must work without any adult supervision over their learning or safety.

Most families in San Francisco, regardless of income level or living circumstances, believe that distance learning in the Spring was unsuccessful. Most adults in San Francisco must work full-time to survive and do not have the training, time, or wherewithal to adequately supervise distance learning. Many families do not have reliable internet connection or technological devices to ensure equitable access to distance learning opportunities.

I am calling a hearing to discuss how the City can assist the School District and teachers, parents, and children to start the school year successfully while engaging in distance learning.

I am directing the Clerk of the Board to invite the School District, the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and their Families (DCYF), the Health Officer, School Board members, and the United Educators of San Francisco to attend.
