


Every year of a child's life is precious; the first 5 years offer the greatest opportunity to prepare children to reach their fullest potential.

## Key Areas of Change and Growth

- Total budget only decreased by \$138,709 between FY20 and FY21
- Direct Services/Programs
  - > Decrease in state grant funding for Quality Rating and Improvement System
  - Shift of funds from Administrative/Operations and Systems of Change to services provided by CBOs
  - Increase funds for Family Strengthening and Early Identification and Intervention Initiative in order to respond to racial equity imperatives
- Staffing
  - No new FTEs
  - Slight savings from delay in backfilling positions
