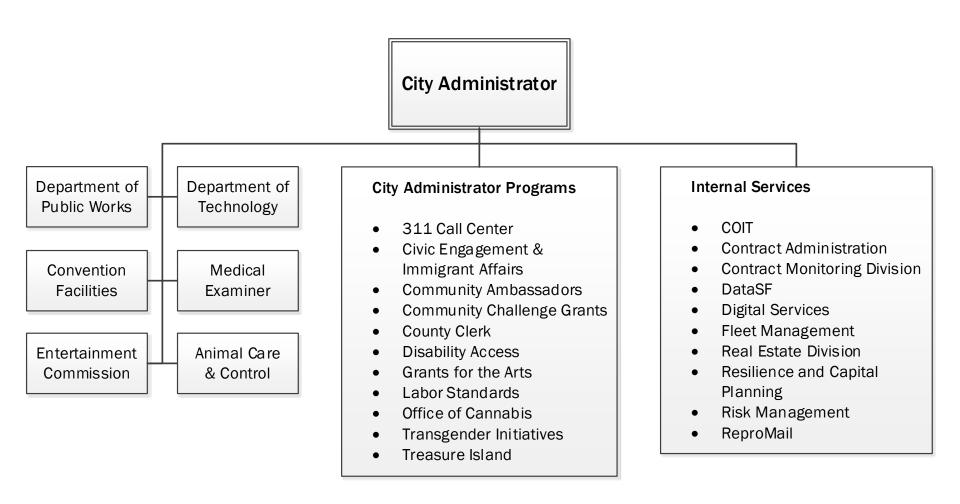

COVID-19 Response Roles

- House the COVID Command Center (CCC) and a temporary homeless shelter at the Moscone Convention Center
- Lead the CCC Logistics Section to procure and manage personal protective equipment (PPE) inventory, coordinate donations, and manage facilities
- Lead dashboard and report development for COVID reporting through DataSF
- Coordinate the City's reopening plan for government services
- Coordinate Community Education and Response Teams (CERT) to improve Shelter in Place compliance
- Reduce need for resident mobility by moving services online through the Digital Services Team



COVID-19 Response Roles

- Staff shelter-in-place hotels through the Community Ambassadors Program
- Ensure vulnerable populations continue to have access to critical services through the consultation of the Mayor's Office on Disability
- Respond to information requests (testing, services, housing, etc.) through 311
- Perform extra cleaning through the Real Estate Division's Custodial Services
- Staff and support the Economic Recovery Task Force to support private sector businesses



Equity and Support for Vulnerable Populations

Approximately 29% of City Administrator's budget supports a broad array of services for vulnerable populations, including:

- Ensuring access to City services and public facilities through the Mayor's
 Office on Disability
- Developing transgender policy and training programs through the Office of Transgender Initiatives
- Helping minority and women owned, and other small businesses through the Local Business Enterprise and Surety Bond Programs, and Equal Benefits through the Contract Monitoring Division
- 4. Providing immigrant and language services through the Office of Civic Engagement and Immigrant Affairs
- 5. Promoting neighborhood safety and community engagement through the Community Ambassadors Program
- 6. Issuing equity permits and grants to support business development through the Office of Cannabis



Equity and Support for Vulnerable Populations

- 7. Enforcing worker protections through the Office of Labor Standards for local ordinances such as Health Care Security, Minimum Compensation, Fair Chance, Paid Family Leave, and Formula Retail
- 8. Beautifying neighborhoods through the Community Challenge Grants Program
- 9. Promoting the exit of the Hall of Justice
- 10. Providing animal care and sheltering
- 11. Responding to information requests and providing referrals to services through the 311 Call Center
- 12. Supporting public health through Medical Examiner services
- 13. Awarding grants to diverse, local artists and performing arts organizations through Grants for the Arts
- 14. Giving voice to communities through Citizen's Advisory Committees

Budget Reductions

\$58M net expenditure authority reduction from FY20 to FY21

Significant Changes include:

- Increased attrition \$5.5M (39.2 FTE)
- Decreased non-personnel services \$19.2M
- Decreased materials and supplies \$2.1M
- Decreased grants budget \$5.5M
- Decreased Moscone Center facilities maintenance \$2M
