

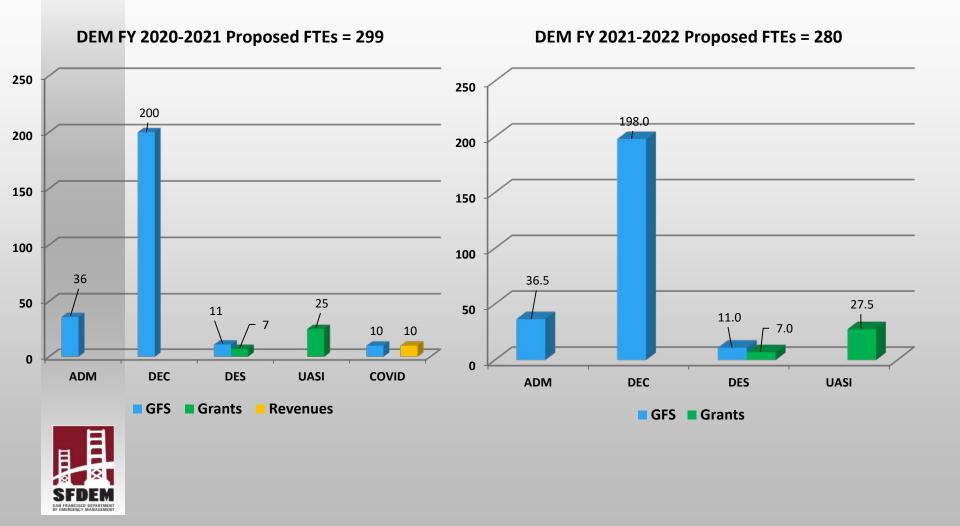
New Positions Budgeted for FY 2020-21



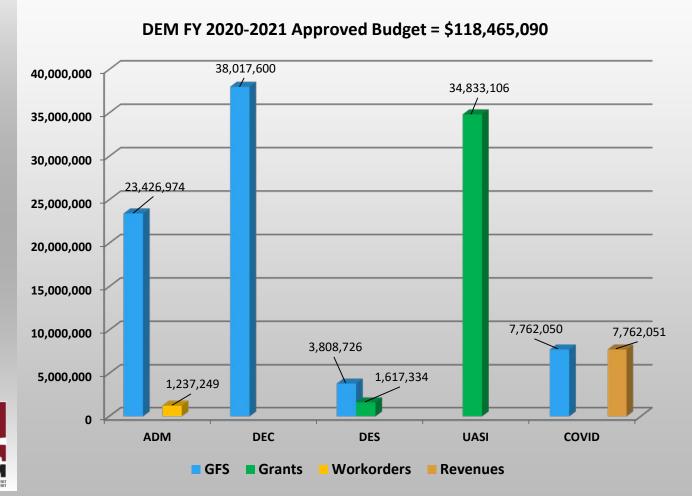
The 20 FTEs for COVID are for As-Needed, Temporary Employees

DEM's FY 2020-2022 Budget Proposal POSITIONS BY FUNDING SOURCES

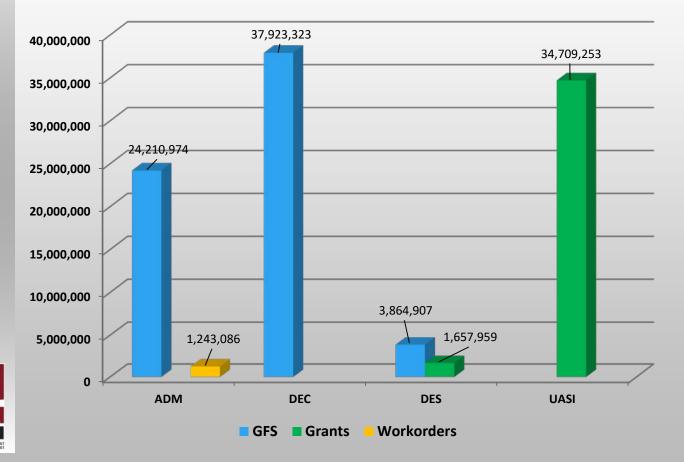


FUNDING SOURCES BY DIVISION

REDUCTION STRATEGIES

Salary Budget & Positions

- No layoffs were proposed
- Cancelled all planned POST Academies
- Reviewed all vacancies
 - Deleted 2 MEA Manager Positions
 - Holding 2 MEA Manager Positions for savings

Non-Salary Items

- Reduced travel/training budget by 45%. Only requested funding to maintain Continuing Ed Reqs
- Eliminated & Reduced Professional Services Contracts
 - Aligned cuts to cancelled POST academies
 - Decreased contracts tied to emergency planning
- Reduced IT equipment replacement by 25%
- Reduced materials & supplies budget by 25%



ENSURING EQUAL ACCESS TO 9-1-1SERVICES



- More than 1.4 Million Emergency and Non-Emergency Calls
- 1.4% Calls Require Interpretation Services
- 59 Languages Translated in 2019

- 168 Public Safety Communications Dispatchers
- 20% Certified Bilingual
- 24/7 Access Language Translation/ Interpretation Services provided by State of California

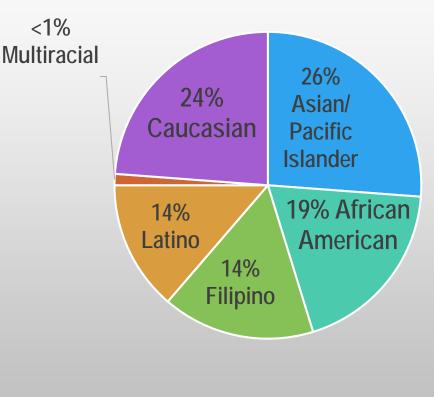
RACIAL EQUITY WITHIN DEM
