

## RE: Letter of Public Convenience \& Necessity - 2190 Union St. San Francisco, CA 94123

To whom it may concern,
Luke's Local Inc., in preparation for opening our second full-service grocery store within San Francisco at 2190 Union St., has requested a TYPE 20 Off-Sale Beer and Wine License. We are applying for a transfer of an existing license. Our application was submitted with the SF ABC office on $8 / 26 / 20$. We notified neighbors and surrounding business by sending out the required ABC mailers on $9 / 3 / 2020$ and posted required signage at the premises on $9 / 3 / 2020$, which will remain up for the 30-day posting period. Our proposed business hours at 2190 Union will be 8 am - $9 \mathrm{pm}, 7$ days/wk.

Luke's Local is a full-service grocery store with our first neighborhood market in Cole Valley having been established in December of 2016. We offer a wide selection of affordable foods and grocery products, ready-made meals from our commissary kitchen, a full-service butcher and deli counter, and a delivery service. Since the opening of our first neighborhood market we have become a hub for our community and a much-loved grocer within the Cole Valley neighborhood. We hope to do the same within the Cow Hollow neighborhood with the opening of our second location this November at 2190 Union St.

We currently offer a well curated selection of Wine, Beer, and Spirits at Cole St. and hope to continue this offering at Union St., limited to Wine and Beer. We are a family friendly business and encourage responsible behavior from our customers as well as staff. Our staff are trained to follow all applicable laws and guidelines regarding the sale and non-consumption of alcohol products in or around the store. In our nearly 4 years in business at Cole we have been a responsible retailer with no incident related to the sale of alcohol. If granted, we expect approximately $10 \%$ of revenue to come from Alcohol sales with the remaining $90 \%$ coming from food products and household goods.

We pride ourselves in offering both specialty as well as common grocery products and being a one-stop shop for our customer's weekly grocery trips. We believe the convenience of being able to pick up your favorite bottle of wine along with a fresh baguette and prime cut of meat from our butcher counter is vital to offering great service to our community. We recognize the high density of liquor licenses in the San Francisco area, but believe if approved for this license, we
would act as a net positive within this community by providing a reliable, affordable grocery which is notably missing from the surrounding area.

We also seek to be a great neighbor within the community to both our business neighbors as well as adjacent residential neighbors. Our feedback from both businesses on the street as well as residential customers has been wonderful so far; everyone seems very excited to have a small business grocer coming in. We have also spoken to the convenience store directly next door to 2190 and they expressed excitement with "it's going to really revitalize this block and bring more business to all the existing retailers". We agree with this sentiment and believe the business we will bring to the block, as well as the jobs we will create within the community, can really revitalize an area that has been hit hard by the current economic environment.
