On Tuesday, Sept 15th the Board of Supervisors will discuss and vote to approve a salary increase for all city employees, that will cost the city \$250 million. With 175,000 individuals filing for unemployment since March, a city budget deficit of \$1.5 billion, small businesses closing, many residents leaving and large companies relocating, one can only wonder why city employees should receive an increase of salary.

The BOS budget includes millions in raises for city employees and not a single dollar in the budget for small business relief. Sounds like officials are looking out for themselves and have forgotten "the people."

Notably, some of those most deserving of a raise, our first responders, the fire and police departments should be praised as they have agreed to defer raises - so the \$250M doesn't even include them. The BOS budget committee, led by Sandra Fewer, cut fire and police overtime and police academy classes, ensuring that police numbers will dwindle, impacting the safety of our community.

Our understanding is the Board of Supervisors will approve this increase unless they hear from citizens objecting to increased spending when so many are losing their jobs and taking paycuts.

More concerning, the BOS will dip into SF reserves to do so (and then tax us to refill). Lowering reserves is irresponsible and will result in a lowering of our credit rating, causing increased costs across the board as it becomes more expensive for the city to borrow money. SOAR-D1 does not agree with this salary increase at this time. Your voice is extremely important and we need your help to oppose it.

At a time when millions are out of work, I myself have survived several layoffs at my company and took a 15% paycut, this is absurd. Please consider voting no on this.

I strongly oppose the salary increase for city employees for the following reasons:

- This increase will cost \$250 million
- With 175,000 individuals filing for unemployment since March, a city budget deficit of \$1.5 billion, small businesses closing, many residents leaving and large companies relocating, it is clear that increases should not be occurring
- No city employees have been laid off as a result of the pandemic and the city is the second largest employer in San Francisco. Those employees kept their jobs and kept getting paid, unlike the 175,000 that were let go and filing for unemployment
- It is my understanding that the city plans on using the "Emergency Funds" to pay for the salary increase. If this is correct, this is another reason why I strongly oppose the increase and a clear misuse of funds.

As well as what is mentioned above, some other statistics have come to light which make it even more frustrating that you are considering providing increases for City employees.

- On average, the city's employees received pay and perks costing taxpayers \$131,335 a piece.
- 18,749 city workers received a compensation package exceeding \$150,000 per year.
- 4,418 employees of the city's law enforcement agencies cost taxpayers \$831 million in compensation last year for an average cost of over \$188,000 per person and you actually aren't even allowing the police officers to do their job, working to have citizens uphold the law. You don't provide the police the ability to arrest anyone with any consequences, you care more about the criminals than you do the taxpaying citizens of San Francisco, allow home break-ins, car break-ins, and harassment of citizens by criminals.
- **Public Works** Cases of human waste on San Francisco streets <u>spiked</u> to 31,000 in 2019 an all-time high. The agency in charge of cleaning up the mess has a quarter-billion-dollar budget (\$224 million). Public works employs a staff of 1,790, including truck drivers (\$218,495), arborists (\$206,107), and general laborers (\$188,975). Team members on the self-styled "poop patrol" cost us, the taxpayers up to \$184,000 each.
- 31 staffers in Mayor Breeds office have total comp exceeding \$200,000

annually and Mayor Breed is the highest paid Mayor in the country.

During this time of the pandemic when so many others are suffering and lost their jobs, we have a huge budget deficit already and we are seeing a consistent decline of the quality of life in our city with significant mismanagement of funds and resources, this is not the time to provide pay increases to the city employees. I strongly oppose.
