13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

15	Section 1. Article XXII of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
16	revising Sections 5.22-1 and 5.22-4, to read as follows:

18	SEC. 5.22-1. CREATION OF TASK FORCE.
19	The Board of Supervisors hereby establishes the Street-Level Drug
20	Dealing Distribution Task Force (the "Task Force") of the City and County of San Francisco.
21	
22	SEC. 5.22-4. POWERS AND DUTIES.
23	* * * *
24	(b) Beginning March August 31, 2020 and every three months thereafter, the Task
25	Force shall submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a report summarizing data

1	regarding harms related to street-level drug dealing in the Tenderloin, Civic Center, Mid-Market, and
2	South of Market neighborhoods, and making recommendations regarding policies, funding levels and
3	sources, enforcement strategies, and other pertinent matters, with the goal of addressing harms related
4	to street-level drug dealing in those neighborhoodsthe progress of the Task Force and its plans for the
5	next three-month period.
6	* * * *
7	
8	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
9	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
10	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
11	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
12	
13	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
14	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
15	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
16	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
17	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
18	the official title of the ordinance.
