

### **RESOLUTION NO.**

[Donation of Retired Ambulance to City College of San Francisco]

Resolution authorizing the Fire Department to donate a retired ambulance to the City College of San Francisco's Emergency Medical Services Academy.

WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco is a leading educational institution for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Program and teaches those who wish to be future Emergency Medical Technicians or Paramedics; and

WHEREAS, A large part of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) training focuses on manipulative skills, and the best way to learn those skills is to practice on genuine equipment; and

WHEREAS, EMS equipment is expensive and difficult to obtain; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle 145-755, a 2003 Ford E-450 Ambulance (the "Ambulance"), has been retired from service by the San Francisco Fire Department (the "Department") even as a relief piece and has been identified for the purposes of this donation; and

WHEREAS, The Department has determined that the Ambulance is surplus to the needs of the Department, and is appropriate for donation for educational purposes to the EMS Academy at City College; and

WHEREAS, The Ambulance would serve as a teaching tool for patient assessment, loading and treatment and City College would benefit from an actual ambulance on which to train its students; and

WHEREAS, On October 9, 2019, the Fire Commission adopted Resolution No. 2019-06, recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the donation of the Ambulance to City College; and

Fire Department BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, The Fire Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. <u>191139</u>, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 21 of the Administrative Code allows for commodities that have been declared as surplus to be disposed of in a manner that will best serve the interests of the City, including the City's interest in maximizing the re-use of surplus commodities by public entities, non-profit organizations and schools; and

WHEREAS, City College's EMS Academy at its John Adams campus is a program designed to assist students in health sciences as well as expose EMS training and career opportunities to students; and

WHEREAS, The Ambulance would be used by City College's EMS Academy for instructional purposes only, and will not be operated, driven or used for actual patient care; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department is authorized to donate the Ambulance to City College's EMS Academy.
