

## SIP Rehousing: Commitments and Resources

#### Commitments

- Exits to stability, not street
- 100% of SIP guests participate in Problem Solving Screening
- Coordinated Entry is the pathway to equity
- The SIP hotels have been an effective but expensive temporary solution which has successfully saved lives for COVID vulnerable individuals

#### Resources

- Approved HSH FY20-22 Budget
- Pending additional funding from FEMA, State, Federal and other local measures
- Funds Appropriated but Pending Spending Plan - Our City Our Home (Prop C): Voter supported tax

## Emergency Response: Prop C Funding

#### Rehousing for SIP Hotels

- Immediate Expansion of Housing Resources
  - Acquire and lease new units of Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)
  - Expand and sustain Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool
  - Launch Rapid Rehousing for Adults to offer 12 month and 24-month subsidies
- Expand Problem Solving and Prevention
- Wind down SIP Hotels
  - Wind down SIP Hotels through the four-phased rehousing process in FY20-21

## Expanded Capacity for Shelter System (separate from SIP Rehousing)

- Maintain and Expand Sheltering Capacity
  - Maintain RV site, Safe Sleep and 200bed emergency shelter through end of FY2020-21 and continue RV site and limited Safe Sleep sites
  - Continue shelter expansion projects (Bayview and TAY Navigation Centers)

- November 10, 2020: SIP Rehousing Hearing at Committee of the Whole
- November 2020: Presenting proposed spending plan to OCOH
  Committee
- December 2020: Present proposed spending plan to Budget and Finance Committee
- December January: Stakeholder feedback process
