14	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

16	Section 1. Chapters 5 and 107A of the Administrative Code are hereby amended by		
17	revising Sections 5.30-2, 5.30-5, 5.30-6, and 107A.2, to read as follows:		
18			
19	SEC. 5.30-2. MEMBERSHIP.		
20	The Committee shall consist of 15 seven voting members, nominated by the Supervisor		
21	for District 10 and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members of the Committee shall		
22	reside within the boundaries of the African American Arts and Cultural District (the "District"),		
23	as described in Section 107.3 of this Code, and shall have the following additional		
24	qualifications:		
25	(a) Seat 1 shall be held by an owner of a business located in the District.		

1	(b) Seat 2 shall be held by a performing artist.
2	(eb) Seat 23 shall be held by an employee of a nonprofit organization $that advocates for$
3	housing-located in the District.
4	(\underline{dc}) Seat $\underline{34}$ shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding the
5	history or culture of the District.
6	(e) Seat 5 shall be held by a faith-based leader of a church located in the District.
7	(fd) Seat 46 shall be held by a youth between ages of 14 to 48 24, inclusive, at the time
8	of appointment.
9	(ge) No additional requirements shall apply to the individuals holding Seats 5, 6, and 7. 7
10	shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding the workforce in the District.
11	(h) Seat 8 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding communication or
12	journalism.
13	(i) Seat 9 shall be held by a retired senior.
14	(j) Seat 10 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding community
15	activation or event planning.
16	(k) Seat 11 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding digital or social
17	media.
18	(1) Seat 12 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding community
19	engagement.
20	(m) Seat 13 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding African American
21	health.
22	(n) Seat 14 shall be held by a director of a nonprofit arts organization located in the District.
23	(o) Seat 15 shall be held by a board member of a neighborhood association located in the
24	District.

SEC. 5.30-5. MEETINGS AND PROCEDURES.

(a) The Committee shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than <u>30 60</u> days after the Board has appointed at least four members to the Committee. There shall be at least ten days' public notice of the inaugural meeting. Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not less than <u>once every three months four times a year</u> until the sunset date set forth in Section 5.30-6.

* * * *

SEC. 5.30-6. SUNSET.

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article XXX shall expire by operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, *on January 31*, 2023 one year after the effective date of the ordinance in Board File No. 181080 enacting this Article.

After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article XXX to be removed from the Administrative Code.

SEC. 107A.2. REQUIRED REPORTS.

(a) Department Reports to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community

Development. By no later than July 31, 2019 July 1, 2021, the departments listed in this subsection (a) shall submit to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development reports containing an assessment of relevant assets and needs in the District, recommendations on programs, policies, and funding sources that could benefit the District, and other recommendations that could serve the District to advance the goals of this Chapter 107A. Each department shall seek the input of the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee established in Chapter 5, Article XXX of the Administrative Code, during that committee's existence, as well as residents, businesses, and organizations

- in the District, when compiling the information relevant for the reports and when deciding on recommendations.
 - (1) The Historic Preservation Commission's report shall describe and evaluate historic resources in the District and make recommendations regarding how the City may preserve those resources.
 - (2) The Office of Economic and Workforce Development's report shall (A) describe existing businesses and nonprofit organizations that contribute to the culture of the District, and make recommendations regarding how the City may serve those businesses and organizations; and (B) describe tourist activity in the District, and make recommendations regarding how the City can sustain and increase that activity.
 - (3) The Arts Commission's report shall describe the artistic and cultural assets in the District, including fine arts, performing arts, and regular cultural events like festivals, and make recommendations about how the City may preserve and support those assets.
 - (4) The Department of Public Works' report shall (A) describe potential improvements to public amenities and infrastructure in the District that could better reflect the culture of the District; and (B) evaluate available opportunities for adding to the public amenities and infrastructure that reflect and enhance the culture of the District, and make recommendations for potential funding sources to support those additions.
 - (5) The Planning Department's report shall make recommendations regarding potential amendments to the Planning Code that could contribute to the preservation of the character of the District.
 - (6) The Human Rights Commission's report shall evaluate and describe the cultural competency of City services in the District, and propose policy changes to address deficits in those areas.

(b) **Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report.** By no later than <u>December 31, 2021 July 31, 2020</u>, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development shall prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report ("CHHESS Report") for the District.

The CHHESS Report shall include a demographic and economic profile of the District, including past, current, and future trends; analyze and record the tangible and intangible elements of the District's cultural heritage; identify areas of concern that could inhibit the preservation of the District's unique culture; and propose legislative, economic, and other solutions and strategies to support the District. The CHHESS Report shall discuss or incorporate the findings and recommendations of departments in the reports required by subsection (a) of this Section 107A.2. In preparing the CHHESS Report, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development shall solicit recommendations and feedback from the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee, and spearhead a community engagement process with residents, businesses, and workers in the District, in order to develop the strategies and plans that will preserve and enhance the culture of the District.

- (c) **Timeline Extensions.** The Board of Supervisors may extend any of the deadlines in subsections (a) or (b) of this Section 107A.2 by resolution. Prior to requesting that the Board extend a deadline, any department requesting such an extension shall notify the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee in writing.
- (d) **Board of Supervisors Consideration.** Following receipt of the CHHESS Report from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Board of Supervisors may take any action that the Board deems appropriate, including, by resolution, approving the report, modifying the report, rejecting the report, or requesting additional information or

1	analysis from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development or any other City
2	department or agency.
3	(e) Progress Reports. The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development
4	shall provide a progress report on the strategies outlined in the CHHESS Report at least once
5	every three years following the Board of Supervisors' enactment of a resolution approving or
6	modifying the CHHESS Report.
7	
8	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
9	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
10	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
11	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
12	
13	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
14	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
15	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
16	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
17	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
18	the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - African American Arts and Cultural District]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to modify the number and qualifications of members of the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee; to extend the sunset date of the Committee to January 2023; and to extend to July 2021 the deadlines for the written reports and recommendations from City departments describing the cultural attributes of the District and proposing strategies to acknowledge and preserve the cultural legacy of the District.

Existing Law

In 2018, the Board of Supervisors establishes the African American Arts and Cultural District in the Bayview Hunters Point neighborhood. Under that ordinance, several City departments must prepare and submit reports to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) by July 2019. The reports will assess the assets and needs in the District, and will recommend programs, policies, and funding sources that could benefit the District and preserve its cultural legacy. After these reports are complete, MOHCD will prepare a Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report (CHHESS Report). The CHHESS Report will include a demographic and economic profile of the District, including past, current, and future trends; analyze and record the District's cultural heritage; identify areas of concern that could inhibit the preservation of the District's unique culture; and propose legislative, economic, and other solutions and strategies to support the District. By October 8, 2019, MOHCD will submit the report to the Board of Supervisors for the Board's consideration and possible approval. MOHCD will prepare additional progress reports every three years thereafter.

The 2018 ordinance also established the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and MOHCD regarding strategies to support and preserve the culture and heritage of the African American Arts and Cultural District. The Advisory Committee is a 15-member body with members nominated by the District 10 Supervisor and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Advisory Committee was set to sunset in January 2020.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would change the size of the Advisory Committee so it will have 7 members instead of 15. The Advisory Committee would include an owner of a business located in the District, an employee of a nonprofit organization in the District, a person with knowledge or expertise regarding the history or culture of the District, a youth between ages of 14 to 24, and three other at-large members.

The proposed ordinance would extend the sunset date of the Advisory Committee to January 2023.

The proposed ordinance also would change the deadline for departments to submit reports to MOHCD to July 2021, and would extend the deadline for MOHCD to submit the initial CHHESS Report to December 2021.

Subject: Revisions to the African American Arts and Cultural District Community

Advisory Committee (File No. 201189)

Board of Supervisors Rules of Order 2.21 establishes certain criteria that must be included in legislation creating and establishing, or reauthorizing, new bodies (boards/commissions/task forces/advisory bodies) and requires the Clerk of the Board to advise the Board on certain matters. In order to fulfill these requirements, the following is provided:

File No. 201189 Administrative Code – African American Arts and Cultural District

Does a current body address the same or similar subject matter?

No. There is no other body charged with addressing the same subject matter.

Language requiring the body to meet at least once every four months

Yes. Page 3, Lines 4-6, Sections 5.30-5 entitled "Meeting and Procedures" states "Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not less than four times a year until the sunset date set forth in Section 5.30-6.".

Language indicating members serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority

Yes. Section 5.30-3(a) states that "Members of the Committee shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors and may be removed by the Board at any time."



Language establishing attendance requirements

Yes. Section 5.30-3(c) states that "Any member who misses three regular meetings of the Committee within a six-month period without the express approval of the Committee at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee ten days after the third unapproved absence."

Number of seats and qualifications

The Ordinance proposes to amend the current membership to reduce the membership from 15 members down to 7, as follows:

Members shall be nominated by the Supervisor for District 10 and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members of the Committee shall reside within the boundaries of the African American Arts and Cultural District (the "District"), and shall have the following additional qualifications:

Seat 1 shall be held by an owner of a business located in the District.

Seat 2 shall be held by an employee of a nonprofit organization located in the District. Seat 3 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding the history or culture of the District.

Seat 4 shall be held by a youth between ages of 14 to 24, inclusive, at the time of appointment.

Seats 5, 6 and 7 shall have no additional requirements - qualifications to state that any positions on the Commission, not allocated to specific types of members, may be filled by persons with experience and knowledge of the mental health system representing the public interest, which may include, but need not be limited to, people who engage with individuals living with mental illness in the course of daily operations, such as representatives of county offices of education, large and small businesses, hospitals, hospital districts, physicians practicing in emergency departments, city police chiefs, county sheriffs, and community and nonprofit service providers.

Term limits (i.e., commencement date? staggered terms?)

Yes. Section 5.30-3(a) states that "Each member may remain on the Committee until the termination of the Committee under Section 5.30-6, unless removed by the Board."



Administering department

Yes. Section 5.30-3 states "The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development shall provide administrative support for the Committee."

Reporting requirements

The Advisory Committee was established to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development regarding strategies to support and preserve the unique culture and heritage of the African American Arts and Cultural District, and provide input to all City agencies in the preparation of reports required under Administrative Code, Section 107A.2. These department reports shall contain assessments of relevant assets and needs in the District, recommendations on programs, policies, and funding sources that could benefit the District, and other recommendations that could serve the District to advance the goals of Administrative Code, Chapter 107A. The Committee shall also advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development regarding any potential need to re-examine the boundaries of the African American Arts and Cultural District.

Sunset date

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article XXX shall expire by operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, on January 31, 2023. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article XXX to be removed from the Administrative Code.
