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REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

(Amended in Committee, 12/7/2020)

[Administrative Code - Housing Needs Assessment and Production Pipeline Reports - Seniors and People with Disabilities]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to direct the Department of Disability and Aging Services to report on housing needs and housing production for seniors and people with disabilities, with input from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development and other departments.

Existing Law

Administrative Code Section 10E.4(b) directs the Planning Department to publish an Annual Housing Inventory Report, but does not direct the Planning Department to analyze housing needs and production for seniors and people with disabilities.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance (adding Administrative Code Chapter 111) directs the Department of Disability and Aging Services (DAAS) to publish a Housing Needs Overview for Seniors and People with Disabilities by October 1, 2021, and two out of every three years thereafter. DAAS would not be required to publish a Housing Needs Overview in 2022 or every third year thereafter. The overview report will contain an analysis of income of seniors and of people with disabilities in the City to rents charged at City-funded affordable housing.

The ordinance additionally directs DAAS, in collaboration with the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD), the Planning Department, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, and the Mayor's Office of Disability, to publish a Housing Needs Assessment and Production Pipeline Report for Seniors and People with Disabilities by October 1, 2022, and every third year thereafter. That report will analyze housing needs across numerous demographics for both seniors and people with disabilities; analyze City housing programs and services serving seniors and people with disabilities; and make recommendations to address unmet affordable housing needs for seniors and people with disabilities. DAAS, in collaboration with MOHCD, the Planning Department, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, and the Mayor's Office of Disability, will present the reports to the Board of Supervisors, with policy recommendations as appropriate.

Background Information

The primary difference between the substitute ordinance introduced February 11, 2020, and the original ordinance is that the original ordinance required one report, issued annually, and the substitute ordinance requires two distinct reports, issued biennially. Committee amendments clarified that DAAS will collaborate with MOHCD, the Planning Department, and the Mayor's Office of Disability on the reports, and modified the deadlines for the two reports.

Existing Law

Administrative Code Section 10E.4(b) directs the Planning Department to publish an Annual Housing Inventory Report, but does not direct the Planning Department to analyze housing needs and production for seniors and people with disabilities.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance (new Administrative Code Chapter 111) directs the Department of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) to publish an Annual Housing Needs Assessment and Production Pipeline Report for Seniors and People with Disabilities by March 1 of each year. That report will analyze housing needs across numerous demographics for both seniors and people with disabilities; analyze City housing programs and services serving seniors and people with disabilities; analyze data on housing production for seniors and people with disabilities; and people with disabilities. The Mayor's Office on Housing and Community Development will contribute to the report. DAAS will present to the Board of Supervisors with policy recommendations as appropriate.

Background Information

There is a critical shortage of affordable housing for seniors and people with disabilities in San Francisco. The City invests resources in affordable housing for seniors, people with disabilities, and other populations through a variety of programs. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Chapter 111, consisting of Section 111.1, to read as follows: CHAPTER 111: HOUSING REPORT FOR SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES SEC. 111.1. ANNUAL REPORT. (6) Such information as DAAS requests for its analysis, including but not limited to data on waiting lists for MOHCD-funded affordable housing sites.

(c) The Report shall present information in de-identified form to protect the privacy of individuals whose data are included in the Report. Data collected for the Report shall be confidential to the extent of protecting personal privacy insofar as the law requires or permits such protection.

(d) DAAS shall present, with input from MOHCD, the Report annually to the Board of Supervisors and any policy recommendations for legislation.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
