WHEREAS, Section 5.4 of the Report recommends the City provide high-quality computers to vulnerable populations identified the Department of Technology (SFDT) and MOHCD (Office of Digital Equity) as the departments that should develop a program to facilitate the donation of high-quality computers and related technology that local companies no longer need to be distributed to individuals in need; and the program would develop a platform, standards, and distribution process for donate computers; and

WHEREAS, Section 5.5 of the Report recommends the City bridge the digital divide with affordable connectivity and internet service identified by the Department of Technology should extend existing efforts to install fiber to very low, low, and moderate-income households at public housing and affordable locations; this would include dedicated annual funding to support the maximum feasible level of expansion on an annual basis; and

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1	WHEREAS, Section 5.5 of the Report identified Public Works and Department of
2	Technology to create an interagency working group to consider ways to lower the cost of fiber
3	installation, including streamlining the permit process, to bring affordable connectivity to low-
4	income households regardless of where they live in San Francisco; and
5	WHEREAS, Section 5.5 of the Report identified Department of Homelessness and
6	Supportive Housing (HSH) and encourage them to expand existing efforts to deliver high-
7	speed internet services at SROs; and
8	WHEREAS, Section 5.6 of the Report recommends the City build Technology capacity
9	of new users, small businesses, and non-profits identified MOHCD (Office of Digital Equity) as
10	the lead partner with digital literacy nonprofits to provide phone-based technology assistance
11	for the new technology users, small business, and nonprofits citywide; and
12	WHEREAS, For over 20 years, the City has held hearings and produced countless
13	reports on the digital divide; now, therefore, be it
14	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
15	urges the adoption of Sections 5.4, 5.5, and 5.6 of the October 2020 Economic Recovery
16	Taskforce Report; and, be it
17	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of
18	Technology to provide the Board with a written estimate of the cost of implementation of all
19	Sections being urged for adoption by the Resolution by June 1, 2021; and, be it
20	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of
21	Technology to provide the Board with a Literature Review of efforts put forth by the City in the
