15	(2) An analysis of potential sites over the next five years for future housing
16	developments for seniors and people with disabilities, including analysis of affordability by income
17	level and accessibility for people with disabilities.
18	(3) An evaluation of how planned and potential future housing developments align with
19	the housing needs of seniors and people with disabilities, addressing, to the extent feasible, housing
20	needs by income level.
21	(4) An assessment of the unmet needs of extremely low-income seniors and extremely
22	low-income people with disabilities relative to City-funded affordable housing and MOHCD's efforts
23	over the previous year to address those needs.
24	(5) Such other information as DAAS requests for its analysis.

1	(e) The Overview Report and the Report shall present information in de-identified form to
2	protect the privacy of individuals whose data are included in the reports. Data collected for the
3	Overview Report and the Report shall be confidential to the extent of protecting personal privacy
4	insofar as the law requires or permits such protection.
5	(f) DAAS shall present, with input from in collaboration with MOHCD, the Planning
6	Department, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, and the Mayor's
7	Office of Disability, the Overview Report and the Report to the Board of Supervisors, along with any
8	recommendations for legislation or other policy recommendations.
9	(g) The Overview Report and the Report shall address each item to the extent feasible based on
10	available data. DAAS and MOHCD are not required to collect new data to complete the reports.
11	
12	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
13	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
14	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
15	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

### REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

(Amended in Committee, 12/7/2020)

[Administrative Code - Housing Needs Assessment and Production Pipeline Reports - Seniors and People with Disabilities]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to direct the Department of Disability and Aging Services to report on housing needs and housing production for seniors and people with disabilities, with input from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development and other departments.

## **Existing Law**

Administrative Code Section 10E.4(b) directs the Planning Department to publish an Annual Housing Inventory Report, but does not direct the Planning Department to analyze housing needs and production for seniors and people with disabilities.

### Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance (adding Administrative Code Chapter 111) directs the Department of Disability and Aging Services (DAAS) to publish a Housing Needs Overview for Seniors and People with Disabilities by October 1, 2021, and two out of every three years thereafter. DAAS would not be required to publish a Housing Needs Overview in 2022 or every third year thereafter. The overview report will contain an analysis of income of seniors and of people with disabilities in the City to rents charged at City-funded affordable housing.

The ordinance additionally directs DAAS, in collaboration with the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD), the Planning Department, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, and the Mayor's Office of Disability, to publish a Housing Needs Assessment and Production Pipeline Report for Seniors and People with Disabilities by October 1, 2022, and every third year thereafter. That report will analyze housing needs across numerous demographics for both seniors and people with disabilities; analyze City housing programs and services serving seniors and people with disabilities; and make recommendations to address unmet affordable housing needs for seniors and people with disabilities. DAAS, in collaboration with MOHCD, the Planning Department, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, and the Mayor's Office of Disability, will present the reports to the Board of Supervisors, with policy recommendations as appropriate.

### Background Information

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS Page 1

The primary difference between the substitute ordinance introduced February 11, 2020, and the original ordinance is that the original ordinance required one report, issued annually, and the substitute ordinance requires two distinct reports, issued biennially. Committee amendments clarified that DAAS will collaborate with MOHCD, the Planning Department, and the Mayor's Office of Disability on the reports, and modified the deadlines for the two reports.
