6	policy to place in solitary hotel rooms SRO residents who meet the criteria for isolation		
7	or quarantine established by the County Health Officer, and requiring the Department		
8	of Public Health to: develop a protocol to assist health care providers to identify SRO		
9	Residents who may require protection against or treatment for COVID-19; notify the		
10	operator of a residential hotel when an SRO Resident has tested positive for COVID-19		
11	to facilitate contract tracing, testing for COVID-19, and cleaning; establish a telephone		
12	hotline for SRO Residents, to respond to questions about accessing COVID-19 health		
13	screenings, testing, and solitary hotel rooms; provide face coverings to SRO Residents		
14	and workers in residential hotels; and provide daily aggregate data concerning the		
15	incidence of COVID-19 among SRO Residents, access to quarantine rooms by such		
16	residents, and the number of such residents who have died due to complications from		
17	COVID-19.

23	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

25	Section	1. Declaration of Emergency Pursuant to Charter Section 2.107.	

- (a) Section 2.107 of the Charter authorizes passage of an emergency ordinance in cases of public emergency affecting life, health, or property, or for the uninterrupted operation of any City or County department or office required to comply with time limitations established by law. An emergency ordinance enacted under Charter Section 2.107 automatically terminates on the 61st day after passage, but may be reenacted upon the same terms and conditions applicable to its initial enactment.
- (b) Pursuant to Charter Section 2.107, the City enacted Ordinance No. 84-20, an emergency ordinance, which temporarily established protections for occupants of residential hotels ("SRO Residents") during the COVID-19 pandemic. The emergency ordinance became effective when enacted, on May 29, 2020. On September 11, 2020, Ord. No. 84-20 was reenacted by another emergency ordinance, Ord. No. 161-20, and amended to address the City's duty to post information in residential hotels concerning the rights of residents to access services related to COVID-19. Ord. No. 161-20 will terminate automatically on November 11, 2020, unless reenacted.
- (c) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the findings declared in Section 1 of Ordinance No. 84-20 and reaffirmed in Section 1 of Ord. No. 161-20 remain valid and compelling, and declares further that an actual emergency continues to exist that requires the reenactment of Ordinance No. 84-20, as amended by Ord. No. 161-20, to reduce the spread of COVID-19. COVID-19 continues to present an extremely dangerous public health risk to the residents of residential hotels and to individuals who work in residential hotels.

Section 2. Reenactment of Emergency Ordinance. Consistent with Charter Section 2.107, this emergency ordinance reenacts for an additional 60 days the emergency ordinance providing temporary protections to occupants of residential hotels (Ordinance No. 84-20), as amended by Ord. No. 161-20-, and amends Section 3 of said emergency ordinance to read as

1	follows. Even though Ordinance No. 84-20, Ordinance No. 161-20, and this reenacted		
2	emergency ordinance are uncodified, for purposes of clarity the respective fonts for additions		
3	and deletions to the Municipal Code as stated in the "Note" that appears at the beginning of		
4	this ordinance are used to show the amendments to Section 3 of Ordinance No. 84-20, as		
5	amended by Ordinance No. 161-20:

7	"Section 3. Policies and Protocols to Protect Occupants of Residential Hotels During		
8	the COVID-19 Emergency.

10	(g) Upon confirming that an SRO Resident has tested positive for COVID-19, DPH		
11	shall, to the extent consistent with state and federal laws governing the confidentiality of		
12	medical information:		
13	* * * *		
14	(5) As soon as feasible but not more than 12 hours after receiving such		
15	confirmation, prominently post in common areas of the Residential Hotel where fire safety		
16	information is required to be posted a notice to advise SRO Residents that a COVID-19 case		
17	has been identified in the building, and of their rights under this emergency ordinance to		
18	access I/Q Hotel Rooms, COVID-19 testing, and face coverings. Such notice shall include,		
19	but not be limited to, the number of the language-accessible COVID-19 telephone hotline for		
20	SRO Residents that residents may call to access these resources.

23	Section 3. Effective Date; Retroactivity; Expiration.		
24	This reenacted emergency ordinance shall become effective immediately upon		
25	enactment, shall have operative effect retroactively to the date that Ord. 161-20 expired, and		

1	shall expire on the 61st day following the date that Ord. 161-20 expired effective date, unless			
2	reenacted as provided by Charter Section 2.107. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs			
3	the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance			
4	within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the			
5	ordinance.			
6				
7	Section 4. Directions to Clerk. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed			
8	to place a copy of this reenacted emergency ordinance in File No. 200456 for Ordinance No.			
9	84-20 and File No. 200762 for Ord. No. 161-20, and to make a notation cross-referencing this			
10	emergency ordinance where Ordinance Nos. 84-20 and 161-20 appear on the Board of			
11	Supervisors website as legislation passed.

13	Section 5. Supermajority Vote Required. In accordance with Charter Section 2.107,			
14	passage of this reenacted emergency ordinance by the Board of Supervisors requires an			
15	affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors.
