Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to enter into
Performance Contract No. 18-95270, with the California Department of Health Care
Services, incorporating the Mental Health Services Act, Lanterman-Petris-Short Act,
Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness, Community Mental Health
Services Block Grant, Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Block Grant, and
Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program for the period of July 1, 2018,
through June 30, 2021.
WHEREAS, The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) administers
funding and program requirements/standards for the following: Mental Health Services Act
(MHSA), Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) Act, Projects for Assistance in Transition from
Homelessness (PATH), Community Mental Health Services Block Grant (known as Mental
Health Block Grant (MHBG)), Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Block Grant
(SABG), and Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program (CCP); and
WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health, Behavioral Health Services (DPH-BHS)
operates the aforementioned programs for San Francisco County through the San Francisco
Mental Health Plan; and
WHEREAS, The Mental Health Services Fund was established pursuant to Welfare
and Institutions Code, Section 5890, and provides funds to counties for the implementation of
its MHSA projects and programs for prevention and early intervention, community services
and supports, workforce development and training, innovation, plus capital facilities and
technological needs; and

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1	WHEREAS, The Lanterman-Petris-Short Act was established pursuant to Welfare and
2	Institutions Code, Section 5400, to end indefinite involuntary commitment of persons with
3	mental health disorders and to provide prompt evaluation and treatment, to establish
4	consistent personal rights standards, and to provide services in the least restrictive setting;
5	and
6	WHEREAS, Pursuant to United States Code, Sections 290cc-21 through 290cc-35, the
7	PATH grant funds community based outreach, mental health and substance use disorder
8	referral/treatment, case management and other support services, as well as a limited set of
9	housing services for the homeless mentally ill; and
10	WHEREAS, DHCS awards federal Community Mental Health Services Block Grant
11	funds to counties in California to provide a broad array of mental health services to the
12	following target populations: children and youth with serious emotional disturbances, adults
13	and older adults with serious mental illnesses; and
14	WHEREAS, Pursuant to United States Code, Section 300x-1 et seq., the State of
15	California has been awarded the federal Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Block
16	Grant funds to provide a broad array of alcohol and other drug program treatment and
17	prevention services; and
18	WHEREAS, Pursuant to Title 42 United States Code, Section 5183, and upon the
19	issuance of a Presidential declaration of a major disaster, the State of California may be
20	awarded Federal Emergency Management Agency funding for the Crisis Counseling
21	Assistance and Training Program which supports short-term interventions that involve
22	assisting disaster survivors in understanding their current situation, mitigating stress,
23	developing coping strategies, providing emotional support, and linkages with other individuals

and agencies that help survivors in their recovery process; and

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1	WHEREAS, On November 18, 2020, DHCS forwarded Performance Contract No. 18-
2	95270 to DPH-BHS, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No,
3	which is hereby declared to be part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and
4	WHEREAS, Performance Contract No. 18-95270 sets forth all performance,
5	compliance and reporting requirements the County must meet in order to receive funding for
6	these programs; and
7	WHEREAS, Examples of compliance and reporting standards include, but are not
8	limited to, expenditure requirements, minimum service standards, beneficiary protections, and
9	fiscal and service reporting requirements; and
10	WHEREAS, The Performance Contract only includes performance requirements and
11	does not have funding attached to it, as the Board of Supervisors approved the budget
12	components for these programs during the City's annual budget process; now, therefore, be it
13	RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco, Department of Public Health (DPH) is
14	hereby retroactively authorized to enter into a performance contract agreement with DHCS;
15	and, be it
16	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby retroactively designates
17	the Director of Behavioral Health Services to sign said agreement on behalf of DPH; and, be it
18	FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the performance contract being
19	fully executed by all parties the Director of Behavioral Health Services shall provide the
20	performance contract to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion into the official file.
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
