**Vacant Seat 13 (Alternate)**, new appointment, shall serve as an alternate to Seat 2 and must be held by an individual with familiarity and experience in infrastructure and/or safety, as relating to pedestrians, bicyclists, or transit and be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending August 1, 2021.

**Vacant Seat 14 (Alternate)**, new appointment, shall serve as an alternate to Seat 3 and must be held by an individual who has familiarity and experience in historic preservation and/or cultural preservation and be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending August 1, 2022.

**Vacant Seat 15 (Alternate)**, new appointment, shall serve as an alternate to Seat 4 and must be held by an individual who has familiarity and experience in development and/or management of affordable housing and be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending August 1, 2022.

**Vacant Seat 16 (Alternate)**, new appointment, shall serve as an alternate to Seat 5 and must be held by an individual who provides direct social services to SoMa residents and be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending August 1, 2023.

**Vacant Seat 17 (Alternate)**, new appointment, shall serve as an alternate to Seat 6 and have no additional required qualifications and be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending August 1, 2023.

**Vacant Seat 18 (Alternate)**, new appointment, shall serve as an alternate to Seat 7 and have no additional required qualifications and be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor, for the unexpired portion of a three-year term ending August 1, 2021.

Reports: There are no reporting requirements. However, the general purpose of the Committee shall be to provide input to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and City agencies regarding the implementation of the Central SoMa Plan, Western SoMa Area Plan, and East SoMa Area Plan. Administrative Code, Chapter 5, Article XXVI (Ordinance No. 242-19)

The general purpose of the **South of Market Community Planning Committee** shall be to provide input to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and City agencies regarding the implementation of the Central SoMa Plan, Western SoMa Area Plan, and East SoMa Area Plan. The City agencies to which the Committee may provide input include, but are not limited to, the Planning Department, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Office of Economic and Workforce Development, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Recreation and Park Department, the Department of Public Works, the Arts Commission, and the Interagency Planning and Implementation Committee. The Committee's prioritization of revenue expenditures described in subsection (b) below that are collected from development projects in the Central SoMa Plan Area shall be consistent with the Central SoMa Implementation Program document.

The South of Market Community Planning Advisory Committee shall consist of eleven (11) members and eleven (11) alternate members who shall represent the cultural diversity of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, and Western SoMa neighborhoods, and ideally will include renters of residences in the neighborhoods, resident homeowners in the neighborhoods, low-income residents, local merchants, and representatives of established neighborhood groups within the East SoMa, Central SoMa, and Western SoMa Plan Areas.

Seven (7) Seats shall be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor and appointed by the Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Seat 1 shall be held by an individual who has small business expertise.
- Seat 2 shall be held by an individual with familiarity and experience in infrastructure and/or safety, as relating to pedestrians, bicyclists, or transit.
- Seat 3 shall be held by an individual who has familiarity and experience in historic preservation and/or cultural preservation.
- > Seat 4 shall be held by an individual who has familiarity and experience in development and/or management of affordable housing.
- > Seat 5 shall be held by an individual who provides direct social services to SoMa residents.
- Seats 6 and 7 shall have no additional required qualifications.

Four (4) seats shall be appointed by the Mayor.

- Seat 8 shall be held by an individual with a record of advocacy for parks, recreation, and open space in San Francisco.
- > Seat 9 shall be held by an individual who has expertise in employment development or represents labor interests.
- Seats 10 and 11 shall have no additional required qualifications.

There shall be 11 alternate members of the Committee, one designated for each of the 11 seats. Alternate members shall be appointed for their respective seats in the same manner as the regular members.

Additional Qualifications: All members shall live, work, or own a business within the boundaries of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, or Western SoMa Area Plans. When fully constituted, at least three members shall live within the boundaries of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, or Western SoMa Area Plans.

Term: Three (3) years.

Reports: None

Sunset Date: Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article XXVI, and hence the Committee, shall expire by operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, on January 1, 2035.
