1	[Urging Grocery Stores to Provide All Employees an Additional Five Dollars Per Hour in Hazard Pay]

5	of San Francisco is in the Purple, Red, or Orange level of Community Disease

8	WHEREAS, Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in March, grocery workers
9	in the City of San Francisco have continued to report to work and serve their communities,
10	despite the ongoing hazards and danger of being exposed to COVID-19; and
11	WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic is far from over and the health threats that
12	grocery workers face are just as real now as they were when this crisis began; and
13	WHEREAS, Because of the work of these essential grocery workers, families
14	throughout the City are able to access to the food they need during this pandemic; and
15	WHEREAS, Given the nature of these jobs, grocery workers must be there to help
16	countless customers who are stressed and fearful of for their wellbeing; and
17	WHEREAS, Grocery workers are staying inside with large crowds every day, with
18	ventilation systems that could be potentially spread COVID-19; and
19	WHEREAS, Essential grocery workers cannot choose to work from home, they must
20	come to work do their jobs, which involves substantial interaction with customers; and
21	WHEREAS, Essential grocery workers are wearing masks, social distancing, and
22	constantly wiping down cash registers, food conveyor belts and shopping carts in order to
23	protect the public health; and
24	WHEREAS, Essential grocery workers are continuously working to restock items that
25	households desperately need like toilet paper, cleaning supplies and other essentials; and

WHEREAS, Essential grocery workers continue to live with the daily fear of not only
 contracting the virus but also bringing it home to their families; and

WHEREAS, The number of COVID-19 clusters within the grocery industry in the City
and County of San Francisco continues to rise significantly and the health threat that these
grocery workers face cannot be overstated; and

WHEREAS, United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 5 and Local 648,
two unions that represent grocery workers in San Francisco and the Bay Area, reports that
over 700 grocery workers in their ranks have tested positive with COVID-19, and members of
their union have been hospitalized or lost their life to the coronavirus; and

10 WHEREAS, Despite the roll out of the vaccine which is limited to frontline healthcare 11 workers and those in long-term care facilities, we are currently in the height of the pandemic 12 with a stay at home order in our region with ICU capacity below 15 percent and San Francisco 13 is in a zone where there are more than 212 new cases daily; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco is a long way from yellow level of minimal risk with one
daily new case per 100,000 people or less than 2 percent positivity among the city population;
and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco recognizes that essential grocery
workers must be justly compensated for the clear and present dangers of doing their jobs
during the pandemic by requiring their employers to provide hazard pay at all times that the
City is at a coronavirus risk level of moderate, substantial, or widespread under the State
Health orders; and

WHEREAS, Studies have shown that wage increases result in more money being
spent in our local small businesses and also act as a stimulus for our local economy; and

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WHEREAS, The United States' top retail companies have earned record-breaking
 profits during the pandemic, this increase in profit has not transferred to workers, according to
 a Brookings Institution analysis conducted in November 2020; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has previously adopted emergency
ordinances specific to grocery establishments both to address worker retention and recently to
address COVID-19 related protections; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has also previously crafted wage
ordinances specific to employment sectors through its formula retail ordinance; and
WHEREAS, There are numerous large grocery chains in San Francisco that fall under

the formula retail ordinance who employ workers in the City, and have at least 12 locations nationwide with workers who are facing the hazard of COVID-19 in the workplace at every hour of everyday; and

WHEREAS, During the week of December 14 to December 18, 2020, cities across California including Los Angeles and Long Beach are announcing legislation for hazard pay for essential grocery workers during the period where counties are in the Purple, Red, or Orange level of Community Transmission for COVID-19 under State Health orders and more cities are expected to announce in the new year and San Francisco has also requested legislation; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Grocery Stores in 20 San Francisco to provide all employees an additional five dollars per hour in wages for the 21 duration until the City and County of San Francisco returns to a yellow or minimum level of 22 Community Disease Transmission for COVID-19 under State Health orders.
